## WATER LEAKS AND SEWER STOPPAGES

If you experience a water leak or sewer stoppage at your residence, call ECO Resources at 281-240-1300 **BEFORE** calling a plumber, unless you are absolutely positive the leak or stoppage is your responsibility. An operator from ECO will come to your home, diagnose the problem and notify you whether or not you will need a plumber to correct the problem. If the problem is occurring in the City owned main or house line tap on the main, it will be rectified. If you call a plumber first and the problem turns out to be the responsibility of the City, you will not be reimbursed for the cost of the plumber.

#### GARAGE SALE DATES

Garage sales are limited to the last weekend of odd numbered months (January, March, May, etc.) Weekends are defined as Friday and Saturday. Residents may have up to 2 garage sales per year on the designated weekends. A garage sale permit is required. ## ALARM PERMITS

All alarm permits expire December 31<sup>st</sup>. Alarm permits are renewable for \$5.00. Any permit that is not renewed by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2003 will be deemed cancelled.

Cancelled permits shall not be renewable and must be reapplied for at the initial fee of \$15.00. Alarm permits are required by City Ordinance. Failure to comply may result in the issuance of a citation by Meadows Place Police Department.

When renewing your permit by mail, your cancelled check will be your receipt.

## TIPS FROM THE FIRE MARSHAL

Remember, you are deliberately bringing fire into your home; respect it.

- ¥ Use a fireplace screen to prevent sparks from flying.
- ¥ Don t store newspapers, kindling, or matches near the fireplace or have an exposed rug or wooden floor right in front of the fireplace.
- ¥ Have your chimney inspected by a professional prior to the start of every heating season and cleaned to remove combustible creosote build-up if necessary.
- ¥ Install a chimney spark arrester to prevent roof fires.
- ¥ When lighting a gas fireplace, strike your match first, then turn on the gas.

#### A Healthy Home is a Happy Home

If you or a family member is one of the 50+ million people who experience some form of allergic symptoms, you understand the importance of controlling your home's environment. Here are some common substances that tend to trigger allergic reactions and ways to reduce effects:

Your home's air is easy to control, especially when air filters and air conditioning are used. When selecting a filter, ask for test data from the manufacturers to determine the quantity and the size of the dust particles captured. It is important to maintain your filters regularly.

Another vital consideration is the temperature of your home. Some people have low tolerance to big changes in temperature, especially from warm to cold. Close windows and doors and avoid wood stoves, fireplaces and tobacco smoke. Perfume, paint, hair spray and other strong fumes should also be regarded as suspected triggers.

The presence of dust and dust-mites are also contributors. They thrive in warm and humid air and are commonly found in bedrooms. Cut down the exposure to these allergens by washing bed linen, window coverings and throw rugs in water that is at least 130° F. Utilize allergen-impermeable coverings on pillows and mattresses, placing tape over the length of the zipper. Eliminate stuffed animals that cannot be washed and everything under the beds. Dust with a damp mop or cloth and remove bedroom and bathroom carpeting.

Combat indoor mold by keeping your home's humidity at about 35%. When humidity is high, indoor mold can present a problem. Also, make sure your bathrooms, kitchens and basements are well-ventilated and are cleaned often. Repair plumbing leaks.
