First, I want to thank you for all the support you have shown me, staff and Council as we keep Meadows Place moving forward. You know the old saying, "If you are not moving forward, you are falling behind". Well, thanks to a lot of hard work and a Can Do attitude, Meadows Place is NOT falling behind. In fact, we are proudly making moves that will allow Meadows Place to take advantage of regional growth and economic development and not be left behind.

We are part of the Fort Bend Subregional Planning Initiative which allows us to be treated as an equal stakeholder in the future of Ft. Parks Director Monya Keenen will be in Texas City on Feb. 7th to receive the award.

Another big item for 2012 was the opening of the Meadows Place Tactical Training Center on Kirkwood. This state of the art training center has already paid off for the city.

The City of Meadows Place is a Great Place for Walkers and Joggers

The Meadows Place Police Department offers the following suggestions:

- 1. **Use the sidewalk** (when possible). If the street isn't designed for pedestrians, don't walk on it. Never walk on highways or in restricted zones.
- 2. You know those "walk" and "do not walk" signs? Listen to them. Don't jaywalk.
- 3. **Don't make assumptions.** Don't assume that a vehicle will stop for you just because you are waiting to cross. Try to make eye contact with the driver before initiating crossing. If you're in a busy city, don't cross without looking both ways even when you have the pedestrian "walk" symbol as drivers do occasionally run red lights.
- 4. **Do not walk long distances under the influence of alcohol or drugs.** Just as you should never drive under the influence, do not walk long distances or in traffic-heavy areas when you are under the influence. Call a taxi or use public transportation.
- 5. **Be courteous.** When a driver stops to allow you to cross, give him or her a quick wave to demonstrate your appreciation.
- 6. You wouldn't drive distracted, so don't walk distracted. Stay aware of your surroundings by not texting, using headphones, or talking on your cell phone.

When you're in the driver's seat, avoid an accident by abiding by these five tips:

- 1. Always be on the lookout. Pedestrians can and will be found anywhere, even places where you are not expecting it (like highways or busy, multiple-lane intersections). Therefore it's crucial that you frequently scan the road ahead of you, including shoulders and sidewalks, so that you spot pedestrians before you approach them.
- 2. **Stay alert and avoid distracted driving.** Assuming that they have the right-of-way, many pedestrians walk into the street without confirming that oncoming traffic is aware of their presence. Furthermore, pedestrians especially children are often hidden in between parked cars or behind other objects. To avoid an accident, stay alert by avoiding distractions. Do not eat or drink, fiddle with the radio or navigation units, or use a cell phone while driving.
- 3. **Show caution.** There are likely areas in your community where you can anticipate pedestrians. In crosswalks and intersections, drive slowly and stop for pedestrians looking to cross even if they are not at a marked crosswalk. When stopping at an unmarked point, stop far enough in advance so that the drivers behind you can also prepare to stop. Furthermore, when approaching a red light, be sure to stop far enough behind the line for pedestrians to cross safely.
- 4. **Be respectful.** Don't show hostility or aggression to drivers who are yielding to pedestrians. Never honk or get frustrated when the driver in front of you has stopped, and don't attempt to pass the stopped vehicle in front of you.
- 5. **Watch for children.** Because of their small size, children can be difficult to spot. Drive slowly and be on the lookout in school zones and residential neighborhoods.

The Wall of Heroes is a special place set aside at Meadows Place City Hall and is designed to honor the brave men and women of Meadows Place who are serving in the Army, Air Force, Navy, Coast Guard, Marines or Reserves. Retired Veterans may also be honored on the Wall of Heroes.

To have a photo placed on our Wall of Heroes, the service person must be or have been a Meadows Place resident who has a relative currently living in Meadows Place.

It is the relative's responsibility to coordinate with the Parks & Recreation Department the purchase, placement and removal of the plaque for the Wall of Heroes. The plaque is the property of the relative who purchased it and may be removed at any time.

Please contact the Parks & Recreation Department below to be added to the Wall of Heroes. The service person's relative must purchase the Wall of Heroes plaque from *M* & *M* Awards & More. This is an 8"x10" oak veneer plaque with a 5"x7" plexi-glass photo cover and three lines of laser etched print which has the service person's name, branch of service and overseas area of deployment. A 5"x7" portrait photo is required, preferably in uniform and must be supplied to *M* & *M* Awards & More to be attached to the plaque. The cost of the plaque is approximately \$35.00 plus tax.




