ZIP Code Update
- an early Christmas Present

I am happy. We received our official response from the United States Post Office (USPS) regarding our request for our own Postal ZIP Code. We did not get our own Zip but we have received the next best thing – official recognition in the USPS

National Database and their Address Management System program. This is a big deal and was recognized as such by our neighbor John Henderson who received a copy of the letter through Senator Hutchison's office. After reading it he sent me an, e-mail with the Subject titled "Success. Success"! He was thrilled to see that both these "database have been adjusted so that addresses which fall within the boundaries of the City will appear as "Meadows Place". What this means is that we now officially 'share' the 77477 ZIP Code with Stafford. I checked it and Meadows Place does now appear as an alternative for 77477. Not only is our city accepted, when you enter the ZIP the names of both cities pop up and you are given the option to choose. We never had that option before. As Mr. Peterson noted - "it will take some time until software updates come in to play" but eventually this change will take place as banks, mapping companies, business databases and commercial mailing houses around the country upgrade and update their software to match the latest updates from the Post Office. As they do, self populating software will no longer 'autocorrect' Meadows Place to Stafford, but will in fact autocorrect 'Stafford' to 'Meadows' place as appropriate.

Getting Meadows Place in the Post Office database is something I have been working on for some time. I could not be happier but will keep pushing companies like Google and Yahoo to make sure we get the corrections made as quickly as possible.

Holiday Shopping Tips

 $R_{ ext{shopping}}^{ ext{emember}}$ the following when you go

- Keep track of your bags and packages. If you leave something behind, it could get stolen or discarded.
- Report unattended bags or packages to a security guard or store employee. The same applies when riding public transportation
 report unattended bags or packages to security / staff.
- Park in well lit parking lots. If you feel uneasy, ask for an escort
 to your vehicle. When returning to your vehicle, always be aware
 of your surroundings. Have your keys in your hand so you can
 unlock your vehicle without delay.
- Be sure not to buy more than you can carry. If your packages are making it hard for you to walk upright or see your surroundings, ask a store employee to help you carry them to your car.
- Check receipts to see whether your full credit card number appears. If a receipt has your full number on it, take a pen and thoroughly mark through the number.
- Check to assure that you have your credit cards and check book after you pay.
- Never leave valuable items or packages in plain view inside your vehicle.
- Remember that putting boxes out for garbage pick up lets the would-be thief know what's inside your home. Tear the boxes down and put them inside a trash can if possible.

If you go shopping with children, keep the following in mind:

- Ensure that any children with you know your cell phone number. Give contact information cards to any who don't.
- Make a plan with children in case you get separated. Have a central meeting place, and review with your children who they can turn to for help if they find themselves alone.
- Educate your children about the dangers of talking to or following strangers.

Take a Home Inventory

Since residential burglaries sometimes increase during the holiday season, now is a great time to create or update your home inventory:

- Take photographs or make videos of valuable items.
- List descriptions and serial numbers.
- Your inventory should include things like TVs, VCRs, DVRs, stereo equipment, electronic games, cameras, camcorders, sports equipment, jewelry, silver, computers, home office equipment, power tools, personal keepsakes, and any other items of value.
- If your home is burglarized, having a detailed inventory can help identify stolen items and make insurance claims easier to file.

Tree stumps

Over the past month, many residents have been asked to remove tree stumps from their yards. There were several homeowners who removed the stumps within just a few days of receiving

the Warning Notice, and that is FANTASTIC to see!

If you were not aware, there is a city ordinance which requires the removal of stumps of ANY height. If you remove a tree, as many folks are right now due to the drought and resulting tree losses, you are to have the stump ground up, or remove the stump to ground level.



While I'm mentioning tree stumps, and tree removal.... Yards and landscaping materials (bushes, trees, plantings) that did not survive the drought will need to be removed & replaced.

Protecting water lines

Protecting water lines from the cold weather should be done regardless of the climate you live in. Freezing weather can occur in all parts of the country. Temperatures that approach 32 degrees

Fahrenheit can freeze nonmoving water in all types of pipes. In some cases, those pipes can burst and become permanently damaged you don't want your water pipes freezing. It's not bad enough to have your water pipes freeze up, but when they begin to thaw, they often rupture causing aggravation and extra expense. The best way to save a fortune on a plumber and new pipes is to never let it happen in the first place. One sure-fire way to prevent pipes from freezing is to leave your water running on a cold night. When the predicted temperature reaches 32 degrees or below, let each faucet, hot and cold, drop slightly throughout the night. Of course, if

temperatures will continue to stay below freezing for some time, you might want to consider other options.

Have you ever seen, in an old movie, a bum on a park bench, covered in newspapers? That's because newspaper makes great insulation. Because of this, you can wrap the pipes in at least a quarter-inch thick set of newspaper sheets, secure with masking tape or duct tape, and your pipes will stay warm - down to about 0 to10 degrees. Adding foil around the pipes helps keep them even warmer. After wrapping the pipes in newspaper and tape, wrap the pipes once again with foil, then tape again, using duct tape. Don't forget to wrap the pipes under the sink or any that run somewhere that the heat of the house cannot easily reach. The temperature can now drop to below zero and your water shouldn't freeze, particularly if your home stays fairly warm.

If your pipes have frozen, and you want to unthaw them without risking rupture, open the spout on the faucet that belongs to the frozen pipe. As the ice thaws, the pressure can escape through the open valve, usually preventing the bursting of the pipe. To help thaw out pipes that are frozen, get the house warm, wrap and begin using heat tape or pipe sleeves, and use a blow dryer to help thaw out small portions of pipes which are exposed to the weather. During an ice storm that causes power outage, be prepared with a kerosene heater or a portable gas heater to keep the pipes from freezing until your electricity is functional again. Prevention is the key to keeping water running during the winter months, so take precautions to see that your pipes are securely wrapped and warm.


