#### RESIDENT SURVEY

The City is developing a marketing and public relations campaign to promote our community and quality of life. #### REGISTERED SEX OFFENDER ORDINANCE

At its April meeting, City Council discussed a potential ordinance limiting the distance registered sex offenders could live in relation to places where children congregate such as schools, parks and day care facilities. Based on this discussion, I will present an ordinance for Council's consideration at its May 23rd meeting. Thanks to police Captain Gary Stewart and Councilmember Charlie Jessup for their research and recommendations on this issue.





#### ANNUAL HEAVY TRASH COLLECTION

It is that time of year again for our Annual Heavy Trash Collection and our collection company, Republic Waste, is ready to assist us in this effort on Saturday, May 20. Please see the guidelines listed below:

The following items **WILL NOT** be collected:

- No tires, batteries, or automotive parts.
- No hazardous chemicals. If you have old paint cans they will need to be boxed and labeled "PAINT" so they are not mixed with the regular trash. The problem with paint lies in the liquid solvents within. Paint that has dried is no problem and can be taken with the trash. You may accomplish this by leaving the lid off until solidification, or by using cat litter or oil absorbent.
- No concrete or bricks
- No tree stumps or tree trunks bigger than 6" in diameter.







