Addressing Citizen Concerns

As your Mayor, I am always at your service, especially when presented with a residents concern or problem. Sometimes however, the concern is city wide and must be addressed as such. In the past months, two such citywide concerns have been brought forth. They are reoccurring electrical

outages and mosquitos. Both are being addressed.

Electrical Concerns: After recent storm related outages, I asked our CenterPoint representative for a report and summary of power in Meadows Place. I received the following report and am very encouraged.

Mayor,

I appreciate the concern that you and your residents have regarding both power outages and restoration times. Meadows Place has 5 different overhead circuits that feed the distribution system. These circuits are robust and provide the flexibility to move load from one circuit to another should some fault occur. CenterPoint Energy's standard distribution is overhead. However, the developers/builders in Meadows Place requested underground distribution.

The majority of service challenges in Meadows Place is the underground distribution systems. Faults on underground are more difficult to identify and have more extended repair times. These challenges have been magnified this year with the number of severe rain events that have occurred. High water impacted both the access to the system as well as repairs. CenterPoint Energy has recognized those challenges and began to aggressively address those challenges the last several years with the Cable Assessment Plan. This plan proactively tests the various sections (loops) for weaknesses, both in the cable itself as well as transformers.

Over 15 loops have been or are in the process of being tested at an approximate cost of \$500,000. This cost does not include and repairs or replacement identified in the testing process. Those cost can reach over \$100,000 per loop depending on the extent of repairs/replacement. CenterPoint Energy will continue to look at opportunities to provide our customers with quality electric service commensurate with prudent operating practices and we appreciate the opportunity to address these concerns.

Mr. Robinson assures me that we will see continued progress, improvements and upgrades on the electrical systems within our city.

Mosquitos:-The huge growth in Fort Bend County has made it more difficult to deal with "nuisance" mosquito calls. Meadows Place understands and has full confidence in the County to respond to potential health threats, but that doesn't help us when those pesky critters invade. To that end, Public Works Director Danny Segundo, with Council approval, began the difficult process of getting the necessary equipment and certifications to allow Meadows Place to spray for mosquitos on its own. We should be equipped and certified by the end of January. More later.

Cell Phone Driving Hazards

The U.S. is a nation comprised of high-speed multi-taskers; but multi-tasking while you are driving?

Automobiles and cell phones do not mix. Driving while talking on a cell phone reduces a driver's response time to the same levels observed in drunk drivers. Often drivers that simply involve themselves in a conversation suffer debilitating distractions.

General Tips for Driving Safer with Cell Phones

- Abstain from talking on a cell phone while you are actively driving.
- If you need to answer a call or make one, try to pull off the road into a safe parking area.
- Make sure your phone is within easy reach, not in the glove compartment or a purse where you might have to dig for it.
- Use a hand's free device like a Bluetooth headset or earpiece that allows you to talk while both hands remain on the wheel. (Caution: evidence suggests that drivers simply involve themselves in a conversation suffer debilitating distractions. Hands-free phones may even lead drivers to believe they are safer, argue some safety advocates. Complex business transactions and emotionally involved conversations reduce driver reaction times and steal away attention. on the part of all drivers)
- Hands-free or not, postpone conversations that are either emotional or complex.
- Prior to getting on the road, practice driving while using your hands-free device in an open parking lot so you know how to use it properly without fumbling.
- Do not send a text message, IM or try to read incoming messages while driving.
- Shop for the latest models of phones that feature voiceactivated dialing and speed dialing.
- Use your cell phone only in the event of an emergency in which you need help or someone else needs help.



Winter Weather

Bring on our cooler weather, and say goodbye to the mosquitos!

There are several things that can and need to be accomplished this time of year to help

protect our homes from winter, and prepare for Spring.

Lawn and Garden -Trim any trees that could come in contact with your house during heavy wind gusts, or that could break off and cause damage. Please also note that because the leaves are falling, it will be easier to trim our trees from over the street (no lower than 16') and sidewalks (no lower than 10').

Protect Pipes and Faucets - Water supplies to outside faucets, ponds, waterfalls, etc. should be shut off and drained before the temperature drops to below freezing. Any water pipes that are directly exposed to the cold should be insulated to protect them from freezing.

Check and clean your Heating System -It is critical that you ensure that you properly maintain your equipment. Start by having your heating system tuned up by a qualified technician if required. The last thing you need is to have your system breakdown in the middle of a cold spell.

Clean that fireplace. Now is the perfect time for a professional cleaning - it makes fires cleaner and safer.

Only Rain, Down the Drain

Storm water runoff from urban areas can carry pollutants and trash into the storm water drainage system. Water that flows down the drains in our homes first goes to sewage treatment facilities before it's released to

bayous and rivers. But, water that flows into our storm water drainage system, along with other substances it collects, goes directly into our bayous, rivers, and ultimately into Galveston Bay. Unlike sewage, storm water receives no treatment.

The City of Meadows Place is installing inlet markers bearing the phrase "only rain down the drain". The message is intended to remind citizens to not to dump pollutants into storm sewers or contribute to ordinary storm water runoff by littering, overfertilizing, or sweeping yard debris into the street.



Much of the pollution in area creeks and bayous comes from common, every-day materials, like household chemicals, fertilizers, pesticides, gasoline, used motor oil and antifreeze and litter. These substances run off into storm drain inlets by rainwater from our streets, yards, driveways and parking lots.
