Serving as the Command Center, Meadows Place played a vital role in this international task force formed to catch people involved in Human Trafficking, juvenile prostitution and

child exploitation. Meadows Place was recognized as one of two agencies "who were instrumental in making this operation happen". None of the victims, or perpetrators were from Meadows Place, and I can't go into details, but I'm thrilled we arrested several bad guys and rescued several teens and young children. Just wanted you to know, our PD did good!

#### **Active Shooter**

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to offer these quick tips that may help to save a life in the event of an "Active Shooter"

An "active shooter" is an individual who is engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area; in most cases, active shooters use firearms(s) and there is no pattern or method to their selection of victims. Victims are selected at random, each event is unpredictable. Knowing what to do can save lives

You have three options:

- 1. **RUN** Have an escape route and plan in mind. Leave your belongings behind. Evacuate regardless of whether others agree to follow. Help others escape, if possible. Do not attempt to move the wounded. Prevent others from entering an area where the active shooter may be. Keep your hands visible. Call 911 when you are safe.
- 2. **HIDE** Hide in an area out of the shooter's view. Lock doors or block entry to your hiding place. Silence your cell phone (including vibrate mode) and remain quiet.
- 3. **FIGHT** Fight as a last resort and only when your life is in imminent danger. Attempt to incapacitate the shooter. Act with as much physical aggression as possible. Improvise weapons or throw items at the active shooter. Commit to your actions...your life depends on it

#### When law enforcement arrives:

- · Remain calm and follow instructions
- Drop items in your hands (e.g., bags, jackets)
- · Raise hands and spread fingers
- Keep hands visible at all times
- Avoid quick movements toward officers, such as holding on to them for safety
- · Avoid pointing, screaming or yelling
- Do not ask questions when evacuating

#### Information to provide to 911 operations:

- · Location of the active shooter
- Number of shooters. Physical description of shooters
- Number and type of weapons shooter has
- Number of potential victims at location

The Meadows Place Police Department encourages everyone to participate in the Neighborhood Watch meeting.

And always; if you see something, say something.



## Recycling Program Targets Unwanted Clothing and Small Housewares





HOW IT WORKS

Simple Recycling provides each resident with custom printed recycling bags and

free curbside pickup service. The items are collected on the resident's regular recycling day (every Friday) sorted, and graded for condition before being reused, repurposed, or recycled. Items such as clothing, shoes, toys, irons, radios, hairdryers, toasters, coffee makers, silverware, pots/ pans, and blankets. For a list of items please visit www. simplerecycling.com

The City would like to encourage our residents to consider the program as an alternative avenue for clothing and houseware recycling. This program is the highest impact environmental initiative a municipality can implement with ZERO cost or operational requirement. The program helps reduce municipal waste up to 10%, is FREE to the city and its residents, and is operated entirely by Simple Recycling. We are already seeing the benefits of our partnership and hope our residents can utilize the service provided by Simple Recycling.

In addition to our Leash Law, our City Council recently passed an ordinance that makes it a violation to not pick up after your pet when in the public.

Nobody likes stepping in a pile while in the park or on the way to the mail box. And certainly no parent likes having to clean their

children's shoes, or worse, after they have been playing in our parks! Environmental studies show that there are bacteria, viruses and parasites in animal feces that are harmful to humans and can contaminate our waterways and lakes. Not to mention it's just plain GROSS!

The leash law isn't about the fact that you may have an extremely obedient dog, it's more about you having no way to pull your dog safely away from harm, or curious children that don't know how to approach a dog.

Our corporate neighbor, Texas Direct Auto, has provided our city with a nice dog park that you can let your furry friend run off leash. That is the ONLY place in the city that you are allowed to have your dog off leash, other that your own property.

As a responsible pet owner, do not be offended if you are handed a flyer with the rules on it. Please, use it as an opportunity to share it with the next person you see that doesn't pick up after their dog or is walking it without a leash.
