Moody's Upgrades Meadows Place

NEW YORK, May 09, 2014 -- Moody's Upgrades Meadows Place., This was the headline on a recent report from Moody's Investors Service. I am proud to report that Moody's Investors Service has upgraded the City of Meadows Place to Aa3 from A1. This is a jump into a higher category and is not common for such a small city that is mostly residential. It was a proud moment for me and I would like to share it with you. The report said the rating reflects the city's above average socioeconomic profile, our small, relatively stable tax base in the Houston area, stable financial operations with healthy reserve levels which are "A Result of Conservative Budgeting". They also pointed out Meadows Place has a manageable debt burden. They also commented the strengths of our city include a very strong financial position based on conservative fiscal operations, expected growth within the city and concluded by saying "The city's solid financial performance and reserves were key rating factor in the upgrade". I would like to thank both City Council and Staff for working so hard to keep Meadows Place financially viable and secure so will continue to be, Your Place for Life.







Residents may purchase new Pool wristbands beginning May 17 at the Pool during regular pool hours. See the Pool Hours section in the Newsletter for dates and times.

- Only adult residents of Meadows Place may purchase wristbands; a registration card must be completed.
- A driver's license OR water bill verifying Meadows Place residency must be shown to purchase wristbands.
- Wristbands are \$5 per band; one wristband required for each family member.
- Wristbands are valid May through September only.
- Residents must have wristband with them to enter the pool.
- One guest allowed per wristband and all guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- No refunds. There is a \$5 replacement fee for lost wristbands.

Well, summer is here, and the pool is open! I want to take this opportunity to welcome everyone back for another great season. See a detailed list of pool operating days and hours in the left column or the marquee inside the pool. Please be sure to read the back of your pool registration card for an updated list of the pool rules. The rules are also posted on the marquee inside the pool area.

Wrist Bands will need to be purchased again this year for pool access. Wrist bands will only be available for purchase during normal operating hours **at the Pool**. Wrist bands are available to residents of the City of Meadows Place for the 2014 summer season. More information about wrist bands can be found in the Pool Access box to the left

Lifeguards are not Babysitters. The Meadows Place Lifeguards are the best. They train before the summer and throughout the season, and they take their job very seriously. The lifeguards are attentive and work on a rotation so that they will always be alert. But do not depend on them to babysit your kids. The lifeguards are there to make sure swimmers follow the safety rules and to help if anyone is in danger, but in a crowded pool even the best lifeguards can miss things.

When it comes to very young kids, children must not be left unattended at the pool even in the presence of lifeguards. Everyone needs some time to relax, but not while your children play unattended in the pool. If you have young kids, especially little ones who cannot yet swim, you should be in the pool with them, close enough to help if they get into trouble. Parenting is your job, and drowning can happen in seconds.

Drowning remains the leading cause of accidental death for kids ages 1-5. The World's Largest Swimming Lesson is taking place at the Pool on June 20th to help us send the vital message that Swimming Lessons Save Lives[™] to millions of kids and adults around the globe! It's a great way to assess how well your children can swim and get them a free lesson. And if they need to improve their skills, Swimming Lessons are available through the Parks & Recreation Department. The information for both of these activities is in this Newsletter and listed on the marquee inside the pool; or just ask me or a Lifeguard.




