MEADOWS PLACE IN 2024

As some of you may have seen in the newspaper, Meadows Place used some of it's Economic Development Funds to hire Marsh Darcy Partners, Inc. Marsh Darcy offers Planning, Development and Real Estate Services for municipalities, developers and joint

venture groups. They provide physical and policy planning services as well as comprehensive planning and special district creation services to help those entities develop sustainable solutions and create places where people want to live and work. Meadows Place called on Marsh Darcy to help us look at where we are today, to invigorate our imaginations and then help us compare where we are to where we want to be fifteen years from now. This will give us both a target and a goal as we construct a plan for City Leaders to follow in the future.

Phase I, which we have completed, consisted of a day long panel discussion which was moderated and led by Sue Darcy of Marsh Darcy. The purpose of this panel was to develop a written description of Meadows Place today and then another one circa 2024. This will allow us to create a plan to build an even better City for us to live in without sacrificing the things we love about Meadows Place today. Ms. Darcy said she was quite impressed with the panel we put together for her to work with. It included most of Council, the City Secretary and members of staff and PD. It also included a panel of residents that represented long time and new home owners, business owners, and consisted of men, women, young and not so young. Even college and high school students participated.

We will keep you posted as we continue to move through this process. There was one thing that stood out even on a panel as diverse as this – that people here love Meadows Place and are willing to work to keep it – *Your* Place For *Life*.



Paper – Dry and Clean

- Newspapers & inserts (don't bag them leave them loose)
- Magazines & catalogs
- Junk mail, envelopes, file folders
- Office white, colored and computer paper (staples & paper clips ok)
- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Cereal & gift boxes
- Paper bags & phone books
- Wrapping paper (remove metallic paper, bows)

Containers – Clean and Empty

- Aluminum cans (don't bag them leave them loose)
- Aluminum foil & foil plates
- Plastic bottles, jars, tubs & buckets
- Metal food cans (tin/steel)
- Metal lids, metal pots & pans



As the sun rose on Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day 2008, the streets of Meadows Place took on a bold new patriotic look. Over one hundred fifty residents are subscribers to Troop 1115's Flag Service. Some of our streets woke up to see that more than half of the homes presented a prominent Red, White and Blue, high quality flag, proudly flying from a tall straight flag pole which was securely and uniformly placed just off the curb in front of each subscriber's home.

We wish to express our sincere Thank You to those who have subscribed to this Flag Service, for supporting Troop 1115 and for expressing the patriotic spirit on the holidays when we honor America.

To those who have not yet subscribed, we extend this invitation and ask for your support. (NOTE: Flags approved by the City of Meadows Place)

Troop 1115 will proudly post an American Flag in front of your residence on each of the following national holidays: <u>Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, and</u> <u>Labor Day.</u> (On Veteran's Day, the scouts are usually in school so flags will NOT be placed in front of homes that day).

For subscribers, a flag holder (PVC pipe) will be placed underground in your front yard, approximately 18 inches back from the curb. On the morning of the four National holidays listed above, Troop 1115 will post an American Flag approximately three by five feet in size on a metal flagpole approximately 10 feet high. Troop 1115 will then return in the evening to retire the flag and flagpole and store it until the next holiday. Note: The flags and flagpoles are the property of Troop 1115. You are purchasing a subscription service and NOT the flag or flagpole itself.
