Mayor asked to Testify on Sex Offender Restrictions

Much to my surprise, I was asked to go up to Austin to testify before the House Committee on Urban Affairs regarding House Bill 387. This is a bill, which, if passed, would allow General Law cities such as Meadows Place, to have the right to create "Safe Zones" in their

city by restricting where Registered Sex Offenders can live. Currently, Meadows Place has an ordinance that states no Registered Sex Offender may live within 2,000 feet of a school, playground, park or area where children gather. A group of registered sex offenders got together and sued several General Law cities saying this is a violation of the Texas Constitution based on an "opinion" of the State Attorney General back in 2007. This ruling declares larger, Home Rule cities like Sugar Land, have that right, but we do not. It has been my contention that our children are every bit as precious as those of our neighbors and I have been fighting this for a while now. Meadows Place is going to play a role in clearing this up one way or another. It can be cleared up either Legislatively, which is why I went to testify in Austin, or Judicially. Meadows Place is fiercely fighting the lawsuit saying we do not have the right to create Safe Zones and will let a Judge rule on it. Legislatively is best. This has been, and will be, a long strenuous process until it is resolved. I want you to know, that having the support and backing of the good folks from Meadows Place has kept me focused and given me the strength and energy to keep fighting for our kids and our city. I will keep you posted as things progress. Thank You.

Kirkwood Revitalization and Beautification Update

Mr. Staigle informed us that HDR Engineering was nearing 60 percent completion of the engineering for the project. 60% is a milestone in the world of civil engineering that will see HDR submitting preliminary plans and drawings for the four roundabouts.

Distracted driving is any activity that could divert a person's attention away from the primary task of driving. All distractions endanger driver, passenger, and bystander safety. These types of distractions include:

- Talking to passengers
- Grooming
- Reading, including maps
- Using a navigation system
- Watching a video
- Adjusting a radio, CD player, or MP3 player

In 2014, 3,179 people were killed, and 431,000 were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving distracted drivers.

Drains are for Rain

Storm water runoff from urban areas can carry pollutants and trash into the storm water drainage system. Water that flows down the drains in our homes first goes to sewage treatment facilities before it's released to bayous and rivers. But, water that flows into our storm water drainage system, along with other substances it collects, goes directly into our bayous, rivers, and ultimately into Galveston Bay. Unlike sewage, storm water receives no treatment.



The City of Meadows Place has placed inlet markers bearing the phrase “only rain down the drain”. The message is intended to remind citizens to not to dump pollutants into storm sewers or contribute to ordinary storm water runoff by littering, over-fertilizing, or sweeping yard debris into the street.

Much of the pollution in area creeks and bayous comes from common, every-day materials, like household chemicals, fertilizers, pesticides, gasoline, used motor oil and antifreeze and litter. These substances run off into storm drain inlets by rainwater from our streets, yards, driveways and parking lots.

Welcome Spring!

Spring is in bloom, and by the look of our yards, (mine included), the weeds thrived after this short winter, not to mention the back and forth of cold, to warm, hot and then warm again...

If you are facing a weed dilemma in your yard, there are several things that you can do to help make your lawn beautiful again. Sun, good drainage and lawn aeration will encourage your grass to grow and develop strong deep roots. Apply a slow-release or organic fertilizer after then lawn has greened and begun to grow. Water as needed early in the day so that the grass blades dry quickly. Mow your grass at 3 inches and mulch the clippings as they will break down naturally and replenish the soil with nutrients. Be sure that when you mow and edge that you clean up all the clippings from the sidewalk and the street in front of your home.

Spring also traditionally means time to clean! Now is a great time to take care of things before the summer heat takes over. Pressure wash, fix broken fence pickets, clean up the flower beds, and perform general maintenance. Pick up and put away any items that have been left out on the driveway, porch and yard. Touch up paint on the exterior of your home. (Approved color palette available at city hall if you decide to repaint your entire home.) Install 4inch address numbers on the front of the house.

I wish to offer a heartfelt “Thank You” to those of us that have already begun the process of revitalizing their homes, and OUR CITY!




