2016 City Elections

Since all open seats were uncontested the election is closed and all incumbent members will be sworn in for two more years. Zero Tolerance Policy

Unfortunately the number of citizen complaints the city, and Code Enforcement has been receiving about trash cans being stored outside in plain sight has been growing. This has become a problem and our Code Enforcement is spending way too much time on this issue. He has many, much more important duties than to track down complaints about trash cans. So, effective March 1st, There is a ZERO TOLERANCE policy in effect for trash cans & recycle bins left out or stored in public view. No warnings will be issued for those in violation, only citations. The Meadows Place Police Department receives many calls in reference to person(s) going door to door for various reasons (soliciting/

peddling). The police department makes every effort to actively monitor all soliciting activities in the city. A permit is required to solicit in the city in most cases; the exception being religious or non-profit organizations.

The Meadows Place Police Department encourages the community to contact us whenever someone appears to be soliciting. If they have a permit or proper documentation this is great, all too often this is not the case. Too many times they are not in compliance or are here with a criminal intent. Many times the police department has encountered individuals soliciting with the intent to commit theft, fraud, or burglary.

The Meadows Place Police have had several incidents and arrest as a result of solicitor calls. The "Knock Knock Burglaries" where a person(s) knocks on the door of a residence. If someone comes to the door they claim to be selling some magic potion or looking for someone who does not live there. If no one comes to the door they kick in the door, burglarizing the residence. Another variation is to offer to sell a product or service, taking payment in advance and never delivering the goods or service. This can be even more complicated than simply taking cash or check. Often times the perpetrator collects personal information leading to identity theft or credit card abuse. The police department has made many arrest from solicitor calls as a result of the officer's investigation and determining the solicitor is a wanted person. Many times having outstanding warrants for crimes previously described in solicitor contacts. It is important for the police to be aware of solicitors or peddlers, always call.

The Meadows Place Police Department takes great pride in maintaining a safe community that residents consider "Your Place for Life". Please contact the police department whenever someone is seen engaging in such activity.





Infrastructure Update

The City of Meadows Place takes an active role in addressing ponding issues reported by its residents. The city has spent approximately \$18,700 addressing ponding issues in Meadows Place this fiscal year. The City worked with Concrete Raising Corporation who used a method called mud jacking for the repairs. This is a method where they drill a series of 2" holes through the pavement and use a concrete slurry (Mud) and pump the mud through

the holes and this raises the pavement. Thus allowing water to drain to the nearest downstream inlet. Mud pumping projects are normally complete in one day and the roadway is back open for business with less inconvenience for our residents. In the spring the City will address sidewalks (trip hazards) and handicap ramps. Code Enforcement

YEAH MARCH!

It is warming up, God Bless Texas weather! Now the problems set in...Mold on our homes, grass and weeds getting out of control..... Literally, a few minutes of work on the weekend can save you a load of

trouble later in the coming months. (I will be out providing friendly reminders to the residents of homes that are starting to show mold, rotten siding, fascia and fences....I suspect that I will be busy, as there are a lot of homes here that need this attention.)

There are a few things to remind everyone about:

- 1. March is Mailbox Month. Mail/E-Mail/Deliver, before and after pics of your remodeled mailbox to me or City Hall and receive \$10 off your utility bill.
- 2. Our Code of Ordinances requires that your address be visible in 4" contrasting letters/number, visible to the street side of your residence. Placing the numbers on your home, mailbox or curb improves the ability of our Police and First Responders to find YOUR home in the case of an emergency. (See #1 above for a great idea!)

There is a **ZERO TOLERANCE** policy in effect for trash cans / recycle bins left out at the street or stored in public view. Please help your neighbors out if they are not home or out of town. Beginning March 1st, there will no longer be warnings issued for trashcans or recycle bins left either at the curb after trash day, or stored in public view.

Speaking of Zero Tolerance, a question arose concerning

the flow from receiving a warning to then getting a citation. The resident thought that I had to give at least 10 days from the warning until they received a citation. Even though I try to give warnings when possible, I am not required to do so. I can, and have, issued citations for Code Violations WITHOUT issuing written warnings, so long as there are at least 10 days in between the receipt of the citation and the court appearance date.
