Neighborhood Watch Programs

We all value our sense of security. Psychologist Abraham Maslow ranked

safety and security as one of the most essential human needs. Neighborhood cohesion - neighbors who know and look out for one another - is among the strongest features of safer neighborhoods.

Neighborhood Watch is a community-based program supported by the National Sheriffs' Association and the National Crime Prevention Council. Since its inception in 1972, thousands of communities have established Neighborhood Watches and made real differences. The benefits of Neighborhood Watch are many:

- Unites the community and increases neighborhood cohesion
- Reduces fear of crime in the community
- Improves crime reporting by citizens
- Increases surveillance in the community
- Prevents and reduces crime
- Enhances homeland security
- Unites neighbors around a common goal safety and security
- Provides basic skills on preventing crime and reporting suspicious activities and crimes
- Builds a base for correcting neighborhood problems

Participants learn how to make their homes more secure, watch out for each other and the neighborhood, and report suspicious activities to the police. Watch groups are not vigilantes. They are extra eyes and ears for reporting crime and extra hands for helping neighbors. The program teaches participants how to improve observation techniques, things to note for reporting crimes, and how to be a good witness. Neighborhood Watch helps build pride and can serve as a springboard for efforts to address other community concerns. Any geographic unit can be the base: such as a street, a block or several square blocks, or an apartment building or complex.





Pets in the Neighborhood

The City of Meadows Place has an Interlocal Agreement with Fort Bend County Animal Services. FBCAS has enforcement authority of our Animal Control Ordinance. They will respond to

our city for calls for service, such as:

- 1. Dogs "Running at Large". Despite a common misconception, dogs do not need to be confined in order for FBCAS to respond. HOWEVER: Be mindful that the jurisdictional territory for FBCAS is huge, and it is very possible that the dog that you are reporting will not stay in the same location until an Animal Services Officer arrives. If you can contain the pet until an Officer arrives then that would be more practical, but be sure to leave written permission for the Officer to enter your premises and remove the animal from your property.
- 2. Number of animals permitted: You may keep a TOTAL of 4 pets (dogs or cats).
- 3. Trapped animals. FBCAS lends humane traps for nuisance animals 1 week at a time, deposit required. Residents can call to inquire upon availability of traps, and must pick up & return the traps to Animal Services. Once an animal is trapped, FBCAS will pick up the trapped animal during normal business hours (Monday Friday 8am-5pm excluding holidays).
- <u>4. Bite Investigations.</u> Animal bites are serious, and should always be investigated by the local Rabies Control Authority.
- <u>5. Wild Animals.</u> Animals at a high risk for the rabies virus (raccoons, bats, skunks, fox) that exhibit abnormal behavior or that appear sick OR injured, should be reported immediately. You cannot tell by looking at an animal if it has rabies, only a lab can determine that. ANYTIME a bat is located indoors it should be reported.
- <u>6. Snakes.</u> Only snakes that are inside of a residence will be responded to.
- <u>7. Cruelty to animals.</u> FBCAS will investigate reports of cruelly treated animals.

Larry began his law enforcement career with the Meadows Place PD (MPPD) in 1994. It was the first of two stints here – this one ending in 1999, when he took a position with the Hedwig Village PD. He left Hedwig Village in 2001 to work in Kosovo as part of the United Nations Peace Keeping Mission.

In 2002, Larry returned home and came back to work for the MPPD. He currently serves as our senior patrol sergeant. Larry worked 25 years in engineering and construction prior to starting his law enforcement career.

He has extensive training in several areas of law enforcement and holds Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards & Education certificates for Crime Prevention Specialist, Instructor, Firearms Instructor, Field Training Officer, and Master Peace Officer. Larry was shot and wounded in the line of duty in 2006, for which he received the Medal of Valor, as well as being named 100 Club Officer of the Year in 2007 for bravery and service above and beyond. The MPPD and citizens of Meadows Place will be forever grateful for his sacrifice that day in helping remove 2 dangerous felons from our streets.

Sergeant Eissler is known by many Meadows Place residents because of his long and dedicated service and his willingness to help folks in need – any way he can. His hobbies include guns & hunting and enjoying time with family and friends. He is married and has 2 daughters, 3 grandsons, and 2 granddaughters.
