Police Department receives Tactical Training Grant

Chief Baker is pleased to announce Meadows Place Police Department is the recipient of a grant which will allow our PD to purchase and install a tactical firearms training system from LASERSHOT, one of the world leaders in simulated firearms training

solutions for military and law enforcement professionals. Their systems are currently used by the FBI, FLETC, U.S. Department of Homeland Security and many other uniformed services worldwide. An added benefit to our Police Department is that LaserShot is located five minutes away in Stafford which greatly expands the opportunities for collaborative efforts to personalize the training processes which will benefit both LaserShot and Meadows Place PD for years to come. The basics of this very futuristic training system will help our officers:

- Train, develop and improve tactical decision and judgmental skills.
- Improve target acquisition and engagement.
- Train with realistic simulated recoil weapons or duty weapons outfitted with laser inserts and/or drop-in recoil conversion kits to simulate real weapon response.
- Built-in after-action review for a detailed review of each shot fired during the training session, which is available in multiple settings.

LaserShot's patented Lead Indicator technology will enable our officers to learn exact leads for engaging moving targets at various speeds, distances, and directions. In addition, LaserShot provides a full compliment of innovative marksmanship and tactical training courseware options which, once set up, can be utilized as part of our Tactical Weapon Simulator and Classroom Trainer.

The current plans are to convert and use the front end of the Kirkwood Annex for our Tactical Training Center. To say our officers are excited would be an understatement.

This is something our PD has been working toward for several years but looked unobtainable until the grant was secured. The grant process is extremely competitive so in addition to Chief Baker, we need to thank Captain Gary Stewart and Corporal Jerry Brownlee who made countless trips to LaserShot, put the grant package together and then went down and testified before the Grant Selection Committee. Great job gentlemen, thank you for your efforts. This system is getting rave reviews around the world so securing this grant thrusts Meadows Place PD to the forefront of training options provided for our officers.

We will keep you informed as we move forward and plan to have an 'Open House' where you can see the system in action - and you WILL want to come see it. You may even be able to try it yourself! See you there.

Workshops

The City of Meadows Place always tries to respond to questions, requests and concerns of our citizens. These may have a quick response and a simple solution – like spraying when the mosquitoes get bad – or providing information when someone has a question. However, larger, more complicated issues may require Council discussion, which take place in meetings called Workshops. These Workshops provide a legal vehicle for Council to have open discussions and debate, listen to proposals, hear experts, and help determine what, if any, the next course of action should be. Sometimes these Workshops, like those pertaining to the budget, are focused on a single topic but most of the time there are a variety of items on the agenda which often require quite a bit of homework and research. Like Council meetings, notice of Workshops, and their agendas, are posted on the website and the bulletin board at City Hall. Workshops can be pretty boring sometimes but are a valuable tool for Council as they search for the practical and pragmatic steps to keep Meadows Place... Your Place for Life.

Internet Safety

Irecently attended a class to help educate children on NetSmartz Internet Safety which offers a non-threatening overview of the dangers of the internet methods for navigating the internet safely, and how children can protect themselves from internet crimes.

There are three important issues children can encounter when they access the internet on laptops, cell phones, gaming consoles, and handheld gaming devices. The following issues are:

- Cyberbullying- spreading rumors and gossip, posting inappropriate pictures of someone without consent, stealing passwords to assume someone else's identity and adding embarrassing information to their account, or threatening or harassing others with offensive language.
- Online Predators- an adult internet user who exploits vulnerable children or teens, usually for sexual or abusive purposes.
- Revealing too much- personal and private information shared through texts, images or videos may attract unwanted attention from cyberbullies or online predators.

Here is a list of a few internet safety tips for parents:

- Establish rules for internet use such as what sites they can visit, who they talk to, and how long they are allowed online.
- Keep the computer in a common room, not a child's bedroom.
- · Know with whom your children chat online.
- Discuss the importance of telling you or a trusted adult if anything ever makes your child feel scared, uncomfortable, or confused while online.
- Your child should pick an appropriate screen name and it should not include their name or date of birth.
- If your child has a Facebook account they should have the privacy settings on "friends only" and they should know all of their friends.

Fireplace Safety

We have enjoyed some really nice, cool evenings in our area lately. Fall is here, and I personally cannot wait to get the first log burning inside of my fireplace. First thing first, is safety. I want to make sure that we all have an enjoyable & safe holiday

season, so let's go over some fireplace safety tips...

PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE

- Make sure that the area surrounding your fireplace & hearth are free from combustibles or any potentially flammable materials.
- Have your chimney, firebox, inserts, or gas logs inspected annually by a professional. Seal all gaps of the insert with an approved fireplace caulk.
- Keep your roof clear of leaves, and pine needles.
 Double check that no limbs are hanging low on your roof.
- Make sure that all vents are at least 3 feet above the roof, and are properly capped. Cover the chimney vent with a screen mesh, or spark arrester.
- Follow the recommended gas log sizing guidelines to make sure that the log in use is the appropriate size for your fireplace.
- Have an operable fire extinguisher inside of your home.
- Check the smoke detectors within your home & install a carbon monoxide detector.
- If you still have small children at home, then it may be best to wait until they are able to fully understand fire safety rules before you use your fireplace.

LIGHTING THE FIRE

- Clean out ashes from previous fires.
- Use a fireplace grate
- A metal mesh screen should always be in use while you have a fire
- Never use flammable liquids to start a fire
- Keep the fires small, it will reduce the amount of smoke, and therefore the creosote buildup that can lead to a chimney fire.
- Make sure that the flue / damper is in the "open" position.
- Never burn trash, rolled newspapers, charcoal or plastic within your fireplace.
- Never leave a fire unattended.
- Do not close the damper / flue until every ember has completely stopped burning.


