#### 2011 - Looking Back - Looking Forward

2011 was a year of extreme challenges and overwhelming successes. Looking back, I am not sure which was most important or had the most impact. In the bad news category, the drought was, and still is, having a major impact on our city. We won't know how bad we have been hurt

until we finally get some rain and see how much the streets, pipes and sound wall mow strips rebound. We really need some rain. We also had a tough budget year but again, the staff and Council came together to make sure Meadows Place can be the City you expect it to be. With those out of the way, let's look at a few positive changes and decisions. So, in no particular order lets look back at 2011. For me personally, the most pleasant surprise was the Post Office officially changing the status of our Zip Code and recognizing Meadows Place as part of 77477. This will make a huge difference as the use of technologies advance and will help us overcome our identity shortcomings. Another significant improvement is the Waste Water Treatment Plant and pipeline to our new lake. This new feature really helps separate us from Houston/Alief and offers the type of "green" amenity young professional families are looking to identify with. Plus. many of our 'Seasoned' citizens are really enjoying it and kids now are catching fish and feeding ducks. A great number of people admitted they had their doubts at the onset but are big fans now. Many of the same people who had doubts about the lake also had concerns about the Kirkwood roundabout project, which we had to postpone when we postponed the Airport project. Much of what we have focused on for the last few years is to enhance the branding and the image of our City. The realtors who took the recent tour appreciated our efforts and one has since created a team of Meadows Place specialists. Barbara Lee Cochran told me she was unaware of all our new amenities much less all that we had planned.

She was particularly impressed with our vision of tying the park into future walking trail and landscape projects along the bayous down to the new trails and landscaped berms along what will be part of the Kirkwood Roundabout Project. To accomplish this, we have come to terms with CenterPoint, who, for a very small fee, will let us make improvements to and use their right-of-ways. It is going to be a nice upgrade.

2011 saw some significant additions to our business community including two great new restaurants and an agreement with Texas Direct Auto. These are nice, but just the beginning. Shortly before the year ended, we signed a contract with The Retail Coach, a very successful municipal consultant who is already working with us to bring some new businesses into the city. This is not an overnight project, but when successful will help reduce the tax burden on homeowners and ensure that any monies invested in Meadows Place homes will not only be secure, but will grow in value. 2011 also saw changes and upgrades in our website and administrative processes. We started putting the marquee messages on the website, incorporated new and stronger Code Enforcement regulations, began offering up pre-approved exterior paint colors with our BEHR project and were able to significantly enhance our Police Tactical and Firearms Training through a grant. Did we get everything done we wanted to in 2011? No, but all in all I believe we did pretty well and I hope you think so too. Now... on to 2012.

#### Streetwise - The Way to Be (Part 1 of 2)

Teens are the age group most vulnerable to crime.

But putting into practice some basic crime prevention tips can help you and your friends avoid becoming the victims of crime.

#### How Streetwise Are You?

Do you...

- Stuff your backpack or purse with cash, keys, cell phone, credit cards, checkbooks and then leave it wide open at school or work, near your desk, or on the floor?
- pay attention to your surroundings or are you preoccupied by texting or social networking on your smart phone, or thinking about school or your friends when walking, driving, or riding the bus?
- think it's a waste of time to use your locker for valuables or to lock your car when you'll be back in a few minutes?

• walk or jog by yourself early in the morning or late at night when the streets and walking/jogging trails are quiet and deserted?

If you answered "yes" to any of these questions, you need to change a few habits.

#### Keeping Street Sense in Mind

- Stay alert and tuned into your surroundings wherever you are
- at school, the mall, on the street, waiting for a ride, or driving.
- Send the message that you're calm, confident, and know where you are going.
- Don't accept rides or gifts from someone you don't know well and trust including people you meet on the Internet.
- Trust your instincts. If something or someone makes you uneasy, avoid the situation or person and leave as soon as possible.

• Know the neighborhoods where you live, go to school, and work. Keep in mind locations of fire and police stations and remember which stores and restaurants stay open late or all night.

#### If Someone Tries to Rob You

- Give up your property not your life.
- Report the crime to the police. Try to get a good description of the attacker and remember as many details of the incident as possible.

Code Enforcement



Starting off a brand new year with some outdoor work? Maintaining the exterior of your home involves more than yard care. Some of the common issues that can get overlooked can impact the look and feel of our neighborhood city.

Routine mowing is mandatory, and in Texas is a year round activity. Grass and weeds cannot exceed 9 inches in height. Yards must be edged along all borders of concrete and grass. Grass must be removed from cracks in concrete, and weeds need to be removed from flowerbeds. Always be sure to remove any clippings after mowing and edging, and never blow the clippings towards storm drains.

Store all trash / trash cans away from public view. Trash should not be set curbside until the evening prior to collection day. Always be sure to bundle your tree limbs into 4 foot bundles. Promptly remove emptied cans from curbside the day of collection, and again be sure to store cans away from public view.

Fences are not required within our city, but if you have a fence then you must maintain it. Replace any broken or missing fence pickets as soon as you notice damage. Make sure that your gates are hung flush, and close properly.

The climate in our fair city makes it necessary to pressure wash. When you notice staining to the brick / siding of the home, or the staining of the concrete it is time to pressure wash.

Maintaining basketball goals can be as simple as replacing a worn net, or treating rust from the post. When a basketball goal is no longer useful then it is time to remove it.

Yard lanterns need to be kept in good repair. If you have an old lamppost in the front yard and it is no longer functioning; either perform maintenance to get it up and running again, or have a licensed plumber cap off the gas line and remove the old post.

Tree limbs cannot overhang sidewalks lower than 10 feet, and no lower than 16 feet over streets.

#### DANIEL K. MCGRAW, City of Meadows Place Department Head



DANIEL K. MCGRAW, Public Works & Utilities Director, Started employment with the Meadows MUD in March of 1988 to 1993. During this time Dan was utilities manager responsible for Water

and Waste Water operations, performed all waste water chemical analysis, water and waste water permits, all water distribution system maintenance ("Main Breaks"), sewer collection system maintenance and all inspections with the TCEQ, EPA and the Harris County Pollution Control. In 1993 the City of Meadows Place and the Meadows Place MUD united as one entity, Dan was one of four MUD employees that made the transfer over to the city. In 2000 Dan became the Public Works Director, 2002 added residential building official and residential plumbing inspector to his daily duties. In 2003 the city needed a flood plain administrator, so with lots of training he added the flood plain to his daily duties as well as the Utilities Director. In his career here, Dan has accomplished many construction projects; in 1999, sewer rehabilitation, major street repairs in 2002, 2004, and 2005, landscaping Dairy Ashford, irrigation system on West Airport, energy conservation projects, many scout and eagle projects involving storm water education. Managed the debris cleanup after Hurricane IKE as well as debris cleanup after the 2003 Tornado. Dan carries a Double "B" Water and Wastewater certification with TCEQ, a Residential/Plumbing inspector's certificate with the International Code Council, and is a member of the American Public Works Association. Dan and his wife Deborah have been married for 16 years and have two children Jordan 11 and Noah 9.



#### **Storm Water Talk**

Meadows Place, as well as every city and utility in the nation are required by their state agencies, in our case the state agency would be Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), to comply

with rules and regulations set by each state for storm water management.

Meadows Place started year five of its Storm Water Management Plan (MS4) in August of 2011 which will be the final year on this plan. I am currently writing a new plan for the next 5 years (2012-2016). Our storm water system will see yearly inspections on:

- Storm drains stenciling program
- The quality of runoff from the city
- Public education and outreach efforts
- Records of citations, fines, and other compliance documentations.

Public Works Staff as well Code-Enforcement are managing the Storm Water Management Plan, responding to reports of illegal dumping, making a report, giving out warnings and in some cases writing citations to violators.

Intentionally pouring pollutants and dumping debris into street gutters and storm drains is dangerous to the environment, and it is also illegal and carries a fine plus the cost of cleaning and removing the contaminates.

#### Three types of storm water Pollution

Storm water pollution can be split into three general classifications.

1. Litter - cigarette butts, cans, food wrappers, plastic bags, paper, solid debris and especially newspapers that are not picked up.


2. Natural Pollution - leaves, yard clippings, soils or animal feces.

3. Chemical Pollution - fertilizers, oil, paint, gasoline, detergent, overflowing sewers or any other liquid except clean water.

With help from the public we can keep the water of our city and the state clean and keep rain water flowing during rain events.



Please do not release any outside fish into the lake.






