Meadows Place was recently recognized as one of the best places in the greater Houston area to raise a family! This community has been working hard to make Meadows Place a great, safe place to raise a family. Well, it looks like we are succeeding because Meadows Place made a good news list – again! Sometimes people outside our shining

little city don't even know we are here, much less think of us a one of the best areas in the Houston Area to Raise a Family!! We know that of course, but apparently the word is getting out to the rest of the world. Matt Levin's Report in the Houston Chronicle reported Meadows Place one of the best places in the Houston area to raise a family. Not bad for a one square mile city.

In fact, Meadows Place ranked in the top 100 Statewide. Statewide! (#100) . We were graded on our Public Schools (grade A!); Cost of Living; Crime and Safety (yeah PD!) and were given an A on our Family Amenities. Meadows Place is proud to be recognized as one of the best places to raise a family, but, fact is, we already knew that.

Mosquitos

The City of Meadows Place is moving forward with plans to become self-sufficient when it comes to spraying for mosquitos. This is a long, arduous process that now requires training, testing, certifications and State approvals. Thanks to the ongoing efforts of Public Works Director Danny Segundo, we are about two-thirds of the way through the process. His next round of testing is later this month as he works toward state compliance. This does not mean we will not be able to continue to work with the county on things like vector (aerial) spraying and the like, and the county will continue to do our mosquito counts and testing for mosquito transmitted diseases like West Nile and now Zika, but it will mean that once we are accredited, Meadows Place will have the ability to occasionally do what is termed "Nuisance Spraying" as well as protective spraying due to a positive test result.

Due to EPA and TCEQ regulations, there are limitations and regulations, but in the next month or so we will have the certifications and the equipment to act as our own first line of protection against these irritating and sometimes dangerous pests. Meadows Place, in partnership with Fort Bend County, do a great job of testing and keeping track of potential breeding areas. That said, most of the potential breeding sites are in YOUR yard. It doesn't take but a tiny bit of standing water to serve as breeding place, so please, go make sure you check your yard for areas that harbor water, even a little. By doing this, we will help ourselves, our neighbors and make sure Meadow Place continues to beYour Place for Life!

Road Report

The base foundation repairs on the Dorrance entryway to our city are complete. We are now on a (long) County waiting list to have an overlay put on. This is a major undertaking and just one of the many road projects our Public Works Director has on the board. In other news, the city has begun negotiations with HDR Engineering for the engineering portion of the Kirkwood Beautification and Revitalization program. There has been much electronic back and forth fact finding and data exchange and one very intense meeting with city officials. At this time, the city is waiting for HDR to come back to us with a sharpened pencil price, which will determine if the project is awarded to them or if the city will choose to break off negotiations and move on to another qualified bidder. This is a very interesting process which is designed to help the city keep costs to a minimum while securing the services of the most qualified company. New Recycling Program Targets Unwanted Clothing and Small Housewares

Meadows Place Recycles – introducing the new and improved version! According to the EPA, the average American creates 4.40

pounds of waste per day. We only recycle and compost 1.51 pounds of this total, so each person throws away 2.89 pounds of trash each day! That's almost 3 pounds!

Recycling helps minimize this number and we are getting better! The EPA states that Americans recycled and composted 87.2 million tons of material in 2013, up from 15 million tons in 1980. Keeping this much material out of the landfills prevented approximately 186 million metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent from polluting the air. That's like taking over 39 million cars off the road for one year! And this doesn't even touch how much ground pollution was prevented.

simplerecycling

Meadows Place is going to provide a new, additional recycling service for the City. This service will be in place June 17, and is provided by Simple Recycling. They pick up clothing and small house hold objects, and will follow the regular recycling trucks on Fridays to make it easier for you. There are special green bags, and stickers for boxes, that will be delivered to you to use for recycling these items. You just place them at the curb on Fridays just like your regular recycling. Simple recycling says, "Clothing, appliances, durables and furniture account for approximately 15% of the residential waste stream."
