April Update

A year ago we were talking about the weather holding up the revitalization of our Waste Water Treatment Plant. We have not only finished that but we have almost completed the upgrades that will allow us to produce a TCEQ approved Type 1 water to use for plant operations and for filling our new lake. As we move forward with this very "green" project, we will also begin saving money by using this water for irrigation of our parks and esplanades. We were also talking about the conversion from a Type 4A to a 4B EDC (Economic Development Council). This has been accomplished, two additional members were added (Tracey Spiller & Clyde Little) and the first joint Council / EDC workshop was held to discuss ideas for the future and pave the way for an action plan.

A year ago we were also talking about the importance of filling in our 2010 Census reports. We did a great job, best return percentage of any city in Ft. Bend County. We officially have 4660 residents. This is down a bit from the 2000 census but up from when we first incorporated. We are a very stable community. The breakdown details of who we are is still coming in. Check our website for a link to the Census Bureau.

Other update items include the progress on the West Airport Project. The engineering is now 60% complete. This is a TxDot milestone that triggers various actions. Councilman Rick Staigle has been spearheading this project for the city. His knowledge and expertise are a great asset for the city and continue to save us thousands of dollars on fees and expenses. Thank You Rick. Expect the engineering for Airport to be complete this summer when we will be able to take bids for construction. It will be nice to have Airport and Kirkwood redone so we can use our road repair budget on internal streets.

By the time this is printed, the Kickoff will have taken place. Hope you attended. What Parents Can Do About Cyberbullying

(This is the second of a 2 part message on cyberbullying)



Parents can help stop cyberbullying. You can start by talking to kids about the issue and teaching them the rules below that will help prevent cyberbullying from happening to them or someone they know.

What Kids Need to Know:

- Never give out personal information online, whether in instant message profiles, chat rooms, blogs, personal websites, or through social media sites.
- Never tell anyone but your parents your password – not even friends.
- If someone sends a mean or threatening message, don’t respond. Save it or print it out and show it to an adult.
- Never open emails from someone you don’t know or from someone you know is a bully.
- Don’t put anything online that you wouldn’t want your friends or classmates to see.
- Don’t send messages when you are angry. Before clicking “send”, ask yourself how you would feel to receive the same message from someone.
- Help kids who are bullied online by not joining in – and showing bullying messages to an adult.
- Always be as polite online as you are in person.

Since most cyberbullying takes place at home, it is important that parents know about cyberbullying - and that they get involved in preventing it. Just like parents help their kids avoid inappropriate websites, they can protect them from cyberbullying.

What Parents Can Do:

- Keep your home computer in a busy area of your house.
- Set up email, social media, and chat accounts with your children. Make sure you know their screen names and passwords – and that they don’t include any personal information in their profiles.
- Regularly go over their buddy/friend lists with them. Ask who each person is and how your children know them.
- The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children has a list of acronyms you can print and post by your computer – www.missingkids.com.
- Discuss cyberbullying with your children and ask if they have ever experienced it or seen it happen to someone.
- Assure your children that you won’t blame them if they are cyberbullied. Emphasize that you won’t take away their computer privileges – this is the main reason kids don’t tell adults when they are cyberbullied.

HOME STAGING

As homeowners, we are all impacted by our neighbor's whether the impact comes from living style, friendliness, courtesy, home maintenance, aesthetics and home value. My position as a Code Enforcement Officer is to protect your home value. What your neighbor is able to sell their home for helps to determine what your home is valued at. It is to our benefit if a home sells for a higher dollar amount.

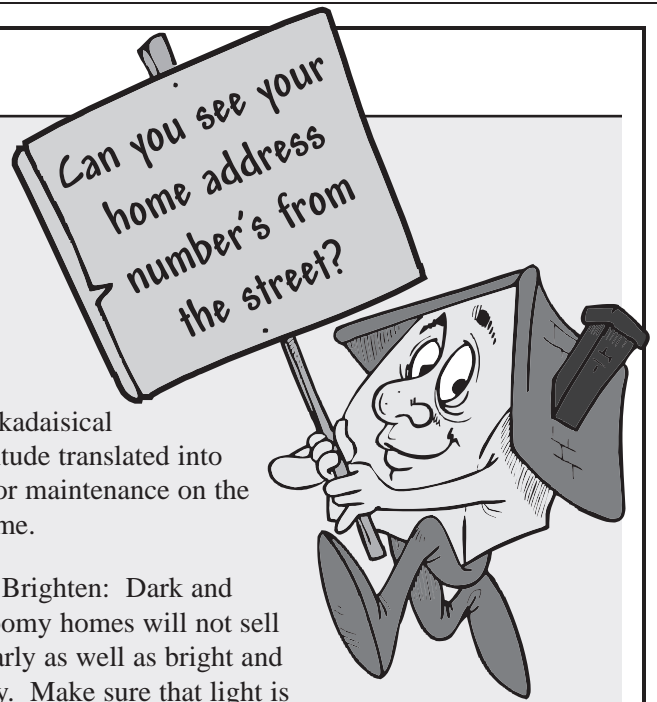
If you are in the process of selling your home, then it's possible that a realtor has mentioned the act of "Home Staging". Home Staging is the act of preparing a home for sale, and its value is definitely not something to overlook. Statistics indicate that a home that is properly staged for sale can reduce the listing time by one third to one half, and that staged homes generally sell for 10-15% above the dollar amount of a non-staged home.

When staging a home the goal is to make the home as appealing as possible to the highest number of potential buyers. The best way to look at the process (if you are the seller) is that your home is a "product".

1. Start Fresh: Making an impression starts at the curb. Make sure that the exterior of the home is pristine and to the detail of mailbox, house numbers, flower beds and porch light. Cleaning a house that you want to sell seems like a given, but you will need to go beyond vacuuming & mopping. Clean the home from top to bottom. Start with the floors, and work your way up the baseboards. Don't forget minute details; such as, vents, faucets, baseboards, windows & mirrors.

2. De-Clutter: The down-sizing seems to be the hardest for most folks. Remove any furniture that impedes the flow of traffic through the home, or oversized, and outdated furniture. If the sofa has seen better days, then a slip cover may be the answer, just make sure that it is secured neatly into place. Remove any "collections", or family photos, or taste-specific decor. Remember that you want potential buyers to be able to envision themselves living in your "product". If you don't know where to begin, then go tour a few "Model Homes" and get some ideas.

3. Enhance: Paint the walls and trim in neutral color tones, and make sure that you take the time to be neat with your work. A poorly painted house is sure to be noticed, and the potential buyer will wonder if your



lackadaisical attitude translated into poor maintenance on the home.

4. Brighten: Dark and gloomy homes will not sell nearly as well as bright and airy. Make sure that light is allowed to flow into the home, and that light fixtures are working properly and focused on the effect of making the room look larger.

5. Pets: You may be an animal lover, but the potential buyer may not. Clean up pet hair daily, and litter boxes too. Make sure that the pet is crated or removed from the property during every showing of your "product".

6. Spend a little: Don't leave replacements and upgrades to the new home owner. The simplest and least costly items will have a bigger impact than you realize. Outdated and worn items; such as, light fixtures, faucets & caulk, door & cabinet hardware, and window treatments should be replaced and those details will stand out to potential buyers,

Don't rush to get your home on the market, make sure that it is ready to show the day you list it. You are going to want to make sure that your home is more attractive than the competition. The appeal of a "move in ready" home is hard to beat. The appeal for the seller who stages their home will be a home that sells faster and for more money.

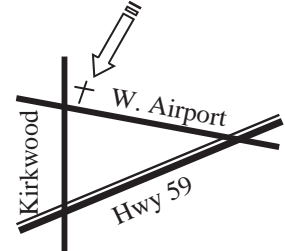

Stars & Stripes Over Meadows Place! by Boy Scout Troop 731

As the sun rose on Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day 2010, the streets of Meadows Place took on a bold new patriotic look. Over one hundred fifty residents subscribed to the *Stars & Stripes Over Meadows Place* flag service. Some of our streets woke up to see that more than half of the homes presented a prominent Red, White and Blue, high quality flag, proudly flying from a tall straight flag pole which was securely and uniformly placed just off the curb in front of each subscriber's home.

We wish to express our sincere Thank You to those who have subscribed to this Flag Service, for supporting Boy Scouts and for expressing the patriotic spirit on the holidays when we honor America.

To those who have not yet subscribed, we extend this invitation and ask for your support. **(NOTE: Flags approved by the City of Meadows Place)**

Troop 731 will proudly post an American Flag in front of your residence on each of the following national holidays: Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day. (On Veteran's Day, the scouts are usually in school so flags will NOT be placed in front of homes that day).

For subscribers, a flag holder (PVC pipe) will be placed underground in your front yard, approximately 12 inches back from the curb. On the morning of the four national holidays listed above, Troop 731 will post an American Flag approximately three by five feet in size on a metal flagpole approximately 10 feet high. Troop 731 will then return in the evening to retire the flag and flagpole and store it until the next holiday.

Note: The flags and flagpoles are the property of Troop 731. You are purchasing a subscription service and NOT the flag or flagpole itself.
