Budget Season

Well, it's Budget Season in Meadows Place. Council and Staff have been meeting reviewing requests, expected expenditures and then setting spending priorities based on revenue projections. This is a very important process made much simpler and more efficient thanks to the hard work of Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston and City Accountant

Oralia Naccarino. These ladies do so much to make sure the numbers are accurate and the expenditures are coded to proper accounts. This means that your City Council and Department Heads can move through the process with confidence.

Equipment costs, utility costs and insurance have gone up. That effects how much we can spend to maintain the level of services provided. It has long been Meadows Place practice to be financially responsible, budget conservatively and do our best to be good stewards of your money. We will again. Since there is never enough money to do it all, the budget reflects the priorities of your elected representatives - which hopefully mirror your desires for our great little city. The budget process is open to you so that at the end of Budget Season, we can meet your expectations and keep the city financially secure.

Recently our Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston, our City Secretary Courtney Rutherford and I attended a day long Budget and Setting the Tax Rate seminar. It was very informative and all three of us came away pleased that Meadows Place process was spot on and in line with all the regulations. I was honored to have been asked to speak at this event and hope I represented Meadows Place well.

Banking Changes

The City of Meadows Place has published a Request For Application (RFA), which in layman's terms means we want to change banks. This is not a simple process but I was surprised at how difficult it could be.

This is our second go round. Currently we use Bank of America and apparently due to federal regulations and collateralization requirements they do not consider municipal accounts worth the trouble. I can understand that so a few months ago Mrs. Weston and I attended a financial training session which helped us decide it was time to change and gave us a few tips to make Meadows Place more attractive to a potential new depository. That, plus in house meetings with some banking institutions helped us prepare a new RFA. For comparison sake, we hope to have at least two banks apply by the end of this month and feel confident that we will. Transferring all the funds, all the accounts, all the online and all the payroll functions will be a massive transition for our little city but I believe with the staff we have now we are more than ready to take on this task. Keep your fingers crossed.

I believe this was one of the best 4th of July Parades we have ever had. It seemed like half the town was in the parade and half the town was watching. The City of Meadows Place and the Meadows Place Police Department take the safety and security of the community serious and want to make sure you are prepared during

This means that if you wish to walk your dog by our beautiful Lake, the dog MUST BE ON A LEASH, and you MUST pick up after them! Texas Direct Auto has provided our city with a beautiful dog park and is the only legal area that you may let your dog run free.

Our Rental Registry is back in full effect. If you own a home that you rent out in Meadows Place, make sure that you have obtained your Rental License for this year. The deadline may have been July 31st, but you can still contact City Hall to register your property and schedule your inspection.

With the start of school fast approaching, I want to remind everyone to keep a keen eye out for students walking to school. And remember, no cell phones while you are driving in a school zone, so please do your best for our children and watch out for them.

Talk to your neighbors. If you have a concern about something on their property, please take a moment to speak to them. It's the neighborly thing to do. Hello friends, just wanted to remind everyone about simple recycling. It's a great way to recycle unwanted items without

leaving your home!

HOW IT WORKS

Simple Recycling provides each resident with custom printed recycling bags and free curbside pickup service. The items are collected on the resident's regular recycling day (every Friday) sorted, and graded for condition before being reused, repurposed, or recycled. Items such as clothing, shoes, toys, irons, radios, hairdryers, toasters, coffee makers, silverware, pots/pans, and blankets. For a list of items please visit www.simplerecycling.com

The City would like to encourage our residents to consider the program as an alternative avenue for clothing and houseware recycling. This program is the highest impact environmental initiative a municipality can implement with ZERO cost or operational requirement. The program helps reduce municipal waste up to 10%, is FREE to the city and its residents, and is operated entirely by Simple Recycling. We are already seeing the benefits of our partnership and hope our residents can utilize the service provided by Simple Recycling.




