Survey Results

First let me thank everyone who went to the website to take our Road Use Survey. It was most helpful and gave us great insight into the thoughts and feelings of the residents of Meadows Place.

As you know, we have funding for Kirkwood and for Airport from Kirkwood to 59, so the survey pertained only to our internal streets. The ones our homes are on. We typically budget \$50,000 a year for street maintenance and repairs. Simply put, we are falling behind and the responsible thing to do is to address the problem. The following are some of the results of the survey. To see the complete results and individual comments, check the website survey section.

More people are dissatisfied than satisfied with our streets (43% to 38%) but 40 percent feel our streets are about as good as those in cities around us. 59.9 % feel we are doing a good job on our streets with the budget we have (Thank You), but 87.69% of the respondents would like the City to do more regarding the road repair inside the city! This was a huge number, especially considering that the only way to do more is to fund more. The reasons became clear as 58% believe our streets have a major impact on our property values with an additional 34% feeling they have some, if only a little, impact on our property values.

I have been searching for a funding vehicle that will not fall into the General Fund where it disappears every year or gets used for other things. I wanted to find something that could be put away exclusively for funding repair and maintenance on our internal streets. Another important piece of the puzzle is to fund it in a way that if all the funds were not used in one budget year, they could roll over and accumulate. That said, the funding options that we have at hand, without a big bond sale (more on that later) are; raising property taxes, a franchise fee as a percentage attached to our waste collection, or a flat fee. Seventy-six percent of the respondents, again, an overwhelming number, called for a flat fee. The other two options were equally divided at had 11.7%.

Mosquitos only breed in stagnant water so keep your pools functioning properly. We simply cannot allow pools in Meadows Place to become breeding grounds for potentially deadly pests. We will address any we discover immediately - most the same day. If your pool is faltering, bring it up to code. If you suspect a pool is a breeding pit, please report it to Code Enforcement - anonymously if you wish. Thank You.

It became very clear, very quickly that the vast majority want us to do something, and they want us to use a flat fee. Something budgetable. Something that will not change when values go up or a new contract is written. I understand, I feel the same way. The majority of the respondents (58%) wanted to see a flat fee of five or ten dollars with the rest preferring a fee of three dollars. For those who did not take the survey, a fee of \$5.00 per month per household, in a year, will raise \$93,000 dedicated to road repairs of our internal streets. This will help us catch up and keep up, and, when the time comes, can be used to help leverage or maybe even help pay down internal road repair bond projects. This fee, whatever the amount or type it is, will be set by Council and could not be raised without a new city ordinance. When nearly eighty-eight percent say do something, it is clear something should be done and as one resident's comment said - "Do it now". Council and I will consider doing something, soon, if not now.

Budget Season

City Council and the Department Heads are now well into Budget Season. This consists of a series of meetings where Council and Department Heads review both revenues and expenditures, look at problems, options, short and long term projects. At the end of the day, they all have to produce an expenditure number smaller than the anticipated revenues number and make it all work to provide the residents of Meadows Place the best possible services and amenities we can offer on the rather small budget that we have. We also have to pay the staff – and we have a great staff. Thankfully, it appears we have made it through the downturn. This year, preliminary property value numbers are up, sales tax number are up a bit, but health insurance costs are at this time uncertain, and appearing to be way, way up, making forecasts very difficult. Your Council has always operated from a conservative monetary perspective and will again this year. If you have any questions about the budget, the budget process, or why we can or cannot do something, please feel free to contact the Mayor or any Council Member. If we do not know the answer, we will find out for you. Thank You.

ATM Safety Tips

ATM's have added a real convenience to our lives but, at the same time, an element of risk has also popped up. Using an ATM safely requires awareness and a little planning. Just because an ATM is open for business and available 24 hours a day doesn't mean it is always safe to use. A little common sense can keep most of us out of trouble, but you should periodically review the safety of the ATM you are going to use.

Before using an ATM:

Pick a Safe Location. ATM's are used 24 hours a day. They are susceptible to misuse, vandalism, robbery, and can jeopardize safety of customers. Therefore, use only an ATM in high visibility, high traffic areas with a defined parking area, adequate lighting, and proper landscaping. Don't use ATMs that are remote or hidden behind buildings, behind pillars, walls, or away from public view. Beware of overgrown shrubbery or trees. They make good hiding places and robbers like to have the element of surprise and no witnesses.

Using the ATM:

Try to Limit Your Use to Daylight Hours. Take someone with you, if you can. **Use ATM's You're Familiar With.** Be **Observant.** When you drive up to an ATM location, look around. If you see anyone suspicious standing around or just sitting in a car, drive away. **Look Over the Machine Before Inserting Your Card.** If you see something unfamiliar on the machine, it could be part of an ATM scam. If it looks funny, go to another ATM. **Have Your Card in Your Hand.** Be ready to use it right away. You don't want to stand around and take extra time looking for your card in your purse or wallet. **Keep Your Car Secured.** Lock your car if you have to get out to use the ATM machine.

Memorize your personal PIN number to prevent loss and to expedite the transaction. Shield your transaction. Use your body or hand to shield the ATM keyboard when you enter your PIN. Don't give someone else the opportunity to see the number you are entering. Put your cash away immediately in your pocket, wallet or purse, extract your card and walk away. Do not display your cash or count it at the ATM. Cash can be tempting when it is out in the open. Don't leave your receipt. Be sure to take your receipt or transaction records with you when you leave. Never accept an offer of help or request help from a suspicious person at the ATM machine. Robberies are somewhat more likely to occur at walk-up ATM's than at drive-thru ATM's.

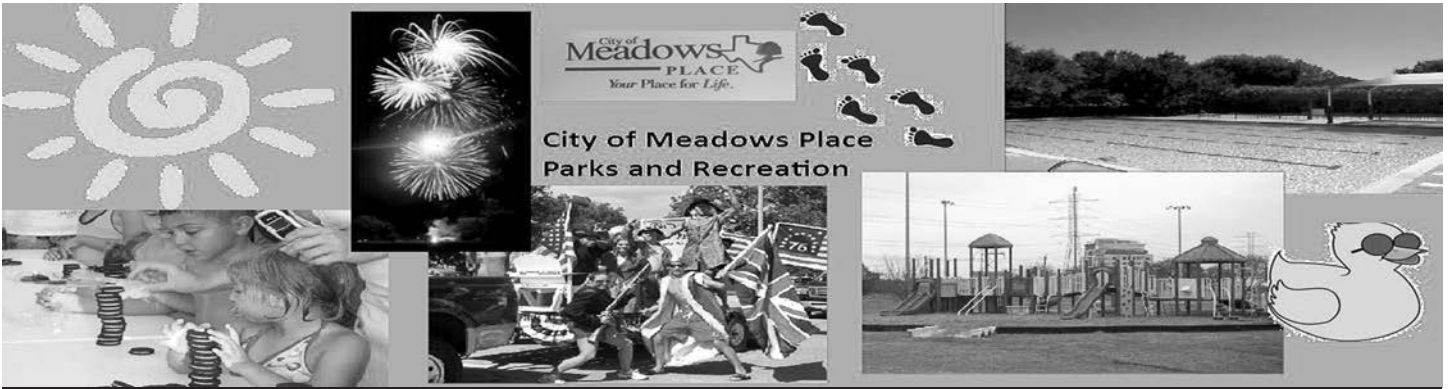

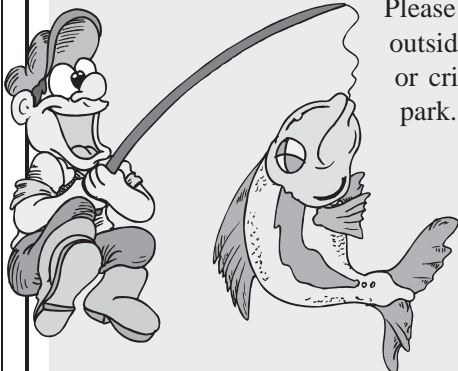

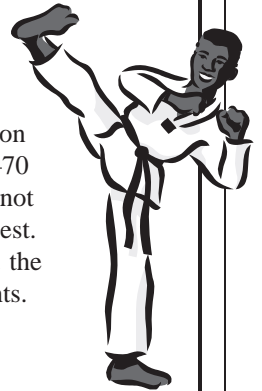

Message from the Pool Manager

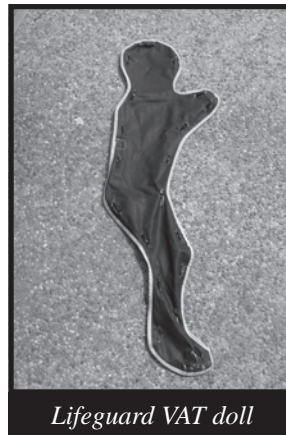

Tattoo Tuesdays & Freezy Pop Fridays are quite popular this summer. Come swim at the pool on those days and ask the Lifeguards for one temporary tattoo on Tuesdays or one freezy pop on Fridays.

Meadows Place lifeguards are the best around and we train hard to ensure we are ready in the event of an aquatic emergency. As part of our ongoing training, myself and the Assistant Managers conduct V.A.T. (Vigilance Awareness Training) tests weekly on all of the lifeguards. We do this by placing a "shadow doll" in the water and timing

the lifeguard on how long it takes for them to spot the doll, blow their whistle, jump in the water and save the doll. To the lifeguard, the doll looks like an unconscious victim on the bottom of the pool. If it looks like the lifeguards are jumping off the stand for nothing, they are probably performing a VAT test! If you see the VAT doll in the water, leave it alone and watch the guard perform a simulated rescue!

Water Aerobics

This is a sixty minute cardiovascular workout in the pool, which utilizes water resistance to improve cardiovascular fitness, muscular endurance, and flexibility. As the participant, you determine your own intensity level by deciding how hard to manipulate the water.

Sources of Ground Water

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pickup substances resulting from the presence of animal or human activity.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791.

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildfire.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, and residential uses.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm water runoff, and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also, come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff, and specific systems.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be, result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water must provide the same protection for public health.

You may be more vulnerable than the general population to certain microbial contaminants, such as *Cryptosporidium*, in drinking water. We are responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but we cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested.
