SOME GOOD NEWS

This has been a very busy period for the City. Beside preparing for, and getting struck by a large Category II hurricane, we have been working on our parks, reviewing City investment policies, moving forward with budget hearings and setting the tax rate for 2008-2009. First some good news. After

two and a half months of departmental budget reviews and public hearings, Mayor and Council have agreed to keep the tax rate the same as last year. Even though the cost of providing services has risen, maintaining the same tax rate was made possible by the increased revenues received from our commercial properties and a very thin budget.

As the City continues its recovery from Ike, I am pleased to report that there was minimal damage to City property and equipment. There was some damage of course but all things considered, we fared well. We have some damage to the small swing arm and electrical system in the sewer plant but we are still able to function normally. We did lose some computers and electronics due to power spikes at the Command Center. There were some leaks and minor damage at the Annex but none to the Community Center, City Hall or the Fire Station. Pre-storm planning save us a lot of money, especially in our parks.

Like you, the City lost some trees and branches. Thankfully we had CenterPoint out to trim trees away from out transmission power lines this summer or we could have had severe power outages. Most of our street light damage was a result of tree damage. As I mentioned last in last month's newsletter, trimmed trees cause less damage, are safer and are the homeowner's responsibility. Please get them professionally trimmed.

We had a great turnout for the last City Council meeting. Thank you to everyone who attended and especially to those who took the time to comment. Former Councilwoman Leen Zellers brought the Council Chamber to a standing ovation as she thanked and congratulated our hard working and dedicated Police Department for leaving their families and loved ones to 'camp out' at the Annex working 12 hour shifts on our behalf. The ovation was well deserved for our Police Department but let's not forget the Fire Department, the staff at Parks and City Hall who never missed a beat and hats off to our Public Works and Code Enforcement personnel who worked so hard to help us recover from the impact of Ike, once again proving Meadows Place truly can be – *Your* Place for *Life*.

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT / 2008

The National Association of Town Watch (NATW) and the Meadows Place Police Department announce a new date for 2008 National Night Out in Texas. Because of Texas' summer heat, the NATW has approved the date of October 7, 2008, for National Night Out this Year. The new date will hopefully bring cooler temperatures with it.

National Night Out 2007 involved 35.4 million people in 11,310 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canada and military bases world wide. *National Night Out* is designed for to: 1) heighten crime prevention awareness; 2) generate support for and participation in local anti-crime programs; 3) strengthen neighborhood spirit and policecommunity partnerships; and 4) send a message to criminals letting them know that the neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

Along with the traditional outside lights and front porch vigils, most cities and towns in Texas now celebrate *National Night Out* with neighborhood events such as block parties, cookouts, and visits from the local law enforcement. The NATW and Meadows Place Police Department encourage you to start organizing now. 

Code Red Update



Hurricane Ike was the first time the Code Red alert system was used in Meadows Place for an actual emergency, and it did an excellent job of delivering messages to residents and businesses. Code Red was successful in delivering messages to about 63% of over 2200 phone numbers for Meadows Place.

Code Red was implemented last By Alderman *Charles Kulhanek* year, and the initial database was created using the water billing records at that time. If you did not receive a call during Ike or if your phone number has changed, please be sure to submit your information through the Meadows Place website (www. cityofmeadowsplace.org). You may submit both your home and cell phone numbers, but only Meadows Place residents and businesses are accepted.

Code Red phone calls can be identified by the number 999-911-9999 on your caller ID. The system will make three attempts to deliver the City's message, and it is designed to deliver messages to a live person or an answering machine. However, Code Red is not currently compatible with Call Notes.

TALK THE FIRST R.A.D KIDS EXPERIENCE IN MEADOWS PLACE

It was a great time and an excellent learning experience as The Meadows Place Police Department sponsored their first graduating class of r.a.d.KIDS on September 7, 2008. The class consisted of twenty-three boys and girls from ages 5 to 12 years old.

The r.a.d.KIDS became empowered with knowledge, confidence, and skills to replace fear and confusion in dangerous situations, and were taught how to protect themselves from violence and harm. One question asked during the class was.....What does r.a.d. stand for?

- r.a.d. stands for RESISTING AGGRESSION DEFENSIVELY
- At the completion of the course, the r.a.d.KIDS demonstrated their abilities to escape and run to safety.
- r.a.d.KIDS were also taught fire, gun, school, vehicle and bicycle safety.


