Election Follow up

Water Reclamation Project and Parks Update

We are getting close to having a reclaimed water system right here in Meadows Place! It has been a long haul and lots of hard work but we are almost finished. As I write this, we have just a few short sections of pipeline to put in, electrical connections to make, some system testing to do and then, finally, we can start filling our new lake. This is the water we will use for our main parks irrigation and is one more step in making sure Meadows Place is doing its part to be an ecologically responsible city – and will save money to boot! We will let you know when we start filling the lake. It should be fun to watch and give you a reason to come check out all the new things we have for you around the lake. So monitor the website or check the marquee by the pool for the big announcement. Hope to see you up there.

"Smart Planning for Hurricane Season"

Hurricane season officially begins June 1st and continues through November 30th. Start planning early to protect your families and

property. Although Meadows Place is not in an Evacuation Zone that would be threatened by storm surge, making a family plan in case of any hazard is a smart idea. Choose a place to call and a place to meet. Give all family members the name and number of someone outside your city. Anyone not with the group should call that number to let others know where they are. Learn to use the American Red Cross "Safe and Well" website.

Put an emergency kit together now. Refill and re-check supplies after every storm. After the storm hits, you may be ready to return home in a matter of days, but re-entry may take longer due to storm damage. Government officials plan for storms one category worse than what is predicted. So should you.

- Learn evacuation routes before storm season. Even though we don't live in an evacuation zone, evacuation routes still run through Fort Bend County. Make sure you have a full gas tank before you leave. Delays and longer drive times are unavoidable.
- An emergency supply kit includes: NOAA weather radio and batteries; flashlight and batteries; extra eyeglasses; bottled water; non-perishable food; dry clothes; bedding; medications and copies of prescriptions; special products for babies, elderly, and family members with special medical needs; cash, credit cards; photo IDs; important documents and records; proof of residence; and insurance information.
- Make a checklist of preparations to be made before you leave and review it with your family. Review it again when a storm enters the Gulf of Mexico.
- If you plan to stay in a hotel, make reservations and confirm them before leaving.
- Prepare an emergency kit for your pets and a plan for how to care for them when you are traveling. Do not leave them behind without making arrangements for their care while you are gone.

How to Be a "Good" Neighbor

I believe that we would all like to be considered "good" neighbors, and also have the same expectations of the family living next door. Showing consideration for those within your community is the best way to describe what is normally expected of "good neighbors" It's

difficult to know what expectations your neighbors have of you, and you also may not know what expectations the city also has, so I've put together a list of **10 common issues** that some of you may not be familiar with. We all want to show pride in our community, and by displaying that pride we can also all be building the values of our homes.

Solid Waste & Recycling: Please be sure that you are not placing items curbside for collection any sooner than the evening (after 5 pm) prior to pick-up. Trash days are Tuesdays & Fridays. Friday is heavy trash day & Recycling. Empty trash cans & recycle bins need to be removed from the curbside promptly the day that they are collected. Please do not store your cans & bins in public view during non-collection days.

Trailers, Boats & RV's: Trailers, Boats & RV's cannot be stored in public view. This includes BBQ's on trailers.

Grass & Weeds: Grass & weeds cannot exceed 9 inches in height. Each resident also needs to keep the cracks of concrete clear from grass / weeds AND edging must be done along all edges of grass and concrete.

Noise: Mowing, garage / outdoor get-togethers, barking dogs, pool equipment can all be things that could be disturbing those living in close proximity. City ordinance identifies daylight hours (7am-7pm) as times when home maintenance can occur. Ordinance also states that noise within our community should not be continuous, unusual, or reasonably considered to disturb, annoy, injure or otherwise cause discomfort or disturb the peace.

Inoperable Vehicles: Vehicles must be kept in good working condition, and must be legally registered and displaying a current registration and inspection sticker as required by law.

Fences: Fences must be maintained in good condition. If your fence is not structurally sound or has missing pickets then it needs to have maintenance performed.

Animal Control Violations: No dog may Run at Large within the city. Animal that are outside of their normal enclosure must be restrained by a leash and under the control of a capable owner or keeper. The maximum allowable number of pets per household is 4 (dogs & cats) over the age of 4 months.


Stumps: Tree stumps need to be cut flush with the natural grade so that grass can grow over them or be removed.

Inoperable Gas Light Posts: Non-functioning gas lamps can pose a potential risk, and need to have the gas line capped by a licensed plumber prior to the removal of the lamp post.

Junk, Trash & Debris: Yards need to be kept clear of any accumulation of debris, which includes old newspapers or circulars. All yards (front & rear) are required to be kept in a sanitary manner. Swimming pools must be maintained in a clean and sanitary manner. Water that has become stagnant is not permitted, and must be emptied and cleaned properly.

It is very easy to be taken over by the speed in which your life is moving by, and by focusing yourself on completing your laundry list of tasks you may not notice someone who is in need. Please remember that we are a COMMUNITY. We have residents of every age and walk of life. A simple task of trimming back a tree branch 10 feet above the sidewalk may not be a problem for most people, but it is a huge obstacle for another. Please be mindful of your neighbor's needs and offer assistance if you are able. If you are in need of help please contact my office and I will try to find assistance when possible.






