Budget and Tax Rate Update

The City of Meadows Place has placed the proposed 2012-2013 Budget and tax rate on our website. You will be pleased to know that the proposed tax rate is just a bit under last year's. To view the proposed budget and tax rate, look for Budget under the Public Information button under Government. You can look at this year's proposed budget as well as the last four years. This last year, Meadows Place forced several transactions on homes that affected our overall home prices and will continue to do so rather than leave them unclaimed and unattended. It is time consuming, frustrating and takes time and patience on the part of Code Enforcement, our Police Department, Utility group and our City Attorneys. I am proud of the fact that all of these homes are being rebuilt and modernized which will eventually push the price of Meadows Place 'comps' up. Comps are the comparative prices that similar or nearby homes sell for. If we keep working hard to maintain our homes, keep our city facilities and parks looking good and continue to enforce our local Codes and Ordinances, Meadows Place should be in an even better financial position next year. Until then, assuming the tax rate passes as is, let's all be thankful for the tax break and look for ways to make the City even more attractive for the young professionals that are moving into Meadows Place.

Nixle & Police Alerts

I have had some questions about our Police Notifications and Alerts. First of all, if you are not receiving these alerts and wish to, please go to the website and click the Nixle registration link.

For those that are receiving them but are not sure what they are getting, let me explain. There are two separate types of notifications. One is a weekly report, called the Advisory, usually sent out on Fridays. The other, called an Alert, is sent out when something is in progress or has just occurred. With it comes information on the event, a description and a request for us to be on alert and to let the PD know immediately if we see or notice anything related to that alert. There is one more type of notification called the Blotter. This is for reminders, general information or schedules of the next Neighborhood Watch, National Night Out, etc. You can sign up to receive them by text or e-mail, which of course is much more detailed.

I hope this encourages you to sign up, to keep alert and to attend National Night Out in Texas on October 2nd this year. Hope to see you then.

The Nixle Community Information Service

Department is utilizing a service that allows us to send important, valuable community information directly to residents using the latest technology.

The Nixle Community Information Service allows us to create and publish messages to be delivered to subscribed residents instantly via cell phone text message and/or email. Notifications can also be accessed online at Nixle's web site at www.nixle. com.

Messages may include Emergency Alerts, Police Activity and updates, as well as other relevant safety and community event information.

The Department has used Nixle for several years to provide information such as hurricane awareness and alerts, criminal activity and arrest, and public information such as how to report suspicious activity. You will find that we utilize three basic message types:

- First is the Alert which consists of real time information for crimes that have just occurred and have suspect information available, weather alerts for life threatening situations which may require shelter in place of evacuation.
- Second in the advisory message, this is designed to update subscribers on past activity such as crimes already occurred, significant events, and arrest made in the community.
- Third is the Police Blotter, this is designed more as a public service announcement provide subscribers with information about various activities, events, and procedures such as how to report suspicious activity, where to find hurricane preparedness information, or crime watch meeting time and location.

Chief Stewart says, "We believe Nixle is a valuable service to the department and community and hope that everyone will subscribe".

The service is secure, reliable and easy to use. A subscriber controls what messages they receive and how they receive them. Your information is safe and secure and is never released to anyone. When citizens receive information from our agency via Nixle, they know it can be trusted.

Home Exterior Maintenance



Maintaining the exterior of your home involves more than yard care. Some of the common issues that can get overlooked can impact the look and feel of our neighborhood city.

Routine mowing is mandatory, and in Texas is a year round activity. Grass and weeds cannot exceed 9 inches in height. Yards must be edged along all borders of concrete and grass. Grass must be removed from cracks in concrete, and weeds need to be removed from flowerbeds. Always be sure to remove any clippings after mowing and edging, and never blow the clippings towards storm drains.

Store all trash / trash cans <u>away from public view</u>. Trash should not be set curbside until the evening prior to collection day. Always be sure to bundle your tree limbs into 4 foot bundles. Promptly remove emptied cans from curbside the day of collection, and again be sure to store cans away from public view.

Fences are not required within our city, but if you have a fence then you must maintain it. Replace any broken or missing fence pickets as soon as you notice damage. Make sure that your gates are hung flush, and close properly. When fences start to lean, then they need to be adjusted to stand upright.

The climate in our fair city makes it necessary to pressure wash. When you notice staining to the brick / siding of the home, or staining of the concrete it is time to pressure wash.

Maintaining basketball goals can be as simple as replacing a worn net, or treating rust on the post. When a basketball goal is no longer useful then it is time to remove it.

Yard lanterns need to be kept in good repair. If you have an old lamppost in the front yard and it is no longer functioning; either perform maintenance to get it up and running again, or have a licensed plumber cap off the gas line and remove the old post.

Tree limbs cannot overhang sidewalks lower than 10 feet, and no lower than 16 feet over streets.

Mosquito Control in Meadows Place

City of Meadows Place Public Works
Department has treated all storm water
inlets and storm drain manholes with larvacide.
The best way to prevent mosquitoes is to stop
them from breeding. Property owners need to
assess their property to help reduce the number
of mosquitoes in areas outdoors where you

work or play, by draining sources of standing water. In this way, you reduce the number of places mosquitoes can lay their eggs and breed.

The recent sampling of mosquitoes has determined that the mosquitoes in Meadows Place breeding here are not the salt marsh mosquito from the gulf coast that we often see. Together, if we all follow these steps below we can reduce the mosquito population here in Meadows Place.

- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by emptying standing water from flower pots, buckets and barrels.
- Change the water in pet dishes and replace the water in bird baths weekly. Drill holes in tire swings so water drains out. Keep children's wading pools empty and on their sides when they aren'tbeing used.
- Remove children's toys from the lawn.
- Check for clogged rain gutters and clean them out.
- Remove discarded tires, and other items that could collect water.
- Be sure to check for containers or trash in places that may be hard to see, such as under bushes or under your home.
- Spray clothing with repellents containing DEET or another EPA-registered repellent since mosquitoes may bite through thin clothing.
- When weather permits, wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants whenever you are outdoors.
- Place mosquito netting over infant carriers when you are outdoors with infants.
- Consider staying indoors at dawn, dusk, and in the early evening, which are peak mosquito biting times.
- Install or repair window and door screens so that mosquitoes cannot get indoors.
- Do not over water your lawns mosquitoes breed under the grass in lawns which have excess water.
- Replace outdoor lights with yellow bug lights.

If people have symptoms that cause them concern, they should contact their healthcare provider immediately." For more information on mosquitoes visit Centers for Disease Control and Prevention www.cdc.gov/.






