CITY BUSINESS

Thanks to a lot of hard work by city staff, Meadows Place has already closed it's books for fiscal year 2007-2008 and presented the figures to our auditors. This is a process which not only oversees our in house accounting functions and makes sure we are in compliance with accepted accounting

standards and principals but also looks for deficiencies that could cause the city problems. In addition, the auditors accumulate detailed information on capital assets, review and confirm depreciation schedules and work with staff to make any adjustments necessary to be able to present government-wide-basis of accounting in the financial statements. As usual, our financial statements are in order and our finances look strong. We are very fortunate to have such qualified financial personnel on staff to work with our auditors and look after our finances on a daily basis.

ROAD NEWS

Meadows Place has gone out for bids for improvements on the Dairy Ashford esplanades. This beautification effort is a joint venture with Sugar Land which will help define our boundaries and continue to improve the overall image of Meadows Place. We are also in the very, very early stages of improving the sections of West Airport & Kirkwood that are inside the City. We will keep you posted of any movement in this area.

When: Always! Storm drain dumping is NEVER

Where: All the storm drain basins in Meadows Place.

Storm drains are located mostly at street corners or on the side of the roadway.

Why: Solid debris takes up space in the storm

piping thereby making it less effective in transporting storm water to the ditch. In other words, dumping solid debris and pollutants into the storm sewer allows streets to become flooded after heavy rains. To learn more see

Times of increased criminal activity in our city result in different strategies by your Meadows Place Police Department. For example, our response to an increase in burglaries normally includes the following:

- 1) An increase in neighborhood patrols with both marked units and unmarked units this may also include officers working overtime on burglary patrol assignments;
- 2) You may see our units driving more slowly and/or stopped on particular streets for periods of time as a result of heightened vigilance;
- 3) An increase in the number of stops/contacts of both vehicles and pedestrians on our streets;
- 4) Officers stopping at homes where they see open garage doors, open gates, open doors or windows, etc., to make sure the property is secure and the homeowner is aware of the potential consequences.

In addition, we are continually coordinating and working with law enforcement agencies in adjacent jurisdictions where the same types of crimes are usually occurring. Information and resources are shared in an attempt to catch the bad guys. Home security tips are provided on the city website at www.cityofmeadowsplace.org and are available in person at the police department. We also provide pertinent information related to on-going criminal activity to our elected officials and city department heads as another way to disseminate factual information to the public.

Your police department is dedicated to the safety and security of our residents. Never under estimate the importance of citizen involvement in this partnership. We encourage and welcome your collective diligence and participation. Please call us immediately to report anything you see that is suspicious or out-of-the-ordinary. We appreciate your help and support.

RAD FOR WOMEN

The National Standard in Self Defense Education (tm)

"Rape Aggression Defense" is a program taught nationally by certified instructors representing law enforcement, women's assistance centers and college and universities throughout the United States and Canada. Instructors, *Jim and Sandra Baylor*, have instructed over 4000 women ages 12 – 86 in the RAD Systems Basic Physical Defense Course. This is truly a program for all females regardless of age, fitness level or any physical restriction. At the conclusion of the training, the students will be able to apply their skills in simulated confrontations with aggressors.

Attendees will be introduced to lectures on the theories of <u>Risk Avoidance</u>, <u>Risk Recognition</u>, <u>Risk Awareness</u>, <u>and Risk Reduction</u> to help them stay safe in their every day environments. In addition, basic self defense techniques and strategies to avoid abductive or aggressive acting out person(s) will be taught to help a person who is confronted to escape and survive. A series of active simulations will be conducted on the last day of training so the participant can apply skills learned.

Every day women have to think about their personal safety. By attending this program you will receive the education, physical skills and options to deal with violent situations and the chance to be part of the decision making process to resist or even consider compliance if confronted with any type of violent behavior.

This is a 15 hour class with a training fee. This is the only time you will pay a fee for a RAD for Women course. As a "RADGRAD", you will receive a lifetime return policy to practice as often as you wish at no cost.


