Texas Direct Auto - Update

Many of you have asked if Texas Direct Auto (TDA) is still going to be coming to Meadows Place as originally planned. I called and asked Mike Welch, one of the owners, and according to him, the answer is Yes! He did tell me that there has been a delay due to a bankruptcy filing by one of the property owners but said the lawyers have assured him they are close to a new renegotiated contract. TDA is so confident the new arrangements can be finalized that they have recently reengaged their building design team and will be moving full steam ahead with the revitalization project once the contracts have been signed – hopefully within a month. We will keep you posted.

Streetwise - The Way to Be (Part 2 of 2)

Teens are the age group most vulnerable to crime.

But putting into practice some basic crime prevention tips can help you and your friends avoid becoming the victims of crime.

Strolling - Day and Night

- Try to walk places with your friends rather than alone.
- Stick to well-lighted, well-traveled streets. Avoid shortcuts through wooded areas, parking lots, alleys, or any place where would-be criminals can hide.
- Take the safest route to and from schools, stores, or your friends' houses. Know a place along your route where you can go for help if you need it.
- Don't display cash, cell phones, hand-held electronic games, or expensive jewelry and clothing.
- Carry your backpack or purse close to your body and keep it closed. Just carrying a wallet? Keep it in an inside coat pocket or your front pants pocket not in your back pocket or backpack.
- Have your car or house key in your hand before you reach your car or house.
- If you think someone is following you, switch directions or cross the street. If they're still there, move quickly toward an open store or restaurant or a lighted house (indicating someone's home). Don't hesitate to yell for help if you feel threatened.
- Have to work late? Ask someone you know and trust to wait with you for your ride or walk you to your car.
- Be alert in the neighborhood. Call police or tell an adult about anything you see that seems suspicious.

Cruising

- Keep your car in good running condition and always have more than enough gas to get where you're going and back.
- Even if you leave your car for just a minute turn the ignition off, roll up the windows, lock the doors, and take your keys with you. When you return, check inside and around the vehicle before getting in.
- Avoid parking in isolated areas. If you are uncomfortable, ask a security or store staff to watch you or escort you to your car.
- If you think you're being followed, head to the nearest open business or well-lighted, crowded area to get help.
- Use your cell phone to call police if you're being followed or to report accidents or suspicious activities. Otherwise, stay off your cell phone while driving.
- Don't hitchhike or pick up hitchhikers.

Mailboxes are constructed to last only about 10 years (depending on materials used). The United States Postal Service states that it is the individual homeowner's responsibility to maintain and replace worn or damaged mailboxes.

If it's been quite awhile since you've replaced yours then take an objective look at it. Remember that your mailbox is oftentimes the "first impression" to the house that you've made a home.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE: Through the month of March submit a picture of your newly rejuvenated or replaced mailbox to City Hall via; mail, place in utility billing box located at city hall, or email to (code-enforcement@cityofmeadowsplace.org)

We have increased the award for participation this year!! Each participant will receive \$10 discount off their water bill!

Some mailboxes will only need updating and maintenance; paint, rust removal, up-righting a leaning post; adding address numbers...), while others may need replacing. Hardware stores sell replacement kits at reasonable prices, and with reasonable effort you can have a fresh new look.

CURBSIDE MAILBOX STANDARDS:

- The bottom of the mailbox should be located between 41 45 inches (vertical height) from the surface of the street.
- The name and address on your mailbox should be at least 1 inch high.
- The front of your mailbox door should be located
 6 8 inches from the front face of the curb.

Contact our local post office directly if you are considering moving the location of your mailbox.

While you are outside in your yard working on your mailbox project, take note of any dead landscaping (grass, trees, bushes, plants) that did not survive the drought last summer. REMEMBER that all dead landscaping materials need replacement early this Spring.






