Comments from the Mayor

On September 23, Council adopted the budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2003. The budget adoption was the culmination of a process that started with a

series of workshops beginning in June and concluded with a public hearing on September 9.

The focus of this year's budget was to ensure that the compensation package for our City employees, particularly our police officers, was competitive with the surrounding area. All City employees received a 3% pay increase. In addition, some police officer positions received an additional increase. Retirement benefits also increased, again to ensure that our employee benefit package is competitive with the surrounding cities. A special thanks to Mayor Pro-Tem Terry Henley and his connections with the Houston-Galveston Area Council for providing us with data to make these comparisons.On the revenue side, sales tax revenue has been projected to come in at roughly the same pace as last year. However, I am hopeful we will exceed this level. Building permit fees and water and sewer revenue are expected to increase from the addition of Meadows Place Seniors Village to our community. Finally, at the September 23rd meeting, Council adopted a property tax rate of \$0.73 per \$100 of assessed valuation for the next fiscal year. This is the same rate that has been in effect for the last several years.

Throughout the budget process, which included meetings with all City department heads, Council exhibited a sincere, consistent desire to provide quality City services at reasonable prices. We are confident this budget accomplishes that goal.

CITY ORDINANCE / CODE ENFORCEMENT

Trash cans may be placed at the curb no sooner than 18 hours before service pick up time, which means no earlier than1:00 p.m. on Mondays and Thursdays. PAINT APPROVALS

- * It is necessary to obtain a paint approval form signed by a MCIA board member before painting the exterior of your home. Failure to do so may result in your having to redo the entire paint job.
- * Paint approvals are necessary even if you intend to repaint using the same color. This is because the list of approved colors has changed over the years.
- * As a general rule, the range of approved paint colors has been narrowed to eliminate pastels and bold colors in favor of more neutral colors.
- * While the paint approval book is still in the process of being edited, a copy of the book as it stands is available at City Hall.

MAILBOXES

The board has had a number of inquiries about brick mailboxes. These don't require approval, but must be well constructed with a proper foundation to prevent early deterioration or collapse.

Water Leaks and Sewer Stoppages

If you experience a water leak or sewer stoppage at your residence, call ECO Resources at 281-240-1300 BEFORE calling a plumber, unless you are absolutely positive the leak or stoppage is your responsibility. An operator from ECO will come to your home, diagnose the problem and notify you whether or not you will need a plumber to correct the problem. If the problem is occurring in the City owned main or house line tap on the main, it will be rectified. If you call a plumber first and the problem turns out to be the responsibility of the City, you will not be reimbursed for the cost of the plumber.

REPORTING A STREET LIGHT OUTAGE

FROM CENTERPOINT ENERGY

It is important to note as much information as possible when reporting a street light outage. To help the company better identify the location of a street light, provide the address nearest the light and/or report the street light number. Street light numbers can be found on either side of the light pole. If you notice a streetlight that is out or malfunctioning, you can report it by:







Stocking Your First-Aid Kit

While your first-aid kit will mostly be used for minor scrapes, bug bites, etc., a well-stocked first-aid kit should be a necessity in your home and car. The most important items to include in your first-aid kit are many times overlooked. These are the emergency phone numbers and medical information pertaining to each member of your family. This means not only including the 911 emergency number, but phone numbers of your family doctors and an emergency point of contact such as a relative or neighbor. You should also include your local poison control. Furthermore, keep an updated list of medicines and allergies affecting family members.

You may want to purchase an assembled first-aid kit or prepare your own. While each family will want to include particular items for their personal use, the following is a list of basic supplies that every first-aid kit should contain:

- Bandages, gauze and adhesive tape
- Over the counter medicines such as eyewash, calamine lotion, anti-itch cream, anti-bacterial ointment, aspirin and/or non-aspirin pain relievers, cough suppressants, antacids, antihistamines, medication for nausea/motion sickness.
- A bottle of water
- Disposable latex or non-latex gloves
- Mouth to mouth shield, safety pins, rounded-tip scissors, tweezers, thermometer and oral medicine syringe
- Instant activating cold packs
- Activating charcoal, Ipecac syrup only use after calling poison control
- Sunscreen, insect repellant
- First-aid manual, flashlight and batteries

In order to keep your first-aid kit well supplied, do not borrow from it and check expiration dates often. This is in no way a substitute for appropriate medical advice. As always, consult your family doctor when sickness or an accident has occurred. Please keep these items out of children's reach.
