Emergency Response

The recent flood event put Meadows Place Disaster Preparedness to the test. We did well, and we learned a lot - about where we are and where we want to be to provide the best emergency response coverage possible. Meadows Place Police Department was prepared and performed extremely well. They staged the vehicles on high ground, had staff in place and a Hummer at the ready. Ironically, we had one of the Hummers in the shop looking to get snorkels installed preparing for maximum flood events! The Hummer we had performed well as both our PD and Fire Departments participated in High Water rescues. Fire, EMS and Police were in Emergency mode. All are well trained but responding to emergency situations only so please, do not call them unless it is an emergency, but if it is, call right away.

I was very proud of our Public Works Department who are vital in these situations. They cleared drains, kept the lift station and sewage treatment plants running flawlessly and made sure our water supplies were clean and safe. As soon as the water began to recede they were out on the street clearing debris, helping folks and taking care of us and our city. Say thanks to Danny and Eric. After all, they left their families to come look after ours.

We learned we really do need the new Tactical Training Center / Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

In emergencies it will house our EOC which will make communications between us, the County and others easier and make coordinated efforts seamless. The new TTC / EOC will have generator backup so loss of power will not put us out of business. Hopefully we won't need it but it is our job to be prepared, and we will be.

Part of our Emergency Response efforts include calls via the CodeRed Emergency Notification System. If you are not signed up to receive these calls, please go to the website and sign up. We will use CodeRed, the official city Facebook page and the marquee by the pool as our primary tools to get messages out to you. Chief Stewart and Danny Segundo are updating our Emergency Response plan and will incorporate the lessons learned last month. Again, I hope we never have to use them, but....just in case... we will do our best to be prepared.

Economic Development

Meadows Place is working to get remaining commercial properties developed. We have managed to increase interest but, other than Aldi, have not yet secured another Class 1 project for the city. That doesn't mean we are not trying. As Mayor, I am working with our Economic Development Corporation to increase awareness of our city and share the wonderful things we have to offer with developers and property owners. Meadows Place messages on the Sterling McCall sign is a part of the awareness efforts that is underway. EDC Member, Bob Graf, who brought us Aldi, has met with the American Turkish Business Council and others to bring high end development to Meadows Place. EDC member Kurt Kopczynski, who recently joined the Fort Bend Chamber of Commerce, will be actively promoting the city. Another EDC member, Clyde Little, is contacting companies displaced by construction in places like Bellaire to talk to them about moving to Meadows Place. Who knows what these efforts will lead to but we are all working hard to make sure Meadows Place will always be... Your Place for Life.

Danger: Kids Left in Hot Cars

heartbreaking preventable deaths happen when children are left alone in hot cars. More than 600 U.S.

children have died that way since 1990, according to the nonprofit safety group Kids and Cars.

These cases happen when kids are left unattended in a hot car -- sometimes because the driver forgot the child was there -- or when kids get into unlocked cars without any adult knowing it happened. Within minutes, they can be in danger.

Kids in Hot Cars

- Never leave kids alone in a hot car, even briefly.
- Always check the front and back seats of the car before you lock it and leave.
- If you see a kid alone in a hot car call 911 immediately. Get them out ASAP if they are in distress.
- Put your purse, briefcase, or something else you need by the car seat so you don't forget to check.
- Always lock your car when it's empty so kids can't get in without you knowing.

Don't be a Victim - Do your homework

How often do you hear of someone being ripped off by a contractor? Unfortunately, it happens all too often, thus giving reputable and legitimate contractors a bad name. While the majority of contractors may be trustworthy, there are others who are unscrupulous and unreliable. Some will fix items that don't need fixing, or grossly overcharge you for services or parts.

Worse, there are plenty of con artists posing as tradesmen who will simply take your money and run.

Take time to do your homework and select a trustworthy contractor to do the job. As the spring home improvement season approaches, look out for these "red flags" which can indicate a contractor may be unscrupulous. Beware if the contractor:

Drives an unmarked van with out-of-state license plates: Be suspicious of anyone who simply shows up and operates in nondescript vehicles with no business markings.

Offers a special price if you sign today, or wants the money upfront or only in cash: A good contractor will never want CASH or the entire payment up front. There is usually a reasonable down payment and payments are in progression based on the construction schedule. It's practice for a contractor to ask for 1/3 of the total cost up front to cover purchasing material.

Has no references: Get at least 3 references from other customers. Ask to talk to the contractor's last three customers, not his favorites. This ensures that the contractor is consistent in quality. If he refuses to get you past customer references, that should be a sign that there will be a problem.

Does not provide written estimates or contracts: Never trust a contractor who doesn't require a written contract. Never sign a blank contract or one with holes in it. If something goes wrong, you have no legal recourse because nothing was in writing. Get a contract that spells out cost of materials, labor, an outline of the project, and other important work details. If there are changes along the way add detailed "change orders" signed by all parties.

Is not licensed: Always ask a contractor to see their licensing credentials, then verify this information with the local building inspector's office. Look up the contractor's Better Business Bureau rating. Even if your state doesn't require licenses for certain projects, your contractor should still be insured. Call their insurance carrier and make sure their policy is current and can cover your project.

Does not look professional and does not have business cards or letterhead on invoices: Get a business card. Call the number on the card and make sure he picks up. (Some numbers are voicemail services that can't be traced.) Call the Better Business Bureau, go on Yelp and see if there are any complaints about him.

If you hire a contractor, you're trusting this person to come into your home and change the most expensive thing you own. So take the necessary precautions to avoid becoming a victim.

§ 90.04 RUNNING AT LARGE PROHIBITED

I have received several requests to remind neighbors of our leash law.

Our Code requires that if your dog is off your property, it MUST be on a leash. The ONLY other place that you may let you dog off leash is in the Dog Park on Dorrance Ln. NOT by the lake. NOT in McDonald Park. NOWHERE in the city except on your property, and even then, you MUST be in complete control of your pet. If for some reason your dog wanders into your neighbor's yard, into the street, even if you are outside with them, you are in violation.

Warnings –vs- Citations:

If you receive a warning for any code violation, it does not mean that you will be getting a citation. It simply means that there is an issue that needs your immediate attention. However, if you ignore it, or make no effort to communicate with the City to resolve the issue, a citation WILL be issued.

I also wish to offer a heartfelt **Thank You** to those citizens that have taken the time and effort to clean, repaint or just generally spruce up their homes and OUR CITY!

REMINDER: Zero Tolerance for trash cans left at the curb after trash day or stored in public view is still in effect. Warnings are no longer being issued for these violations.
