What To Do If You Lose Your Purse or Wallet

Cancel your credit cards immediately, but the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know who to call. Keep those where you can find them easily (DON'T KEEP THEM IN YOUR WALLET OR PURSE). Contact your bank if your checkbook or ATM card was also stolen along with your wallet or purse. File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where it was stolen, this proves to credit providers you were diligent, and is a first step toward an investigation.

The most important step you can take to protect yourself is this: Call the three national credit reporting organizations immediately to place a fraud alert on your name and social security number. The alert means any company that checks your credit knows your information was stolen and they have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit. Most people don't even know about this.

What to Do if Disaster Strikes

Hurricane Season is here, so to help us prepare in case of disaster, I am listing helpful tips and suggestions on how to keep you and your family safe in such times.

This month we will discuss what to do if disaster strikes.

If Disaster Strikes

Remain calm and patient. Put your plan into action.

Check for Injuries

Give first aid and get help for seriously injured people.

Listen to Your Battery-Powered Radio for News and Instructions

Check for Damage in Your Home...

- Use flashlights. Do not light matches or turn on electrical switches, if you suspect damage.
- Sniff for gas leaks, starting at the water heater. If you smell gas or suspect a leak, turn off the main gas valve, open windows, and get everyone outside quickly.
- Shut off any other damaged utilities. (You will need a professional to turn gas back on.)
- Clean up spilled medicines, bleaches, gasoline, and other flammable liquids immediately.

Remember to...

- Confine or secure your pets.
- Call your family contact--do not use the telephone again unless it is a life-threatening emergency.
- Check on your neighbors, especially elderly or disabled persons.
- Make sure you have an adequate water supply in case service is cut off.
- Stay away from downed power lines.

Preparing for Events, Hurricanes

The Red Cross recommends the following safety steps and tips to prepare for a hurricane:

Assemble a Disaster Supplies Kit

- Gather emergency supplies including: emergency medications, nonperishable foods, a non-electric can opener, bottled water (at least three gallons per day per person), a battery-powered radio, flashlight, extra batteries, extra clothes, important documents, cash and credit cards, a first aid kit and other items for infants, elderly or disabled family members and pets
- Store supplies in a waterproof, easy-to-carry container, such as plastic tub with handles

Prepare a Personal Evacuation Plan

- Identify an evacuation route ahead of time; discuss with family members
- If advised to evacuate, do so immediately
- In case of evacuation to an American Red Cross shelter, be sure to bring the disaster supplies kit, medications, extra clothing, pillows and blankets and other hygiene and comfort supplies
- Make advance preparations for pets so you can bring them with you when you leave, but remember, due to health department regulations, pets aren't allowed in public shelters

Prepare for High Winds

- Measure windows and obtain shutters or cut plywood to cover each one
- Remove diseased and damaged tree limbs well before a storm strikes
- Strengthen garage doors with vertical support beams made from 2x4's and "L" brackets
- Get professional help if needed



Recycling Information

esidential recycling services are provided by the city through a contract with WCA Waste. Collection day for recycling is every Friday; please place your bin curbside for collection no later than 7am. Please do not

place bins curbside any earlier than 1pm the preceding day.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

- Newspaper Includes the newspaper itself as well as any printed glossy sale ads / inserts within the paper. Newspapers should not be tied or bound together. If you are recycling a large volume of newspapers, please place them inside a brown paper bag and set it alongside you full bin curbside.
- Plastic Plastic bottles and jugs that are marked as No. 1 or No. 2 type plastics (look at underside of bottle). Typical plastics of this type would include milk jugs, water jugs, plastic pop bottles, and water bottles. Please rinse all containers, and remove caps. Labels can be left intact.
- Aluminum Beverage Cans Please empty and rinse all cans. To compact cans and provide you more recycling space inside of bin, you may want to crush the cans.
- Bi-metal Cans This includes your food (tin) cans. Please empty and rinse. Labels can be left intact.

Please remove you empty bin from the curbside collection area the same day that it is collected. Store your bins away from public view during the week.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF

Ft Bend residents (with proof of residency) can drop off residential HHW items at the Recycling Center located at 1200 Blume Rd., Rosenberg, 77471. Telephone contact information for center is **281-633-7581**. Hours of operation are Mondays 9am - 6pm and the first Saturday of each month 8am – 2pm.

Acceptable items:

paper products

• automotive supplies • household cleaning

• paint products light bulbs

• garden chemicals • pool supplies

 adhesives • recyclable batteries

• plastics

• styrofoam appliances

• cans / scrap metal • glass

• tires electronics

TRANSPORTING HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

- Leave product in original container
- Identify product if label is missing
- DO NOT mix any products
- Separate products by type of waste
- Pack containers in boxes with dividers if possible
- Wrap bottles with newspaper to prevent breakage/spills
- Close containers tightly
- Secure all opened / damaged containers
- Keep waste items away from children / animals, and take directly to drop off site

DANGERS OF IMPROPER DISPOSAL HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

If you pour household hazardous waste down the drain, on the ground, in storm sewers or in your trash, then you are improperly disposing you household hazardous waste. The dangers of such disposal may not be immediately obvious, but certain HHW can contaminate septic tanks or wastewater treatment systems, harm children and pets, and cause injury to sanitation workers. When poured in storm drains, contamination of the local water body occurs.

Pool & Tennis Court Access System

New Meadows Place Pool and Tennis Court Access System

The City of Meadows Place has started a new access system for the pool and tennis court facilities.

New tennis court access cards can be purchased for \$50.00 per card (maximum 2 cards per family), and **MUST** be re-purchased the second weekend of May each year. A driver's license and/or water bill must be shown to purchase the access card. Cards can be purchased at City Hall, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.

A wristband system is now in use at the pool. Residents MUST re-purchase new wristbands starting the second weekend in May each year. A four pack of wristbands can be purchased for \$10, and additional wristbands can be purchased for \$5 each. Every resident must show their wristband to the concessions staff as they enter the pool gates. Each resident wearing a wristband is allowed to bring one guest. The guests must get a hand stamp upon entering the gates. The wristbands can be purchased at the concession window at the pool during operating hours. A driver's license and/or water bill MUST be shown by residents to purchase wristbands. One day pass wristbands can be purchased for \$5 each.




