Kirkwood Revitalization and Beautification Project

City Council is hoping to receive the results of an HGAC funded study evaluating several different design options for the Kirkwood project at the September City Council Meeting. If received as anticipated, this study, which analyzed multiple options and cost just under \$50,000 dollars, will be presented to the

community at a special Public Meeting at City Hall - possibly in early October. Once the city has received the study and set the date, the date and times will be announced on the website, marquee, Facebook, as well as in the newsletter. All Meadows Place residents are invited of course. This is the Kirkwood portion of the Fort Bend Mobility Bond Project that paid for most of the W. Airport reconstruction and will pay almost all of the construction and upgrade costs for Kirkwood.

The September City Council Meeting will be held on September 15th instead of the 23rd as several members of Council will be in San Antonio attending the Texas Municipal League Annual Conference. This is an important meeting as Council will be voting on our budget and tax rate. Hope to see you there. Mark it down- September 15th.

On Saturday, August 22nd, the same day as Kid Fish, all three committees responsible for action and oversight of our Meadows Place Community Development Program met at a workshop in City Hall. This is a voluntary program which allows the city to purchase substandard homes that are abandoned or in disrepair, renovate and make improvements, then resell the homes to ensure they are not a blight on the city or a bother to their neighbors. You will be hearing more about the program as these committee members spring into action to get the program rolling before the end of the year. There are three committees: the Selection Committee, the Evaluation Committee, and the Construction Administration and Oversight Committee. In addition to the Mayor, the committee members include EDC members Harry Hamilton and Kurt Kopczynski, Meadows Place residents Lisa Kulhanek and Joe DeBruyn, Code Enforcement Official Jerry Parker, Henry Rivas our City Building Official, Walter Gerlach of Gerlach Inspections and professional appraiser, Ken Meiselman. A fter a long day at work or at the ball field, there may be a time when you arrive home to find that you have no water or low water pressure. You may even have the experience of having a backed up sewer one day. We all dread these days and days like these can cause a lot of stress for anyone. However, I do recommend the following steps when these types of events do occur. First, verify that the issue is a household issue. If you have low water pressure in your bathroom, check and see if you have low water pressure in the kitchen. The same for a backed up sink or sewer, make sure the issue is throughout your home. Second, if one of these issues should arise during the week you can always call city hall between the hours of 9 AM to 4 PM at 281-983-2950 and a

work order will be created and sent to USW Utility Group. If it is after hours or on the weekend, call USW Utility Group at 832-756-2143 (new City service provider). A representative of USW Utility Group will come out and investigate your complaint. It may also be a good idea to have USW Utility Group investigate a possible backed up sewer first before calling a plumber. This will allow USW Utility Group to check the City's manholes and sewer lines first to verify if there is an issue with the city's main sewer line. USW Utility Group should provide you with a status update verifying if the issue is private (a resident issue, you may need to call someone out) or if it's a city issue USW Utility Group will make the necessary repairs to restore service.

The large amount of fish attracts the water fowl that frequent our lake.
