Election Reminder

We did a great job in turning out for our census a year ago and I am asking you to turn out once again. To vote. On May 14th, the City will be holding an election. I ask you to please do your civic duty and come vote. There are two City Council positions on the ballot. In addition to our City Election there are positions open on the Fort Bend ISD School Board. All of

these are important positions waiting to be filled by people who care and are wanting, and willing, to serve. Let's do our part - and vote.

Parks Update

Two years ago, we had a tough decision to make. Do we apply for a fourth Small Communities Grant from Texas Parks & Wildlife or not? We had a lot going on then. The Fort Bend Mobility Bond Project was being approved, we were facing consolidating the Parks Department to one Parks Director, we had decided to rework our Waste Water Treatment Plant and we had major contracts up for review - all this on top of the day to day operation of the City. It would have been easy to put it off, but I just had a feeling tough times might affect the TPWL Grants and was worried that if we delayed, we may not get the opportunity to secure the grant. We knew it would be tough, and we knew we would have to do a lot of the work in-house, but we decided to go for it. And we did. And we became the only city in the State to be awarded four Small Communities Grants by TPWL - and the last for a while. The State has pulled this grant program in the face of tough economic times. But, we made the decision to go for it and I'm glad we did. The result will be, as one resident said, "A park like no other". Though almost everyone at City Hall has pitched in, there are a few that really deserve a special "Thank You". They include Parks Director Monya Keenen, former co-director Terry Modeland, Assistant Finance Director Melody Vaal, Council Members Heidi Case and Rick Staigle and Public Works Director Dan McGraw along with Dan Denny, Joseph French and Geno Sanchez who are doing much of the actual installation themselves! "Weather Permitting" the lake should be filling and the track re-opened about the first of June. The hills and the rest of the park will be closed for a little while until the grass grows in. To see some of the new amenities in the park, check it out on our website, and then plan to go see it yourself.

Meadows Place Tennis Court and Pool Access System

The City of Meadows Place will be starting a new access system for the **TENNIS** courts and **POOL** facilities. All current tennis and pool access cards will be deleted the **THIRD** weekend of May 2011.

All residents MUST purchase new TENNIS court access cards and POOL wristbands starting the THIRD weekend in May each year. A driver's license and/or water bill as proof of Meadows Place residence MUST be shown to purchase the TENNIS court ACCESS CARDS and/or POOL WRISTSBANDS.

New tennis court access cards may be purchased by **RESIDENTS ONLY** for \$50.00 per card at City Hall, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. (maximum 2 cards per family).

New pool wristbands system is for **RESIDENTS ONLY**. Purchase a four (4) pack of wristbands for \$10.00. Any additional wristbands needed per family may be purchased for \$5.00 each. Lost or replacement pool wristbands may purchased for \$5.00 each. One day pass **POOL** wristbands may be purchased for \$5 each.

POOL wristbands may be purchased at the concession window at the pool during operating hours and Splash Night, Friday, June 10th, from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m.

All resident MUST show their wristband to the concessions staff as they enter the pool gates. Each resident wearing a wristband is allowed to bring ONE GUEST The guests MUST GET A HAND STAMP upon entering the pool facility.

We did this to simplify the process and make it easier for the homeowner. Locking Doors Still Best Bet Against Burglaries

Tot so long ago, people did not feel the need to lock their doors or windows. But times have changed, and so has the need to use locks for protection. According to the National Crime Prevention Council, most individuals do not have the proper lock security. Only half of Americans have dead-bolt locks on all of the entry doors to their homes and nearly one in five have none at all. The National Crime Prevention Council recommends checking and updating old locks on all doors and windows and replacing them with ones that provide protection from keys being duplicated without your knowledge, such as Medeco Security Locks. 

EXTERIOR PAINT PROCESS SUMMARY

The color schemes that people tend to

find aesthetically pleasing is purely a subjective preference. In order to maintain By Kathi Sutton

a cohesive appearance within our city, to maintain the character of the city, and to protect property values, it is necessary to regulate color schemes. Coordinated color combinations that are carried on from property to property add enormously to the appeal of a neighborhood. It is the intent of The City of Meadows Place to maintain property values, as well as the resident's quality of life to keep Meadows Place Your Place for Life.

A new ordinance was passed by city council in February, which regulates exterior paint colors. The approved color book for the City of Meadows Place is the "Behr" paint brand (sold at Home Depot) "Exterior Collection" color book (chart #50001540). Only color combinations contained within this book are considered to be "preapproved" paint combinations. Paint colors can be "color matched" at other retailers, as long as the paint color shows no discernable difference than the color indicated within the approved color book. Any color matched paint needs to be presented to the Code Enforcement Officer for approval.

Please consider the color of brick facing your home when deciding on paint color scheme.

Each home within our city has been sent a Behr Exterior Collection color chart. If you look inside you will see colors in groups of 3

Base: For purposes of Paint Color, "Base" shall be considered the primary exterior surface of a building, including both the Principal Structure, and any Accessory Structures exceeding a gross floor area of 100 feet, and greater than 8 feet in height, located within a lot. "Base" will also include any canopy / awning or siding which covers an area exceeding 15% of the total exterior surface of a building.

(281) 498-3900 (713) 721-7800 **Trim:** For purposes of Paint Color, "Trim" shall be considered fascia boards, garage doors, doors, window casings, mailboxes, decorative columns, awnings / canopies or siding which covers an area less than 15% of the total exterior surface of a building, wrought iron elements, and cornices. Doors may also be colored in standard mfg colors available at major retailers.

Accent: If you have chosen to use a 3 color combination, the "Accent" details on the exterior of your home are shutters, moldings, and mounting surfaces (mounting block of doorbell, address numbers, mailbox or light fixture).

If you present a paint color selection to the Code Enforcement Officer, and the paint color is denied for use, then you may appeal the denial to the city Planning and Zoning Commission. The appeal application, along with any fee that may be charged to defray administrated costs, must be given to the City Secretary within 10 business days of the denial. The appeal will be heard by the Planning and Zoning Commission as soon as practical.

Any violation of the Paint Ordinance is considered a Class "C" misdemeanor, and is subject to fines.

In June 2011 most City of Meadows Place resident's (some already have it) will be getting new digital meters known as "Smart Meters," from Center Point. Listed below is what you can expect from Center Point and their employees.

Consumer Benefits of Smart Meters:

When the communication systems are in place and new meters are fully functional, consumers with smart meters will see many benefits:

- Remote Meter Reading
- Smoother Transactions remote connect/disconnect
- Automatic Outage Notification
- Energy Efficiency and Savings
 - Monitor electricity usage history at 15-minute intervals at www.SmartMeterTexas.com
 - Less usage can save consumers money; less power generation is good for environment
- New Retail Products and Services (examples)
 - Pre-paid service
 - Time-of-use rates

 - Remote control of thermostats and appliances in a Home Area Network (HAN)

What to expect:

Before installation

- Pre-installation "sweep" for access
- Door hanger several weeks before
- Leave your meter accessible
- Critical Customer accounts will be scheduled with specific customer appointments

During installation

- About a ten-minute outage
- You need not be present
- Turn off electronic devices if you are home
- Door hanger upon installation

After installation

- Meter acceptance period up to 60 days
- Then no more manual electric meter reads
- Then view your usage history in 15-minute intervals at www.SmartMeterTexas.com
- Additional benefits as in-home displays, Home Area Networks and new products develop

Pre-Sweep Activities:

• CenterPoint Energy employees will be conducting a door-to-door review of all meter locations in advance of deployment

- •All employees/contractors have picture identification, uniforms and marked vehicles
- •Attempts will be made to proactively locate and resolve meter-related problems

Issues Preventing Meter Installation:

CenterPoint Energy will contact customers with meter situations such as the following:

- Access problems: e.g. locked gates, dogs in yard, meter inside structure, brick wall built around meter
- Unsafe meter issues that require additional action by customer's electrician; unattached meter cans or structural issues impacting service, etc.

*NOTE: If an unsafe condition is not corrected, the service may be disconnected until repairs have been made.

Customer Communication:

If pre-sweep indicates installation of meter is not possible:

- Door hanger will be left noting issues needing attention regarding the meter loop and/or surroundings
- A CenterPoint Energy point of contact name and contact information will be left for follow-up

If installer is unable to access the meter:

- Door hanger will be left noting cause of inaccessibility (gate locked, dog, other)
- Customer is asked to allow access or to call installation contractor to schedule appointment
- After three failed attempts, installation is returned to the utility (CNP)


