

Meadows Place to get Ambulance

The first order of business is to thank Fort Bend County Health and Human Services Director Dr. M. desVignes-Kendrick, MD, MPH and new Director of Fort Bend Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Graig Temple, who had to hit the ground running to find the best overall EMS solution. After months of discussions, fact checking, and meetings, Fort Bend County has agreed to terms with the City of Meadows Place and will place a fully equipped, staffed, transport capable, intensive care unit (aka Ambulance) in Meadows Place. This is fantastic news as not many 1 sq. mile cities have their own Police Department, Fire Station and house an EMS crew too. Locating an ambulance in Meadows Place is part of a recent re-evaluation of County EMS assets designed to meet both current and future needs of Fort Bend County. We held frank, open conversations about our desires for the residents of Meadows Place, Fort Bend County and Stafford. We also need to thank our County Judge Bob Hebert, our County Commissioners and the City of Stafford. This could not have been done without the efforts of Mayor Leonard Scarcella and Fire Chief Larry DiCamillo, who worked so hard to document how coverage affected response times. Our location helped of course, but so did our Meadows Place Economic Development Corporation which voted unanimously to financially support this project with the anticipated expenses in securing a housing site for the EMS staff. This was an arduous, often tense, time consuming process but once again, Meadows Place, cooperating with our neighbors for the betterment of all, shows why we are... **Your Place for Life!**



Meadows Place Police Department's Vacation Crime Prevention Tips

Summer is fast approaching; it is a great time for family trips and vacations. Being on vacation can lead to crime victimization if appropriate crime prevention measures are not followed. Most families do not think about being victimized while on vacation because of all the excitement of going on vacation. The following crime prevention tips are designed to allow the vacationer to enjoy a safe and secure trip and to return to a secure residence.

Before Leaving...Secure Your Residence

- Make sure all the locks on the doors and windows function properly and use them.
- Make sure your residence looks lived in and not empty.
- Leave the shades and blinds on doors and windows in a position that you would normally have them.
- Ask several neighbors to keep an eye on your residence while you are away. Leave your vacation address and telephone number with the neighbors so you can be reached in an emergency.
- Make sure your smoke and burglar alarms are functioning properly and armed.
- Arrange for a neighbor to pick up your deliveries: mail, newspaper, and any other packages.
- Arrange for someone to maintain your yard so your home appears occupied.
- Have someone place your garbage cans at the curb for normal pickup and put them away after the pickup has been made.
- Make sure you have timers for lights, television, or radios so they turn on and off at the appropriate times.
- Turn the ringer on the telephone down low or off. A possible intruder will not be alerted to your absence by a ringing telephone. If you can, forward your calls to your cellular phone or a trusted individual.
- Leave a normal message on your answering machine; do not announce your absence on the answering machine.
- Ask a neighbor to park in your driveway while you are

gone so it will appear that someone is home. If you leave your car at home, park as you normally would.

- Consider taking valuables that you cannot live without to a safety deposit box.
- Contact Meadows Place Police Department for a vacation watch.

On The Road

- Try not to carry large amounts of cash; use traveler's checks. If you must carry large sums of money do not openly display it.
- Do not carry more credit cards than you will need. Keep a list of all traveler's check numbers and credit card numbers in a safe place. Have telephone numbers to call if either are lost or stolen.
- Never advertise your plans to strangers; this includes travel routes and the amount of cash you are carrying.
- Do not stop for hitchhikers or stranded motorists. If you want to help, call for assistance for them.
- If you suspect that someone is following you, drive to the nearest well-populated place and call 911 or use your cellular phone for emergency assistance.
- Do not leave any tickets (airline, train, bus) in open view. They are as valuable as cash.
- Males are advised to carry wallets in an inside pocket or the front pocket of their pants. Females should carry their purses under their arm with a firm grasp.

Car Security

- Always lock your vehicle after entering or leaving it.
- Park in well-lighted areas.
- Check the backseat before entering your vehicle.
- Always place valuables out of sight, preferably in the trunk. Do not leave wallets, checkbooks, or purses in your vehicle.
- Try not to advertise that you are a tourist.

In To Each Life, Some Rain Must Fall:

April Showers may have brought May flowers, but it also brought us Low hanging Tree limbs.

To give you an idea just how much rain, the total for Jan-April 2014 was 7.71 inches. The same time period of this year, we received 19.94 inches. That's 12.23 inches over! Our trees are loving it and GROWING! The problem is that now the limbs are well below our ordinance height of 16' over the street, and 10' over sidewalks.

Trees are a valuable asset to properties and the environment. In many parts of the city, tree canopy provides shade and significantly reduces utility bills. Mature healthy trees can increase a property's value by as much as 25 percent.

Trees must be properly maintained and pruned for the health of the tree as well as for public safety. The City's tree trimming ordinance was put in place to ensure that large vehicles such as fire trucks, school buses, ambulances, and garbage trucks are able to navigate and operate safely, and to allow pedestrians to walk on the sidewalks without veering out into the roadway to avoid limbs.

Overhanging tree limbs can delay emergency vehicles when seconds make the difference between life and death. Clearance is essential for the visibility of traffic signs and signals. Trees should be trimmed with pruning shears, not fire trucks that can cause irreversible damage to trees and trucks.

It is best to hire a professional arborist if tree limbs are large or cannot be safely reached, if pruning involves the use of power equipment, or if pruning is needed near power lines.



Sources of Drinking Water

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the EPAs Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791.

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm water runoff, and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff, and septic systems.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

Contaminants may be found in drinking water that may cause taste, color, or odor problems. These types of problems are not necessarily causes for health concerns. For more information on taste, odor, or color of drinking water, please contact the system's business office.

You may be more vulnerable than the general population to certain microbial contaminants, such as Cryptosporidium, in drinking water. Infants, some elderly, or immunocompromised persons such as those undergoing chemotherapy for cancer; persons who have undergone organ transplants; those who are undergoing treatment with steroids; and people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, can be particularly at risk from infections. You should seek advice about drinking water from your physician or health care providers. Additional guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. We are responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but we cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. 

- Access cards are \$50 per card, maximum 2 cards per family.
- Cards are valid through May; old cards will be deactivated at the end of May.
- All tennis players must have access card with them while on the courts.
- A maximum of three (3) guests allowed per card and all guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- Do not prop open the gate at any time or allow access to the courts to anyone without a Tennis Court access card.
