Budget Season

Well, it's that time again - Budget Season in Meadows Place - and we are right in the middle of it. Making decisions about priorities is part of the give-and-take that drives our annual budget-making process . This process involves your Mayor, City Council, Department Heads and staff who sit down in budget meetings to review anticipated revenues and expenses needed to maintain and grow our city. Meadows Place doesn't have a huge budget, but it is more than size that makes the city budget critical. The budget determines our tax rate and allocating the funds tells us how much we can spend on programs and services like water, sewer, streets, sidewalks, parks and police protection. It has long been Meadows Place practice to be financially responsible, budget conservatively, and do our best to be good stewards of your money. There is never enough money to do it all, so the budget reflects the priorities of your elected representatives - which hopefully mirror your desires for our great little city. Budget Season is tough, and sometimes we struggle, but in the end, we will meet the needs of our residents and keep the city financially secure.

Meadows Community Development Program

In a recent City Council Meeting, the wheels were set in motion to launch the new Meadows Place Community Development Program. This is a voluntary program which allows the city to purchase substandard homes that are in disrepair, makes repairs and improvements, then resell the homes to ensure they are not a blight on the city. This is a unique program that protects and pushes up property values then puts families into houses that once stood empty. This program is the result of a Meadows Place Economic Development Corporation (EDC) brainstorming session and a long series of legal deliberations. It is controlled and managed by committees made up of EDC members, residents, and professionals. The funding is by the EDC. The committees meet later this month to review the process and select some homes that qualify for the program. Again, this is a voluntary program which may be an offer of last resort for some homeowners. The deadline may have been July 31st, but you can still contact me at City Hall to register your property and schedule your inspection.

When you block the sidewalk, you force a child out into the street. I know that some homes have short driveways and it may be physically impossible to comply, and that there are other issued involved, but please do your best for our children.

Meadows Place Police Department's Vacation Crime Prevention Tips

Summer is a time of year that many families go on vacation. Being on vacation can lead to crime victimization if appropriate crime prevention measures are not followed. Most families do not think about being victimized while on vacation because of all the excitement of going on vacation. The following crime prevention tips are designed to allow the vacationer to enjoy a safe and secure trip and to return to a secure residence.

Before Leaving...Secure Your Residence

- Make sure all the locks on the doors and windows function properly and use them.
- Make sure your residence looks lived in and not empty.
- Leave the shades and blinds on doors and windows in a position that you would normally have them.
- Ask several neighbors to keep an eye on your residence while you are away. Leave your vacation address and telephone number with the neighbors so you can be reached in an emergency.
- Make sure your smoke and burglar alarms are functioning properly and armed.
- Arrange for a neighbor to pick up your deliveries: mail, newspaper, and any other packages.
- Arrange for someone to maintain your yard so your home appears occupied.
- Have someone place your garbage cans at the curb for normal pickup and put them away after the pickup has been made.
- Make sure you have timers for lights, television, or radios so they turn on and off at the appropriate times.
- Turn the ringer on the telephone down low or off. A possible intruder will not be alerted to your absence by a ringing telephone. If you can, forward your calls to your cellular phone or a trusted individual.
- Leave a normal message on your answering machine; do not announce your absence on the answering machine.
- Ask a neighbor to park in your driveway while you are

gone so it will appear that someone is home. If you leave your car at home, park as you normally would.

- Consider taking valuables that you cannot live without to a safety deposit box.
- Contact Meadows Place Police Department for a vacation watch.

On The Road

- Try not to carry large amounts of cash; use traveler's checks. If you must carry large sums of money do not openly display it.
- Do not carry more credit cards than you will need. Keep a list of all traveler's check numbers and credit card numbers in a safe place. Have telephone numbers to call if either are lost or stolen.
- Never advertise your plans to strangers; this includes travel routes and the amount of cash you are carrying.
- Do not stop for hitchhikers or stranded motorists. If you want to help, call for assistance for them.
- If you suspect that someone is following you, drive to the nearest well-populated place and call 911 or use your cellular phone for emergency assistance.
- Do not leave any tickets (airline, train, bus) in open view. They are as valuable as cash.
- Males are advised to carry wallets in an inside pocket or the front pocket of their pants. Females should carry their purses under their arm with a firm grasp.

Car Security

- Always lock your vehicle after entering or leaving it.
- Park in well-lighted areas.
- Check the backseat before entering your vehicle.
- Always place valuables out of sight, preferably in the trunk. Do not leave wallets, checkbooks, or purses in your vehicle.
- Try not to advertise that you are a tourist.





- Only residents of Meadows Place may purchase a card.
- A driver's license and/or water bill verifying Meadows Place residency must be shown to purchase the access card.
- Access cards are \$50 per card, maximum 2 cards per family.
- Cards are valid through May; Old cards will be deactivated at the end of May.
- All tennis players must have access card with them while on the courts.
- A maximum of three (3) guests allowed per card and all guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- Do not prop open the gate at any time or allow access to the courts to anyone without a Tennis Court access card.

Failure to comply with all rules posted at the Tennis Courts and on the Registration Card may result in forfeiture of Access Cards.



Pool Access System

Residents may purchase new Pool wristbands ONLY at the pool during normal pool operating hours.

- Only adult residents of Meadows Place may purchase seasonal wrist bands; a registration card must be completed.
- A Driver's License and/or Meadows Place water bill verifying Meadows Place residency must be shown to purchase wristbands.
- Wristbands are \$5 per band, one wristband required for each family member. No refunds. There is a \$5 replacement fee for lost wristbands.
- Residents must have wristbands with them to enter pool.
- A maximum of one (1) guest allowed per band; all guests must be accompanied by resident.
- Wristbands are valid for one Summer season only, May through September.
- Non-residents may purchase a day pass for \$5, good only on the date of purchase.
- · Pool Rules posted and on registration card MUST be followed at all times.




THE SUMMER HEAT CONTINUES, BUT IT'S COOL AT THE POOL!
