COMMENTS FROM THE MAYOR

Meadows Place Fire Station

In a joint meeting on August 23, the City's Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council approved two plats. The first was for the redevelopment of the 14 acre Oasis property. As reported previously, the first phase of this redevelopment will include the construction of a new assisted living/Alzheimer's care facility, an office building, and the demolition of the existing facility. The plat is the legal instrument recording the description of the property. It was approved as being consistent with the planned development ordinance passed by Council in June 2004. The plat approval was the last hurdle in moving the project forward. Construction will start as soon as possible according to the developer.

The second plat was the four acre tract on the Northwest corner of Kirkwood and West Airport owned by Ayrshire Corporation. This property was recently rezoned as a planned development. One of the many conditions for the approval of the planned development was the permanent exclusion of convenience stores and gas stations from this property. The developer is actively seeking at least two tenants prior to commencing construction on the property.

One More Time

For the third consecutive year, the City of Meadows Place was awarded a grant from the State of Texas in the amount of \$50,000 for park improvements. This grant award is a little different from the previous ones. It is the result of a collaborative effort between the City and Fort Bend Independent School District. As a result, new playground equipment will be going up near the school. Fort Bend Independent School District will be providing most of the matching funds. I would like to personally thank Terry Modeland and Monya Keenen, co-directors of our Parks and Recreation Department for all their hard work. They not only led the team in obtaining this grant, but also provide for vibrant parks and recreation activities year round.
