#### **Community Satisfaction Survey**

I would like to thank everyone who took part in our recent Community Satisfaction Survey. I have found surveys can be a great tool to initiate regular communication between those responsible for moving the city forward and you, the residents of this great little city. This survey has provided some interesting results of which I am proud to

say showed the vast majority of the respondents give our city a big thumbs up. Though still categorizing and reviewing the individual results, let me share some of the results with you. Not surprisingly the survey says there is a strong Sense of Community in Meadows Place with 75% of those responding selected quite strong or extremely strong responses. 72% of us say we feel very or extremely safe here and 65% say they feel the same way even while walking after dark. I would put those numbers up against any community anywhere and part of the reason we feel safe here is that 85% of us say that the police response in Meadows Place is either very quick or extremely quick (Note: the average response time is less than 2 minutes after the officer gets the call.) Another reason we feel safe is because we know our neighbors. This is an important category and Meadows Place stands strong here with 80% saying we know about half, most or all of our neighbors. Let's keep that number strong and get out and visit or meet our neighbors on National Night out Texas next month. A whopping 83% said they were very or extremely satisfied with our parks with quite a few calling for continued concerts in the individual comments section. Looking at these numbers is why all but 11% of us feel the future for Meadows Place is either very or extremely promising. I know I do. The numbers also show we are definitely proud to live here - an overwhelming 73% selected the very proud or extremely proud category. That makes me extremely proud to serve as Mayor of this fantastic little city but also reminds me that this just didn't happen, people worked to make this happen, and with your help, we will continue to work hard to make sure Meadows Place remains the great place to live that it is and will continue to be ... Your Place for Life.

With an average response time of less than two minutes from the time the officer gets the call, Meadows Place residents know they can count on our officers no matter when they call – and please, call them if you have a concern.

#### **County Bond Election**

There will be a County Bond election this November. If passed, this mobility bond referendum will allow Ft. Bend County to move ahead on 54 vital transportation projects. Some are major additions while some connect sections of roads that have needed to be connected for years. Judge Hebert invited all the Ft. Bend Mayors to a meeting to discuss the process used by the county to establish the amount of bond funding the County could support without a tax increase. He also explained the process used to pare back and prioritize the original "wish list" of some nine-hundred million dollars in projects to the supportable figure of \$184,900,000.

After listening to Judge Hebert and after seeing a detailed presentation by Commissioner James Patterson, I fully support this bond referendum. Your City Council supports it as well. This should be a no brainer as it will mean so much to the continued growth, prosperity and success of Ft. Bend County - without a tax increase! This November, please vote in support of this very important bond referendum, Thank You.

There is a new "drive-by" virus on the Internet, and it often carries a fake message - and fine - purportedly from the FBI. These are described as drive-by malware because unlike

many viruses - which activate when users open a file or attachment - this one can install itself when users simply click on a compromised website. Once infected, the victim's computer immediately locks, and the monitor displays a screen stating there has been a violation of federal law.

- Do not pay any money or provide any personal information.
- Contact a computer professional to remove "drive-by" malware from your computer.
- Be aware that even if you are able to unfreeze your computer on your own, the malware may still operate in the background. Certain types of malware have been known to capture personal information such as user names, passwords, and credit card numbers through embedded keystroke logging programs.
- File a complaint and look for updates about "drive-by" malware on the IC3 website.

### Size Matters Our Trash Cans and What is in Them



Thave noticed several issues within our City both on trash days and just before / after them.

• Trash may not be placed out to the curb more than 18 hours before trash pick-up. That is 1 pm on Monday and

Thursday afternoons. This includes LAWN CLIPPINGS. Residents who pay for lawn service are put at risk for getting a warning/citation by putting your lawn clippings out to the curb on a non-trash day.

• After pick-up, your cans must be stored out of sight from the street, not in front of your garage, on your porch or the side of your home.

• Fluorescent Light Bulbs: Yes, they can be placed in your trash, but please, if they are the long bulbs, safely break them up in large paper bags (or similar), so that they do not stick up out of your trash cans.

• Oil: Please recycle by taking it to a business that takes used oil such as most Autozone and Wal-Mart stores.

• Paint: Please recycle accordingly. (Sherwin-Williams) Any paint or oil that spills as a result of being hidden in your trash can, the clean-up of the spill will be charged to you, the resident. (This is a TCEQ / EPA mandate regarding the clean-up of hazardous materials.)

• Please use a "traditional" type trash container. Several residents have used plastic or card-board boxes in the past and were upset when the crews put the entire box into the truck. Also, if the can you place out is old and torn up and no longer meets Code, please put a note on it saying it is trash as well, as the crews try to not throw away traditional trash cans, no matter how tattered and worn they are.

• Now, back to size: 64 gallons or smaller is the preferred size for trash cans. This is due to the weight of our garbage. A 96 gallon can weighs 42 - 46lb empty, add in the weight of your garbage, and our trash crews definitely get a workout!

• WCA will pick up tree branches that are bundled and tied in 4' lengths, no more than 40lbs each. Limbs may be no more than 4 inches in diameter and less than 40lbs.

• If you have a larger than normal pick-up, like an entire tree, or you are remodeling, please call WCA at 281-368-8397. They will get you a price quote and schedule the pickup. The average is between \$75 - \$100, depending on type of material and amount/weight.
