COMMENTS FROM THE MAYOR By Charles Jessup



West Airport Blvd. Reconstruction Project

Several people contact City Hall for construction updates and to ask about road closures - specifically those within the city. First, I want to thank everyone for touching base. It lets us know what questions and concerns people are having regarding the West

Airport Reconstruction Project. One of the most frequent questions was why did we close some of our roads off and, will they stay that way. First, I want you to know that the decision to close roads was not arbitrary. Prior to construction, there was a great deal of discussion between all parties involved and the decisions were based with the safety of our citizens, workers and commuters in mind.

Meadow Valley and Amblewood were closed to prevent commuter traffic from cutting through from West Airport to avoid backups and delays caused by construction. It is estimated that 500 to 1000 vehicles a day would cut through our city if those two streets if they were left open. This is based on traffic counts which show Eastbound West Airport has between 3,000 and 4,000 a day vehicles just between 6:00 am and 9:00 am.

I know this is an inconvenience to many of us, but I believe it is a far better alternative than having people not familiar with our city scurrying around trying to figure out how to get out. I hope this answers some of you questions and concerns. I ask you to please bear with us as we move through this project. It will be worth it when we are finished. Thanks again for contacting us.

Your appointment to a position denotes the Council's desire to have the benefit of your input during the decision-making process. While Council has the ultimate political and legal responsibility in conducting local government, committee members have an important role in assisting the City Council to best fulfill its obligations to our residents. Check the newsletter and the website for committee opportunities as we will soon be announcing the formation of new committees and I hope you will consider serving.

Budget Season

Multiple departmental budget meetings, first with the Mayor and then with Mayor and Council, signals the arrival of what is known as "Budget Season". It is a difficult time for the staff and your City Council with all the meetings, evaluations, research, discussions and prioritization of expenditures that go into determining the figures which will be used in the final budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-2015. As mentioned in the Moody's report, Meadows Place budget was developed using a conservative approach helping to ensure financial solidity for the city and your Council will use a similar process this year. Our budgets help by providing guidance and direction to city staff throughout the budget year and serve as a benchmark. It addresses the goals and objectives set by City Council, meets the criteria of the Meadows Place Vision Statement, and maintains the safety standards set forth by our citizens. The budget also accounts for expected revenues as it allocates those resources to particular expenditures. Of course the public is invited to all budget hearings and workshops as this process moves forward. We should be finalizing the figures in August for final determination and approval of the budget and tax rate in September. 

- •Only adult residents of Meadows Place may purchase wristbands; a registration card must be completed.
- A driver's license or water bill verifying Meadows Place residency must be shown to purchase wristbands.
- Wristbands are \$5 per band; one wristband required for each family member.
- Wristbands are valid May through September only.
- Residents must have wristband with them to enter the pool.
- One guest allowed per wristband and all guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- No refunds. There is a \$5 replacement fee for lost wristbands.

Tattoo Tuesdays, Play @ the Pool Thursdays & Freezy Pop Fridays are quite popular this summer. Come swim at the pool on those days and ask the Lifeguards for one temporary tattoo on Tuesdays or one freezy pop on Fridays. Bring games to the Pool on Thursdays, play with your friends then take a break and take a swim.

Meadows Place lifeguards are the best around 3 and we train hard to ensure we are ready in the event of an aquatic emergency. As part of our ongoing training, myself and the Assistant

Managers conduct V.A.T. (Vigilance Awareness Training) tests weekly on all of the lifeguards. We do this by placing a

"shadow doll" in the water and timing the lifeguard on how long it takes for them to spot the doll, blow their whistle, jump in the water and save the doll. To the lifeguard, the doll looks like an unconscious victim on the bottom of the pool. If it looks like the lifeguards are jumping off the stand for nothing, they are probably performing a VAT test! If you see the VAT doll in the water, leave it alone and watch the guard perform a simulated rescue!





Tennis Court Access System

Last year's Tennis Court access cards were deactivated at the end of May. Residents may purchase new Tennis Court access cards at City Hall, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4 pm.

- Only residents of Meadows Place may purchase a card.
- A driver's license AND water bill verifying Meadows Place residency must be shown to purchase the access card.
- Access cards are \$50 per card, maximum two (2) cards per family.
- Cards are valid through May; old cards are deactivated at the end of May.
- All tennis players must have access card with them while on the courts.
- A maximum of three (3) guests allowed per card and all guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- Do not prop open the gate at any time or allow access to the courts to anyone without a Tennis Court access card.

Failure to comply with all rules posted at the Tennis Courts and on the Registration Card will result in forfeiture of Access Cards and future access will be denied.

Sources of Drinking Water

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pickup substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the EPAs Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791.

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm water runoff, and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff, and septic systems.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

Contaminants may be found in drinking water that may cause taste, color, or odor problems. These types of problems are not necessarily causes for health concerns. For more information on taste, odor, or color of drinking water, please contact the system's business office.

You may be more vulnerable than the general population to certain microbial contaminants, such as Cryptosporidium, in drinking water. Infants, some elderly, or immunocompromised persons such as those undergoing chemotherapy for cancer; persons who have undergone organ transplants; those who are undergoing treatment with steroids; and people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, can be particularly at risk from infections. You should seek advice about drinking water from your physician or health care providers. Additional guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. We are responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but we cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. 


