COMMENTS FROM THE MAYOR By Charles Jessup

WATER NOT SO SIMPLE ANYMORE

Water. We have lots of it don't we? Or, do we? As a City, the answer is yes. We have three wells that can produce more water

than we could ever use. As a City in a coastal county, the answer is ...kinda. You see, the State of Texas and the Ft. Bend Subsidence District now have a say in what water we use and where we can get it. The Subsidence District was formed in the late '90's because "Land subsidence within the Gulf Coast region is a serious hazard that could negatively impact the region's economic development and the citizenry's quality of life. The Fort Bend Subsidence District was formed with the purpose of preventing land subsidence in Fort Bend County." This was done at the "request" of the state because the subsidence they are talking about is primarily caused by the use of "ground water".

Ground Water is just that. It is, water that is pumped up out of the ground as opposed to "surface water" which is water retrieved from a lake, river or reservoir. This is a big deal folks, and it is important for you to know that this is coming.

The City of Meadows Place is moving forward with plans to partner with WCID # 2 to meet the projected mandates. These include 30% ground water reduction (GWR) by the year 2010, 70% GWR by the year 2020 and 80% GWR by the year 2030. WCID (Water Control Improvement District) #2 purchased an 80-acre site for this purpose and thus has positioned itself to be able to meet the future demands of the surface water conversion for this part of Fort Bend County. Our Partnership with them puts us years ahead of many cities in meeting these requirements.

Though it does cost more to prepare surface water than ground water, partnering with WICD # 2 will certainly help hold those costs down. In addition, the Mayor, Alderman Rick Staigle and Public Works Director Dan McGraw have begun preliminary plans for a wastewater recycling or 'gray water' program for The City of Meadows Place. This will significantly reduce clean water usage, reduce costs and give us "credits" when the conversion occurs. You will be seeing more on this and other water related matters in the future. We are taking a proactive approach and aggressively seeking the most cost effective solutions for the City and we will do our best to keep you informed. Currently, Meadows Place is well positioned for the conversion. Many small cities are not. We will do what it takes to provide Meadows Place with clean, safe drinking water and be as cost effective as we can be both now and in the future. We are working hard to keep the City of Meadows Place Your *Place* For *Life*.

It is that time of year again for our Annual Heavy Trash Collection and our collection company, Republic Waste, is ready to assist us in this effort on Saturday, May 17, 2008. Please note: Do not put trash in any receptacles you want to keep. Heavy trash takes all items left at the curb. Please see other guidelines listed below:

- No tires, batteries, or automotive parts.
- No hazardous chemicals. If you have old paint cans they
 will need to be labeled "PAINT" so they are not mixed
 with regular trash. The problem with paint lies in the liquid
 solvents within. Paint that has dried is no problem and can
 be taken with the trash. You may accomplish this by leaving
 the lid off until solidification, or by using cat litter or oil
 absorbent.-
- No concrete or bricks
- No tree stumps or tree trunks bigger than 6" in diameter

As Spring arrives and everyone is freshening up their yards, here are the guidelines for the Garden Club selection of Yard of the Month.

- 1. Overall landscaping as seen from the street, variety and symmetry.
- 2. Lawns: condition and manicure.
- 3. Shrubs: condition / quality and consistency / suitability.
- 4. Trees: condition, quality and trim.
- 5. Annuals and accessory: seasonal / color / harmony. No artificial flowers or plants.

Yards are judged on the last week-end of the month.

Garden Tips from Southwest Fertilizer, our presenter at the March 11 meeting.

Brown Patch in your yard may be associated with a drainage problem. Check to see if the area stays too moist.

To grow and keep a healthy turf, your lawn needs to be aerated. Even with fertilization, the grass is unable to get what it needs to grow if it is not properly aerated.

A simple reminder, keep your lawn mower blades sharp. This creates a better cut and appearance.

"STARS AND STRIPES OVER MEADOWS PLACE"





WHY ARE THERE NO SPEED LIMIT SIGNS IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD?

Communities usually don't install speed limit signs inside of a community. This is covered in the Texas Transportation Code (§545.352) which states in part;

- (a) A speed in excess of the limits established by Subsection (b) or under another provision of this subchapter is prima facie evidence that the speed is not reasonable and prudent and that the speed is unlawful.
- (b) Unless a special hazard exists that requires a slower speed for compliance with section 545.351(b), the following speeds are lawful:
- (1) 30 miles per hour in an urban district on a street other than an alley and 15 miles per hour in an alley......

An operator may not drive a vehicle at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions (weather, persons, vehicles, etc) then existing. This means if there is no posted speed limit sign on the streets of an urban district then the maximum speed is prima facie or understood to be 30 miles per hour.

When you slow down inside of our community you just might be saving the life of a citizen, child or yourself. Take that extra minute and drive responsibly. 

ATTENTION TENNIS PLAYERS

Please take a moment to read the tennis rules sign located at the tennis court. All rules will be enforced and violators will be subject to forfeiture of their privileges for use of City facilities. The access card reader installed at the entrance gate will read every card and allow or deny access. The memory in the card reader gives the Parks and Recreation Office the information as to what resident's card was swiped at any given time of the day. It has been observed on a regular basis that too many guests or even nonresident use may be going on. Upon observation of such occurrence and notification to the Parks Department, we will research access information. This information will enable the Parks Office to contact the card holder to discuss possible violation of the access card rules.

If you see suspicious use of the tennis courts, or anyone violating the rules, please take note of the time of day and the possible violation and contact the Parks Department. You can call and leave a detailed message 24 hrs a day. Your personal name and information is optional. We will investigate the situation and contact you, if you wish, as well as the prospective violator.
