Airport / Kirkwood Update

Well, as painstakingly slow as it feels to me, we are finally inching toward a benchmark marking real progress on our Airport / Kirkwood reconstruction project. The ones funded by the Fort Bend Mobility Bond. We have completed negotiations with HDR/Claunch & Miller, the firm picked by our Selection Committee, to do the engineering on Airport. We are waiting for contract approval from TxDOT. Once we have that approval, we will "let" the

engineering contract and the project will officially be underway. From that point it will be several months before we are ready to let the construction contract on Airport. In the interim, we will turn our attention to the Kirkwood portion of the project – the one where we have proposed to put the Roundabouts.

Allow me to take a moment to address that. In an attempt to be radically transparent, a little over a year ago we issued a press release about the project, had a town meeting and met with several groups. I was hoping everyone would be excited as I had become about this "new" form of traffic control. Some were. They immediately saw the benefits of separating and distancing ourselves from nearby southwest Houston with its increased crime, deteriorating neighborhoods and falling housing prices. They saw clearly that these Roundabouts would make people take notice that something was different here. That this place was not the same as it is just a little way up the road. That Meadows Place is unique. Others, especially those who have been here a long time, had concerns and were less accepting. They like Meadows Place just like it is and are reluctant to change anything about it. I can understand that but to pharaphrase Will Rogers, "Even if you are on the right track, you'll get run over if you don't keep moving"

That applies to Cities and neighborhoods as well. We need to be as farsighted as those who fought for Meadows Place to incorporate twenty five years ago and helped us become the City we all know and love. This project can help us do that. Part of the process of acceptance is openness which we have. The other is educating everyone about the benefits of something new or different. We are just now entering the education phase and invite you to join us in learning more about Roundabouts and why we are exploring this option.

Please visit our website to get a look at the list of questions I used to help me in the decision making process and answer them for yourself. You will also find a link to a recent article from USA Today titled 'Roundabouts are Gaining Ground', and a humorous yet serious look at roundabouts from Slate Magazine called 'Don't Be Square-Why American drivers should learn to Love the Roundabout' by Tom Vanderbilt. There are also new postings from the U.S. Department of Transportation and others.

You will also want to review a report from the Texas Transportation Institute. This is an independent traffic assessment which was performed at the request of the Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC), a regional mobility group. It is important to note that this study was done as a response to answer the questions and concerns of concerned citizens from Meadows Place. Alan Clark, Director of H-GAC Transportation Department, delivered the presentation personally to your City Council on July 20th. Again, please contact us if you have any questions.

With the near miss of Hurricane Alex it is important to remember all of the services available to our community in times of pending disasters. We encourage our residents to be proactive in preparing for the hurricane season. Below is a list of resources available and we encourage everyone to take advantage of all.

CodeRed is a telephone based service used by the City of Meadows Place. This service allows a user to sign-up for important notifications about the City of Meadows Place. This includes notifications about emergency services and evacuations prior to and during emergencies. Nixle is an internet based service that is used by the Meadows Place Police Department. The service allows the user to sign-up for various alerts sent to an email address or cell phone. The user may select various alerts to register for including the Meadows Place Activity Alert as well as surrounding agencies. This system in addition to CodeRed will be used to notify residents of pending emergencies. Police Activity and Alerts through Nixle: http://local.nixle.com/register

If you are a Texan who lives in an evacuation zone and you require special assistance to evacuate during a storm – including the elderly, people with disabilities, or those who simply will need a ride – call 2-1-1 to register for a ride. Your daily habits, choices and actions collectively have a huge impact on our community.

We have all heard the sayings: "Reduce, Reuse & Recycle", or my personal favorite "Forever in a Landfill". These are really simple concepts, but ones with far reaching effects. I believe we can all make a difference, and help preserve not just the planet, but also this amazing city called Meadows Place.

I am happy to report that I see community pride daily when I'm out patrolling. Yards groomed with pride, and houses turned into homes with TLC. If we all do something as simple as pick up trash or recycling that is adrift in the streets when going out to check the mail; or sweeping up and composting yard clippings & yard waste, will help keep our storm drains clear. If everyone pitches in then "WE" as a community can make a huge impact.

When it comes time to fertilize your lawn; use pesticides, or wash your vehicle, look for environmentally friendly supplies.

Be mindful that anything entering a storm drain is discharged untreated into our community waterways. As rainwater moves over land (your yard), it picks up pollutants and deposits them into local waterways. The storm drains in the City of Meadows Place were designed to capture and transport rainwater runoff into community waterways to prevent flooding. So basically any chemical you dispense onto your yard will be relocated through the storm drains and into bayous, ditches, rivers, lakes and eventually the gulf.

Call Before You Dig

1-800-245-4545

By law, homeowners or contractors planning projects involving digging must call 811 at least 48 hours in advance. Free of charge, the notification center will alert utilities such as electric, gas, cable and phone companies so they can mark the location of their underground lines.

Following these simple steps can prevent an interruption of service or potential safety hazard:

- Call 811 before you dig
- Wait the required amount of time (at least 48 hours)
- Respect the locator's marks
- Dig with care

Here are some great tips for keeping track of items that can get lost at the pool:

- Print your family's name and phone number on your pool card in permanent marker. It is much easier to return the card to its owner if this information is on the card.
- Goggles are often left at the pool. If the goggle straps are wide enough, please print your last name on them in permanent marker. This will also make it easier for a lifeguard to give them back to the owner. Check the printed name regularly as it might fade due to sun and water exposure.
- Before leaving the pool, double check the area where you stored your belongings. Make sure you are leaving with everything you brought to the pool. Items left at the pool are picked up at the end of the day by the lifeguards, and our Lost and Found bins are cleared every week. Please ask a lifeguard staff member if you left something at the pool and need to look through Lost and Found.

I hope everyone enjoyed our Lifeguard Float in the Fourth of July Parade this year! If you sat by the Community Center and judges stand, you were lucky enough to see our Lifeguard dance we worked hard on. Although we did not win the float contest, we sure did have a lot of fun!


