COMMENTS FROM THE MAYOR By Mark McGrath

BUDGET

On September 26, Council adopted the budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2006. The budget adoption was the culmination of a process that started with a series of workshops

beginning in June and concluding with public hearings on September 12 and September 19.

On the expense side, all city employees will receive an increase of 3%. We will be restoring a patrol officer position and a public works position. A new clerical position is also budgeted.

This year's budget also provides for an increase in the garbage collection fee from \$9.50 per house per month to \$9.95. This is due to our garbage contractor increasing the rate the City pays due to higher fuel costs.

Also at the September 27th meeting, Council adopted a property tax rate of \$0.73 per \$100 of assessed valuation for the next fiscal year. This rate is 3 cents lower than last year's rate. However, due to increased value of your property as determined by the Fort Bend Central Appraisal District, the average homeowner's City property tax bill is expected to increase by about \$15.

Finally, Council voted to increase water and sewer rates effective with the October billing. For a residential user of 12,000 gallons per month, the water and sewer bill will increase by about \$5 per month. This increase is in response to rising fuel and electricity costs. Also, some major rehabilitation expenses are budgeted for the City's water production facilities.

POLICE CHIEF RETIRES

Upon concluding 20 years of service with the City, Police Chief Mike Pickett retired and has moved back to his native Ohio. In his years of service, over 13 of which were as Chief, he led the PD in many proud moments, the most recent of which were the high marks the Department received in the recent resident survey. We appreciate his efforts.

On September 19, Council appointed Captain Gary Stewart, senior ranking member of the PD, as Acting Chief of Police. Council will soon be starting the process of selecting our next Police Chief. It is anticipated this process could take several months. I will keep you informed of future developments in this newsletter. •



I mentioned in the September newsletter that 382 City residents responded to our recent survey. This month I want to summarize the results and share some specific comments.

Here's a profile of the respondents:

The majority, or 86%, are home owners

Most (38%) have lived in the City for over 20 years, followed by 10-20 years (25%)

More than 86% plan to live in the City for the next 5 years The age groups with the most respondents were: over 60 at 29%, 50-60 at 27%, and 40-50 at 25%

Nearly 72% are married and about half have children living with them

About 11% said their parents also live in the City, indicating they are second-generation residents

Regarding impressions of our City, those responding rated the following:

Quality of life: Excellent or good, 90% City services: Excellent or good, 91% Sense of community: Excellent or good, 87% City amenities: Excellent or good, 86% Police Services: Excellent or good, 89% Comparative home market value: Good, 50% Perceived comparative market value: Good, 47% Future of the City: Excellent or good, 80%

While these rankings are very high, we realize there are challenges facing our neighborhood in the future, as those survey respondents listed most often – crime control, maintaining property values and managing traffic volume. We pledge to do all we can to address your concerns.

These representative survey comments describe how respondents see our City:

"With police and fire protection, and a strong civic association, this small city is a jewel located just outside a large metropolitan area with easy access via two main freeway systems."

"Great place to live and raise a family!"

"Quiet, friendly, safe community near Houston and Ft. Bend County. We have a better quality of life since moving from Rosenberg."

"A friendly family community with a small town feel."

"A wonderful community to come home to. Friendly neighbors with pride in their home ownership. An answer to the American Dream."

"This is one of the few communities that have kept up its value for over 30 years. Making our standards higher for homeowners is the best way to keep it up."

"Small enough to be friendly yet close enough to medical and other facilities. A good place to raise a family and/or be grandparents."

We are very pleased with the survey response and plan to work hard to protect and expand those qualities that make our City great. Thanks to you, we can keep the City of Meadows Place the best community it can be for many years to come. •

Do Not Handle & Take Immediate Precautions if Bitten Due to Rabies Threat

Bats that are active by day and/or appear to be acting abnormally during the daylight hours have been linked to a strong possibility of illness since they are typically most active at night.

In the Fort Bend County area, several cities have reported rabid bats that were spotted during the day. To date, no such cases have been reported in Meadows Place.

If a person or pet has been bitten or has come into contact with a bat, the first thing to do is to wash the affected area and seek immediate medical care. The best way to prevent exposure to rabies is to avoid picking up or handling bats. It is also important to keep your pets up to date on vaccinations as this protects them from exposure to rabies, including exposures you may not be aware of, such as a cat catching and eating a bat.

For bat pick-up, in the event that one is spotted in the daytime in a home or business or acting abnormally or injured, contact Fort Bend Animal Control at (281) 342-1512.






