did indeed need to talk. They were just about to release a new Fort Bend Newcomers Guide for the Fort Bend Chamber of Commerce and had planned to list us the same way. **Did You Know**....that some thirty something volunteers turned out to help on Field Prep Day for Meadows Place Baseball? The fields were in rough shape because of the extremely hot, dry summer but that is not the case now. The volunteers removed sod, weeded the infield, added dirt and sand to the areas that needed it and basically transformed the fields to game ready condition. Their fall season started late last month and Richard Garza, who is on their board, told me the large and enthusiastic turnout was one of his proudest moments as a Meadows Place resident. ### r.a.d.Kids

The Meadows Place Police Department held their second r.a.d.Kids training class at the Meadows Place Recreation Center from July 31 – August 2, 2009. The acronym stands for Resisting Aggression Defensively. Boys and girls from the ages of five (5) to twelve (12) years old are eligible for the training. The fun, activity-based program includes lecture, safety drills, muscle memory exercises, and dynamic simulation.

The Meadows Place class consisted of nine (9) children. Meadows Place police officers Lynn Dottei and Kelly Davis (certified r.a.d.Kids instructors) taught the class. The young participants became empowered with knowledge, confidence, and the skills necessary to replace fear and confusion in dangerous situations. They learned how to protect themselves from violence and harm by seeing, hearing, and doing. Included in the curriculum are: 1) home, school, vehicle, and "out and about" safety; 2) predator tricks, including physical resistance strategies against abduction; 3) internet safety; 4) good, bad, and uncomfortable touching; and 5) r.a.d.Kids revolutionary bullying prevention program. At the completion of the course, the new r.a.d.Kids demonstrated their abilities to escape harm and run to safety.

### Create a Disaster Plan and Be Prepared

U in preparing for any type of emergency is to develop a disaster plan. Once you've made your plan, it is important to meet with your family and discuss it. Explain dangers such as fire, severe

ne of the most important steps you can take

weather and the possibility of flu epidemics. Safe meeting places are a necessity. Be sure and pick two places to meet after a disaster. One good example is meeting right outside your home in case of a sudden emergency - such as a fire. A second recommended spot is outside your neighborhood in case you cannot return home or are asked to evacuate your neighborhood. It may not be necessary to be a certified electrician in the wake of an emergency - but it does help to know a few things about items around your house. Each adult in your household should learn how and when to turn off utilities such as electricity, water and gas. If you do not know how to use the fire extinguisher in your home, contact your local fire department to show you. Communication is key during unexpected events. Ask an out-of-state friend or relative to be your "family contact." After a disaster it's often easier to call long distance. Other family members should call this person and tell them where they are. Everyone must know your contact's phone number. Have a list of all contact persons names and phone numbers posted in your home. Make sure everyone knows where this list is located. Make smaller copies for all family members to carry with them. Include parent work numbers, doctor, dentist, daycare, and other important or frequently used numbers in your household. It is a good idea to include any medical needs that a family member may have on this list. Disaster plans should include a list of proper precautions to take. Explain the importance of washing hands and covering your cough. The best way to stop the spread of disease is by socially distancing yourself. If you or a family member is sick, if possible, stay at home until you are well. For more information about the publication, or to submit questions The City of Meadows Place wants you and your family to be safe with emergency preparedness planning. We are counting on our residents to also be prepared. This may require your family to be self sufficient for up to three days. We have learned lessons from Hurricane Ike. Preparation and communication is the key to our success when responding to severe weather and disasters. Homeland Security and the Red Cross suggest we all do the following; GET A KIT- this disaster supply kit will help you survive for three days or more. MAKE A PLAN- the emergency information for you family will provide the communication needed to put your family into action rather than struggling with chaos and confusion. BE INFORMED- Do you know how to respond to disasters? We also recommend that you GET INVOLVED be out volunteer opportunities to assist City of Meadows Place There are many ways to positively impact our communities and our county.

This could mean becoming a skywarn spotter, ambulance volunteer, or donating blood. We need you to not only read this document, but also react to the information and prepare.

## City Ordinances / Code Enforcement



 $\mathbf{F}$  ire safety is something that we all need and want, but having a busy and full life can tend to relegate matters to the back of our minds. National Fire Prevention Week is October 4 – 10 this year. Taking a few minutes to look around your home objectively can help identify areas that need improvement.

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, on each level of the home, and in the kitchen
- Test smoke alarms monthly, change batteries every 6 months, and replace the unit every 10 years
- Check every room to ensure that the escape route did not get blocked unintentionally; either by stored items, furniture or clutter
- · Use emergency release devices inside all barred doors and windows
- · Never paint or nail windows shut
- · Keep trash and debris from collecting on your property
- Post 4" high address numbers onto the front of your home (with a contrasting color)
- · Replace cracked or damaged electrical cords
- · Use tamper-resistant receptacles when you have children in the home
- · Ask smokers to smoke outside, and provide them deep and sturdy ashtrays
- · Have your chimney swept and inspected each Fall
- Use fireplace screens to keep sparks contained
- · Check the firebox within your fireplace for damage or cracks
- Make sure that your portable space heater has an auto shut-off, so that if it tipped over it will turn off
- · Clean the lint tray in your clothes dryer after each load
- · Purchase two home fire extinguishers and keep them handy
- · Don't leave food cooking on the stovetop unattended
- Have a 3 foot "Kid Free Zone" around the stove
- · Install "anti-scald" devices on tub faucets and shower heads
- · Keep matches and lighters only within adult reach
- Plan a family escape route, select a meeting place outside and practice with a quick drill twice a year

Fire safety is one thing that can take a little bit of conscious awareness and turn it into averting a heart wrenching disaster. 
To have a photo placed on our Wall of Heroes the person must be or have been a Meadows Place resident who has a relative currently living in Meadows Place.

Once complete, bring the plaque to City Hall. It is the property of the person who purchased it and may be removed at any time by contacting City Hall.






