#### New City Secretary

#### Aldi One Step Closer to putting store in Meadows Place

At the January City Council Meeting, your City Council passed Ordinance 2016-06 which contained the provisions needed to accommodate the construction of an Aldi grocery store right here in Meadows Place. Bob Graf, of our EDC, and I confirmed the approval of the Meadows Place site with Mike Lucido, the Director of Real Estate for Aldi. For those unfamiliar with Aldi, it was recognized as the nation's low-price grocery leader for the fourth year in a row and consumers ranked ALDI ahead of competitors such as Costco and Trader Joe's and Consumers also named ALDI one of the top three favorite grocery store chains in America.

Besides being free of artificial growth hormones, Alidi's milk prices will benefit both the young family with children and senior citizens on a budget. This small forward thinking store should be a perfect a perfect fit for our small forward thinking city. If all goes well, we should see construction start this summer.

We will keep you informed on the progress. The arrival of Aldi will be one more step in keeping Meadows Place, *Your* Place for *Life*.

#### Sex Offender Restriction Lawsuit

I would like to thank everyone who attended the Special Meeting on January 20th. We had a full house, and for that I am thankful as well. For those not at the meeting, Meadows Place is one of several General Law cities in Texas being sued because we have an ordinance establishing Safe Zones and restricting sex offenders from living 2,000 feet from schools, playgrounds, pools, parks, etc. Your Council and your Police Chief were ready to stand and fight for our right to protect ourselves via ordinance, but I felt I had to let you know there is a cost associated with it, and no guarantees. The public was allowed to speak, ask questions and give input. Through that questioning, we found the Chief had effectively used our ordinance to keep Sex Offenders out of the city on more than one occasion. Then, before Council retreated into Executive Session to deliberate our legal positions and discuss strategy, your Mayor and Council received 100% Unanimous Support to let our legal counsel pick up the gauntlet and fight. That is where we stand at this time. It is very intense but rest assured, we clearly heard our marching orders and will be doing everything we can to protect our city, especially our children, and fight for the right of Meadows Place to protect itself from sexual predators just like the larger cities can. #### **IRS Scams**

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to remind everyone it is Tax Season again and the Scammers are out there. Here are some tips from the IRS. If you suspect you may have been a victim, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department or

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard against scam phone calls from thieves intent on stealing their money or their identity. Criminals pose as the IRS to trick victims out of their money or personal information. Here are several tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

IRS (800-366-4484) to report suspicious activity.

• Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls," or via phishing email.

• **Callers try to scare their victims.** Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they do not get the money.

• Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.

• **Cons try new tricks all the time.** Some schemes provide an actual IRS address where they tell the victim to mail a receipt for the payment they make. Others use emails that contain a fake IRS document with a phone number or an email address for a reply. These scams often use official IRS letterhead in emails or regular mail that they send to their victims. They try these ploys to make the ruse look official.

#### The IRS will not:

• Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.

• Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.

• Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.

• Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

• Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying. *If you don't owe taxes*, or have no reason to think that you do: Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately.

#### Before you buy a product...

- Think about the job at hand.
- Research the type of product(s) you need to effectively perform the job.
- Read product labels carefully.
- Choose the product that is best for the job.
- Consider purchasing environmentally safe products or make your own less toxic alternative product.

#### Before you use a product...

- Read the label and follow the directions for proper use.
- Follow all safety precautions. (Wear recommended gloves and safety glasses)
- Use the recommended amount more is not always better!

#### After you use a product...


- Read the label and follow directions for proper storage.
- Keep lid tightly closed.
- Keep product in original container with readable labels.

#### If you must dispose of a product...

- Follow the label directions if provided.
- Contact the manufacturer if no directions are provided.
- Take your HHW to a local HHW collection event or facility for proper disposal.

**Mailbox Month** 

March is MAILBOX MONTH here in the City of Meadows Place! This March is the 6th anniversary of this event for our City. Mailbox Month is the time we take a look at the first impression of your

home & see what needs to be repaired or replaced, and will result in a **\$10 discount** on your water bill!

Mailboxes are typically constructed to last about 10 years, depending on the materials used, and the USPS states that it is the homeowner's responsibility to maintain and replace worn or damaged mailboxes. If it has been quite a while since you have replaced yours, take an objective look at it.


**HOW TO PARTICIPATE:** Through the month of March; mail, place in the Utilities Billing Box or e-mail (code-enforcement@cityofmeadowsplace.org) a "before" and "after" photo of your newly rejuvenated or replaced mailbox to City Hall. **Each participating residence will receive a \$10 discount off of their utility bill!** 

A quick and easy upgrade is to ensure that your address is prominently displayed!

Some mailboxes only need fresh paint or minor maintenance like rust removal, up-righting the post, etc., while others may need to be replaced altogether. Hardware stores like Lowes, Home Depot, and Court's Hardware sell reasonably priced replacements, and with a modest amount of effort you will have a fresh new look!

#### **CURBSIDE MAILBOX STANDARDS:**

- The bottom of the mailbox should be located between 41 45 inches in height from the surface of the curb.
- The name and address on your mailbox should be at least 1 inch letters/numbers.
- The front of your mailbox door should be located 6 8 inches from the front face of the curb.



Please contact our local post office if you are considering moving the location of your mailbox.

I would like to thank you in advance, and I am anxious to see just how many of us take advantage and make our beautiful city just a little brighter!






