South Kirkwood Renovation Update

The South Kirkwood Rejuvenation and Renovation Project survey has been completed and the engineering is about 25% complete. The project requires a Landscape Design be done as part of the Engineering the project and last month the city sent out for a Statement of Qualifications for the landscape design and engineering with a very strict set of criteria to hold the participants to. Currently there are two companies competing for the project, both of whom will soon give a presentation to a three person panel charged with selecting one of the companies for the design project. If neither are deemed acceptable, the process will start all over but assuming one is selected, they will submit a complete design that includes the plants, pathways, irrigation, maintenance requirements and the like. This project is moving forward and will certainly make Meadows Place a more beautiful and unique place for those who live here and for those who pass through.

Neighborhood Watch

November saw another great Neighborhood Watch meeting. We had a dozen new neighbors join the regulars for an outstanding program that taught everyone how to make their home less vulnerable. They also learned our Meadows PD has a program that not only makes their home safer, but may even save them money on their insurance! Bike Sharing Symbols - Sharrows

By now many of you have seen the new Shared Lane bike symbols on Dorrance commonly called 'Sharrows'. We hope these 'Sharrows' will make Meadows Place a safer place for bikers by increasing awareness there may be bicycles on the road. Bike sharrows can be used to signal that the roadway is for both bicycles and automobiles and alert motor vehicle drivers to the potential presence of bicyclists, many of whom are our young people.

This Holiday Season: Be Aware and Be Safe

The Meadows Place Police Department reminds everyone: Thieves are shopping for the holidays too; they are looking for opportunities to strike and take advantage for the Holiday Season.

Now more than ever is the time to be conscious of your surroundings and protective of your wares. Whether you are traveling out of town, just out for the evening, or shopping by yourself or with children, below are a few precautions to help make your holidays a safer one.

If you are traveling:

- Put an automatic timer on your lights
- Ask a neighbor to check up on your home
- Don't forget to have your mail and newspaper delivery stopped
- Contact Meadows Place Police Department and request a House Watch

If you are out of the house:

- Turn on lights and music or the TV so it looks as if someone is home
- Be sure that your doors and windows are locked
- Don't display your gifts where they can be seen from the outside
- If you plan to have packages delivered to your home, make sure you are home to accept them. If not, ask a neighbor or have the package be held at the nearest holding facility

If you are shopping:

- Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you
- Park in a well-lit space
- Be sure to lock your car, close windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a credit card whenever possible
- Don't overburden yourself with packages
- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Carry a purse close to your body in the front. If you are carrying a wallet, place it in an inside coat or front pants pocket
- If shopping with kids, have a plan in case you get separated. For the older children, have a central meeting spot designated. For the younger children teach them to go to a store clerk or security guard if you get separated. Be sure they know your name (not just mommy and daddy), cell phone number, and their address. Go over the dangers of strangers with them so they know who not to talk to or follow
- Check receipts to see whether your full credit card number appears. If a receipt has your full number on it, take a pen and thoroughly scratch it out
- Double check that you have your credit cards and check book after you pay for your items

By following these tips, you may reduce your stress during the Holiday Season

Saving Water Indoors



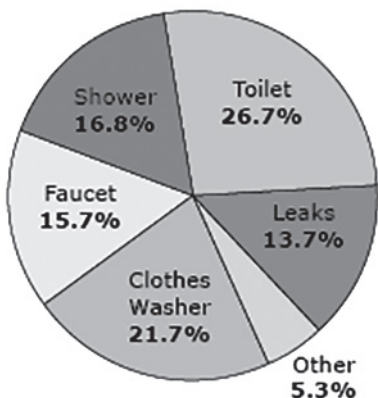

Here are some easy ways to reduce the amount of water you may use and save money at the same time. Saving water inside your home is easier than you think. In addition to saving money on your utility bill, water conservation reinforces our community's quality of life by ensuring availability of this precious resource.

- Repair or replace dripping faucets and waterlines that leak.
- Wash vegetables and fruits in a bowl or basin using a vegetable brush instead of letting the water run
- Replace low flow and water saving appliances when replacing washing machines, dishwashers, toilets, and faucets.
- Replace showerheads with a more efficient low flow model. A new shower head can save up to 6 gallons of water per minute.
- Don't use running water to thaw meat or other frozen foods. Defrost food overnight in the refrigerator or use the defrost setting on your microwave
- Check all toilets in the house for leaks twice a year and repair if it is leaking.
- Turn off the water while you brush your teeth and save four gallons a minute. That's 200 gallons a week for a family of four.
- When washing dishes by hand, use a sink full of soapy water. Don't let the water run continuously.
- Run the dishwasher only when fully loaded.

A few small changes in your daily routine can have a big impact on the amount of money left in your pocket after the arrival of your water bill.

How Much Water Do We Use?

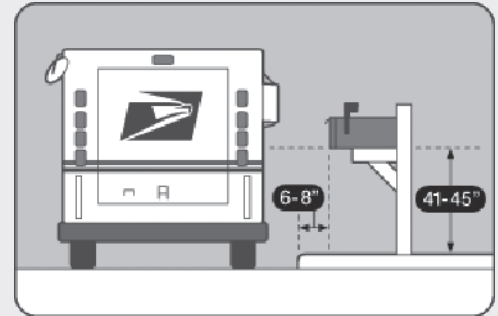

Bring on the cooler weather, and say goodbye to the mosquitos!

This is the perfect time to trim our trees from over the street (no lower than 16') and sidewalks (no lower than 10').

Check and clean your Heating System. It is critical that you ensure that you properly maintain your equipment. Start by having your heating system tuned up by a qualified technician if required. The last thing you need is to have your system breakdown in the middle of a cold spell.

When it comes to repairs and maintenance, ALL jobs performed by a contractor require that they register with the City, and pull any required permits BEFORE work starts. This is done for many reasons, to help guarantee safe installation and quality of work. Permit inspections are performed by either our Building Official or our Electrical inspector. If you have ANY questions regarding the status of a contractor or a permit, please call City Hall and speak to Isela Hernandez, our Permits Clerk. She can answer permit questions and help get issues resolved by working with either myself or the Building Official.

Did you know that one of the first things people see when looking down our streets are the mailboxes lined up nice and neat? Take a moment to look at yours. Does it need repainting? Cleaning? Does it lean or is it too short? Help to make a Great First Impression!

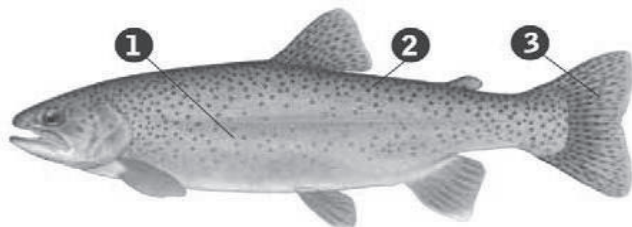
