Touching Base with <u>You</u>

I am in the middle of an interesting exercise. I have been spending three to four hours a weekend phoning residents of Meadows Place. What a wonderful and invaluable experience it has been. I started this because Council was presented with a list of folks that were worried about or had questions on Roundabouts. I wanted to talk to them personally so I could get a better idea of what these questions were.

As you know, the City has been concentrating it's efforts on the West Airport portion of the project. With a little luck, we will actually "let" the contract for the engineering on West Airport later this month. This will give us an opportunity to begin to focus more on Kirkwood and the proposed Roundabouts. Based on the calls I've made so far, we will need to address and supply you with information in the following areas: the Increased Safety levels of Roundabouts, the Increased Traffic Capacity of Roundabouts, Emergency Vehicles ability to respond, Pollution Reduction, Noise Reduction, Esthetic Impact and Cost. Why these? Because these are the areas you have wanted to talk about when I call. I plan to address one area at a time beginning later this year - so Read Your Newsletter. In the meantime, please check our website for updates and additional information – or if you wish, you can contact me individually.

There does seem to be some confusion on the funding so I want to remind you that both these road projects are part of, and being funded almost exclusively by, the 2007 Fort Bend Mobility Bond Project. This is a case where Federal and Fort Bend County tax dollars are coming back home to Meadows Place. If we don't use them to repair these rapidly deteriorating roads, we lose this funding forever. Period. Meanwhile, some other part of Fort Bend will benefit from OUR money. I don't know about you, but I don't think much of that idea. We need to be thankful that both projects got accepted as part of this Mobility project or we will continue paying for ever increasing repairs out of our general budget – not something we want to do. Because they are part of the Mobility Bond Project the cost of these roadway projects do not affect the General Budget or City tax rate.

I want to say Thank You to all the folks who have taken the time to talk with me and share their insight and expertise - not only on these road projects but on other things as well. It has been a wonderful experience and I can tell you right now, these types of calls will be an ongoing part of my duties as Mayor. Besides getting the chance to talk to some very nice people, I have learned a lot about what you feel is important. I assure you that I will do my best to take what you tell me and use it to make sure that Meadows Place stays Your Place for Life.


I hear that word "neighborly" a lot around Meadows Place. Nice, isn't it.

The proper execution of a left turn on a divided roadway such as W. Airport Blvd. can be a challenging task. In our hurry to get where we are going, often we forgo safe driving practices. By understanding the dynamics of the left turn one is able to safely make a left turn. The general principle is to see oncoming traffic and not block the intersection.


The following steps will assist in making a safe Left Turn on a divide highway:

1. Proceed to the far or right side of the intersection (pocket), this will allow you to see oncoming traffic.

2. Do not block the intersection (pocket), only one vehicle turning each way at a time.

3. When waiting to make a left turn and a vehicle is in the "pocket" stop prior to entering the "pocket". This prevents obstructions to the current driver's sight of oncoming traffic

4. Be patient.

For those of you who have noticed the paint on your home is fading or chipping, and are in the process of either a new paint project or a touch up I thought that I could offer some pointers. I am no paint professional, but wanted to provide you some basic information to get your project going.

Prep work

- Trim / tie back any branches or limbs near painting surface.
- Remove shutters.
- Scrape away any peeling paint.
- Fill in any wood defects, or replace rotted areas.
- Pressure wash or rinse all siding / trim (allow to dry thoroughly).
- Tape off any tight / tricky areas that need painting to prevent messes.
- Sand or primer any slick surfaces to allow better adhesion.
- Must obtain color selection from City Hall.

Paint Guide


- Go with a quality product; exterior paint is exposed to the elements & with the use of a higher quality paint it will last longer and require fewer coats.
- Oil Paint or Water based (Latex)? Consider what surfaces you will be painting; Oil based paints are considered superior for Chalky, Stained or Metal surfaces. Water based (Latex) is usually preferred for non-bleeding wood siding or trims & works well on stucco.
- Satin finishes are usually used on siding because they hide imperfections & are easy to clean or wipe down.
- Gloss finishes are more durable and bring out details, so they are preferred on trim and doors.

Paint Application

- Angled Brushes are used on trim work to make a clean edge. This can also be achieved with a corner roller. Generally it is preferred to paint the horizontal surfaces before you paint the vertical ones, as the mistakes aren't as noticeable that way.
- Rollers (with very low nap) or sprayers are the preferred method of painting soffits, fascia and siding.






