Meadows Place Election -

On Saturday, May 8th, The City of Meadows Place will hold an election. Voting will take place at City Hall from 7a.m to 7 p.m. You will fill one seat on City Council and decide whether or not you want to change our Economic Development Corporation (EDC) from a Type 4A to a Type 4B. Two candidates, Scott Holland and Shirley Isbell, filed for the open seat on Council. They stepped up and showed they are willing and eager to serve. You can show your appreciation by VOTING! To learn more about the candidates, see Meet the Candidates on Page 5. The seat is open due to the resignation of Charles Kulhanek. Over the past 4 years, Charles, has been an integral part of many difficult decisions and played a major role in the early days of the City's website. His ability to focus on the issue at hand, calm demeanor, professional approach and financial background and were just part of what made Charles an effective member of Council. Thank You Charles, it has been an honor and a pleasure to work with you.

Census Participation

Pat yourselves on the back. Early results show Meadows Place with an 80% participation rate for the 2010 Census. This appears to be the highest participation rate of any city in Fort Bend County! This type of active engagement will be noticed and have a positive effect in ways yet unknown. The data collected is used to determine each state's Congressional seats and allocate funds intended for the local level. Locally, they will be used to determine things like who our County Commissioner will be. Thank You to everyone who participated!

State of the City

As you have undoubtedly heard, many cities are in serious financial trouble. Anticipating this, Meadows Place made some very tough budget decisions last year. At this time, it appears to be paying off. Half way through our 2009-2010 Budget Cycle, financial indicators point to Meadows Place being able to live with those budget projections. Judicial spending and cost cutting measures have helped, so has the fact that Meadows Place residents meet their community obligations and pay their taxes better than many other cities. Burglary Prevention

Burglary is a major problem in the United States that is growing every day. One burglary occurs every 10 seconds in the United States. Most burglaries are classified by law enforcement agencies as "crimes of opportunity." The criminal sees a home that is vulnerable to burglary and he takes the "opportunity" to break in. Through basic prevention techniques, the average citizen can make their home much less appealing to the criminal.

- Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- Don't allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers or flyers build up while you are away. Arrange with the Post Office to hold your mail, or arrange for a friend or neighbor to take them regularly.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended time.
- Check your locks on doors and windows and replace them with secure devices as necessary.
- Pushbutton locks on doorknobs are easy for burglars to open. Install deadbolt locks on all your outside doors.
- Sliding glass doors are vulnerable. Special locks are available for better security.
- Other windows may need better locks. Check with a locksmith or hardware store for alternatives.

Don't tempt a thief:

- Lawn mowers, barbecue grills and bicycles are best stored out of sight.
- Always lock your garden sheds and garages.
- Use curtains on garage windows.
- Never leave notes on your door such as "Gone shopping."

Locks...get the best:

- No lock, regardless of its quality, can be truly effective. Key-in dead bolt locks provide minimum security. Ask a locksmith for advice on your situation.
- Change locks immediately if your keys are lost or stolen.
- When moving into a new home, have all locks changed.

Targeting the Outside:

- Have adequate exterior lighting. A motion-sensitive light is recommended for backyards.
- Trim trees and shrubs so that they cannot be used as hiding places for intruders.
- Make sure your door hinges are on the inside.

Windows:

- Most windows can be pinned for security.
- Drill a 3/16" hole on a slight downward slant through the inside window frame and halfway into the outside frame - place a nail in the hole to secure the window.

Alarms:

- An alarm system is excellent for home security. It provides peace of mind to homeowners, especially while on vacation. There is a wide variety of alarm systems on the market.
- Make several inquiries to different companies for the best security system available to you.

If Your Home Is Broken Into:

If you come home to find an unexplained open/broken window or door:

- Do not enter - the perpetrator may still be inside.
- Use a neighbor's phone to call police.
- Do not touch anything or clean up until the police have inspected for evidence.

- Write down the license plate numbers of any suspicious vehicles.
- Note the descriptions of any suspicious persons.

Other precautions you should take:

- Never leave keys under doormats, flowerpots, mailboxes or other "secret" hiding places -- burglars know where to look for hidden keys.
- Keep a detailed inventory of your valuable possessions, including a description of the items, date of purchase and original value, and serial numbers, and keep a copy in a safe place away from home -- this is a good precaution in case of fires or other disasters. Make a photographic or video record of valuable objects, heirlooms and antiques. Your insurance company can provide assistance in making and keeping your inventory.
- Trim your shrubbery around your home to reduce cover for burglars.
- Be a good neighbor. If you notice anything suspicious in your neighborhood, call 9-1-1 immediately.
- Mark your valuables with your driver's license number with an engraver. Marked items are harder for a burglar to dispose of and easier for police to recover.
- Get involved in the Neighborhood Watch Program. We can help you work with your neighbors to improve security and reduce risk of burglary.
- Consider installing a burglar alarm system.

The MOST important thing YOU can do is CALL THE POLICE to report a CRIME or any SUSPICIOUS activity. You have to be the eyes of your neighborhood. And remember you can always remain a pair of anonymous eyes!

Remember the three L's of Crime Prevention: LIGHTS, LOCKS & the LAW!

Light up your residence, lock your doors at all times, and call the Law when you see something suspicious.

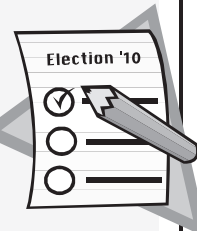
Meet the Candidates
