Zip Code Thank Yous and Update

First, let me Thank all of you who contacted our Postal and Congressional representatives in support of our quest for a ZIP Code. People of all ages and from all over the City responded to the call and let the powers-to-be know that we felt it was time for Meadows Place to get its own Zip Code. I also want

to Thank all of you who sent me copies of your various communiqués. I was impressed. Not only that you took the time to contact our reps, but with the clarity, quality and polite, positive demeanor of your messages. You did Meadows Place proud. Let's just hope the Post Office got the message. I know Senators Cornyn and Hutchison did, otherwise they would not have supported our position. I sent them both a Thank You note on behalf of the City. I also sent a Thank You note to Congressman Pete Olson, who not only supported our position, but played a very active role in getting the evaluation process moving. And against all odds, move it did. We are currently in the midst of a 60 day evaluation period where the Post Office formally processes and evaluates our request based on a number of prerequisites. Time will tell. Now may not be the best time to be asking the Post Office for anything but getting a formal evaluation is the result of efforts that took place over the past year and a half. One more word on Congressman Olson, several of you, including Laura Neighbors, Robert Nesbit and Councilwoman Isbell, received notes back from the Congressman not only thanking you for contacting him but confirming his support and explaining that he sent a letter to the USPS District Manager "supporting Meadows Place in the ongoing ZIP Code Boundary Review Process". Thank You Congressman Olson and staff, we appreciate your efforts. Now, we wait. I will let you know as soon as we get the results back – in the meantime, let's all keep our fingers crossed.

If you will look at them, you will see they have different color tops. That is because they are all color coded according to American Water Works Association (AWWA) and as per our Fire Marshal. The colors of the top indicates the size of the pipe coming to the hydrant so the Fire Department can tell how much water they can count on. Green = 12" main, Yellow = 8" main and white = 6" main. What a simple yet effective way to assist our Fire Department as they help and protect us.

Speaking of the Fire Department **Did You Know...** the Fire Department took all of the equipment in our firehouse out to the Fire Training Facility near Richmond last month? Some of you saw the white and blue fire trucks from Richmond sitting in our driveway because while our

crews were down there training, the Richmond Fire Department was providing coverage here in Meadows Place. This is just another great example of the cities in Ft. Bend County working together. This is significant since this type of cooperation doesn't happen everywhere.

Did You Know... Meadows Home & Garden Club President Lou Ann Kelly, has been working with Parks Director Monya Keenen on several projects? They will begin by selling popcorn and raffle tickets for their Craft Show at this years Halloween Carnival. They also will be selling popcorn at Christmas Memories. If all goes well, they hope to continue these activities at our special events.

Budget and Tax Rate Update

The City of Meadows Place has adopted the "effective" tax rate as determined by the office of the Fort Bend County Tax Assessor-Collector. The 'Effective Tax Rate' is a statistical amount that enables the comparison of one group to another or, in our case, one tax year to another. We use this figure to compare our taxes from the current fiscal year to the upcoming budget year. This means that the effective rate is the tax rate that will produce the same amount of revenue for the city as it did for the current year. This is the rate Council adopted as the tax rate for us here in Meadows Place. Bottom line, using the effective rate means the budget revenue which Council approved for 2011-2012 is essentially the same as last year as well. The amount you will pay individually is decided by values set by the Central Appraisal District but it will be tied to the adopted tax rate of .898687. So, if your home values remain the same, you will pay almost exactly the same as you did last year and the city will take in almost exactly the same as last year. Expenditures were maintained at almost the exact same level as well. You can find both of these figures on the website.

Like municipalities all across the country, Meadows Place has been affected by the economy. Though it is another very tough year, all the hard work done by homeowners to maintain and improve their home values coupled with all the tangible asset improvements the City has put in place is beginning to show results. As is most often the case, community development precedes economic development, and this year we saw an uptick in our home values and new businesses to choose Meadows Place as their home. This is all very encouraging and shows Meadows Place is on a path for continued success that will certainly keep us... *Your Place for Life*.

Playing it Safe on Halloween

Halloween may be fun for kids, but with it comes parents' concerns for their children's safety. Following a few safety tips will ensure that

Halloween will be a good time for all:

- Welcome trick-or-treaters at home by turning on your exterior lights.
- Remove objects from your yard that might present a hazard to visitors.
- Coordinate with your adult friends in Meadows Place to help keep an eye out for the children's welfare.
- Drive slowly all evening you never know when an excited child may dart across your path.
- Report any suspicious or criminal activity, reckless driving, or other safety concerns to the Meadows Place Police Department @ 281-983-2900.
- Assure that costumes are flame-retardant so children aren't in danger around candle-lit jack-o-lanterns or other fire hazards.
- Keep costumes short to prevent trips or falls.
- Try makeup instead of a mask. Masks can be hot and uncomfortable, and can obstruct a child's vision a dangerous thing when crossing streets or going up and down steps.
- Make sure kids wear light colors or put reflective tape on their costumes if out after dark. Walking with flashlights also increases safety.
- Make sure older children go out with responsible friends. Younger children should be accompanied by an adult.
- Travel on sidewalks whenever possible and cross the street at intersections. Don't take shortcuts through yards, alleys, or playgrounds.
- Kids need to know not to eat their treats until they get home, and their parents have checked them out. Discard candies that appear to have already been opened, and inspect fruit or homemade goodies before letting your children eat them.
- All the costumes, coupled with the excitement of Halloween (not to mention all that sugar), can bring out aggressive behavior in kids. Fake knives, swords, guns, or other props can accidentally hurt people. Make sure they are made from cardboard or flexible material, and watch your children closely so they don't injure someone (or get injured) with these items.
- Halloween is notoriously a night of pranks. Explain to your children you want them to have a good time, but hurting other people or vandalizing property is not acceptable.

Winter Weatherization

It may be difficult to imagine the weather temperature finally being out of the triple digits, but it's time to take a look around to see where the house needs to be buttoned up for the winter & also to see where you can save on your energy usage. Some of the items

that I'm listing are things that I cover when I am in homes performing occupancy & rental inspections.

The greatest heat loss affecting your home is air leakage. Start from the bottom: Check and make sure that you have weather stripping around each exterior door, and attic hatch. Caulk all windows (inside & outside), use insulating gaskets in your outlets and electrical switch plates. Check to make sure that all of your fan-driven exterior vents (dryer, stove, bathroom) have a flap that seals off the vent when not in use, and make sure that the damper is closed on your fireplace when not in use also. Use pipe insulation to cover any exposed plumbing.

I recently covered fire safety in a newsletter article, but it bears mentioning again: Check your smoke detectors, replace batteries, and don't forget to install a carbon monoxide monitor.
