When a service line is cut, it will activate the EFV and stop the flow of gas." Great question, and even though this can be messy, the results will be great for our city.

We will strive to keep the costs down and service levels high. The new contract should be in place by August 1. Texas Direct Auto, Fort Bend County to help rebuild Dorrance

Another private public partnership is in the works that includes Fort Bend County, Texas Direct Auto and our Public Works Department. The result of the actions of this consortium will be to repair and put an asphalt overlay on Dorrance between Bloomington and the freeway. The city has entered into an Interlocal Agreement with Ft. Bend County by which the County will supply all the equipment and manpower to put an overlay on Dorrance. This will save the city a LOT of money. In addition, Texas Direct Auto has agreed to put \$80,000.00 toward the revitalization. Our Road Use Fee will fund the balance. Public Works Director Danny Segundo is working to coordinate the efforts and plans to have a start date lined up by the end of this month.

Permits and Licensed Contractors

Meadows Place requires permits to protect our safety and general welfare as they relate to the construction and occupancy of our homes and buildings. This is for the protection of current homeowners, future owners, the neighbors and the city in general. Permits ensure the work is done to Code and is inspected by qualified professionals to make sure there is no unsafe or incomplete work.

Permits also help protect the homeowner from unlicensed or fly by night contractors –like we have seen with this latest flood of roofing repairs. The permitting process flushed out unqualified contractors, some with no insurance. Less than honest contractors will get half up front and disappear with the money – the registration and the permitting process can prevent that. Registration provides some protection to the homeowner as material suppliers and subcontractors can place a lien on your home if they do not receive payment from your contractor. Check our website or call our Permits Department at City Hall if you have any questions. Don't be afraid of the permit process, embrace it – and make sure your contractor does too.

Polls will be open at City Hall for the Fort Bend ISD elections on Saturday, May 7th. There are only two positions open so voting won't take long. The School Board has a major impact on the education of our children, area stability, job growth and your bank account so please vote on Saturday, May 7th. Protect Your Pipes



The fats, oil and grease (FOG) found in food such as meat, cooking oil, shortening, sauces and dairy products are major concerns for our sewer system. When you put cooking leftovers like grease, oil and food scraps down the drain, it sticks to the sides of your pipes. This clogs your

pipes and causes back-ups resulting in an expensive visit from the plumber. Please take precautions to keep your pipes grease free.



How to Clean Dishes to Protect Your Pipes:

• Remove oil and grease from all dishes and pans before washing. Once grease or cooking oil has cooled, pour into covered collection containers. Wipe out the remainder using a paper towel. Never pour oil or grease down the drain.

• The garbage disposal does not destroy grease, it only makes it smaller. If you have accumulated grease in your pipes, putting food scraps down the drain can clog your pipes faster. Scrape food scraps from dishes into a trash can to avoid using your garbage disposal.

- Cover kitchen sink drains with catch baskets (strainers) and empty into the trash can as needed.
- Avoid using the garbage disposal and hot water. If grease does go down the drain, follow it with cold water.

If you are experiencing sewer issues please call USW at 832-756-2143, and a service tech will come out to determine if it's a private issue or a city issue.

Welcome Spring!



Spring is in bloom, and by the look of our yards (mine included), the weeds are really taking off this year!

If you are facing a weed dilemma in your yard, check with your local nursery. Sun, good drainage and lawn aeration will encourage

your grass to develop strong roots. Apply a thin blanket of compost over the lawn in the spring. Apply a slow-release or organic fertilizer after the lawn has greened and begun to grow. Water as needed, early in the day so that the grass blades dry quickly. Mow your grass at 3 inches, and leave the clippings as they will break down naturally and replenish the soils nutrients. Be sure that when you mow you are mindful to remove all of the clippings from the sidewalk and street.

Spring also traditionally means "Spring Cleaning". Now is a great time to get to some projects before the summer heat sets in.

Pressure wash your home, fix broken fence pickets, clean up the flowerbeds, and perform general maintenance (wash windows, treat active rust spots, and replace rotten fascia or siding...) Pick up and put away any items that have been left out on the driveway, porch and yard. Touch up paint the outside of your home. (Approved color palette available at City Hall.) Install 4" address numbers on the exterior of your home.

I also wish to offer a heartfelt Thank You to those citizens that have already begun the process of revitalizing their homes and OUR CITY!

Zero Tolerance UPDATE:

I was very pleased to see that some of the regular offenders took heed of the zero tolerance warnings. However, in the first 2 weeks of the project, 28 citations were mailed out. And as I write this, I still have another 10 for folks that left their cans out at the curb over the weekend, and another 14 that couldn't be bothered to store their cans out of view!

Please, remind your neighbors how easy it is to just put it away! It isn't fun finding out that it can cost you up to \$500 for thinking "I'll just get it later"!
