Here is a simple recipe that is guaranteed delicious. Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish with about 1 teaspoon olive oil. Place trout in the prepared baking dish and coat with remaining olive oil. Season the inside and outside of fish with dill, thyme, and salt. Stuff each fish with lemon slices; grind pepper over the top. Bake in the preheated oven (400) for 10 minutes; add water and continue baking until fish flake easily with a fork, about 10 minutes more. Mmmm

That is changing under the guidance of Erickson Advertising Agency who is already doing much of the input and content development of multi-media platforms. Erickson has met with each of our Department Heads and the Mayor to develop a series of Facebook videos to give you an ongoing overview of city goings on. You can expect the first short Facebook Live toward the end of January with one from Public Works, Police, Parks, Finance and each department every few weeks. We are a bit anxious about this new project but feel it could be a good tool to keep residents appraised of Meadows Place progress.

Maintenance in Meadows Place

2018 will see continued upkeep of City materials and machinery. Last year Public Works Director Danny Segundo made much needed major repairs at the Waste Water Treatment Plant as well as scheduled road and sidewalk repairs. This year he is following his five year road repair plan but will also be replacing the roof and the 26 year old air conditioner on top of City Hall to prevent potentially serious damage from weather induced problems. 
Cold Weather Safety Tips

A s temperatures start to drop in January, February, and March. We must all be prepared to deal with the possibility of temperatures dropping below the freezing level. In the greater Houston area, the

weather changes constantly and we can easily find ourselves unprepared to deal with a sudden freeze. Here are a few precautions we should be ready to deal with and prepared for;

- 1. Bring in pets pets should never be left out in the cold for extended periods of time. Pets can get frostbite on their ear tips, noses, tails and paws. Make sure your pets have a warm place to sleep.
- 2. Wrap your outside pipes and faucets pipes should be wrapped to protect against possible water pipes freezing and cracking. Water pipe failures can lead to high water bills, and expensive plumbing repairs. Be sure to take precautions and warp your pipes!
- 3. Wrap your plants be sure to place a cloth or plastic over your plants to protect them from wind chills and icy weather. Most plants will survive if precautions are taken.
- 4. People if you must go out in cold and freezing weather be sure to avoid hazardous conditions. Avoid icy roads and bridges if you must be on the road. Watch for ice on sidewalks (walk carefully), driveways, and streets. Dress appropriately!

Remember to check on the elderly and those who may have functional needs, or access needs, to make sure that they have sufficient warmth to get them through the cold weather. Also, if you, or someone you know, uses space heaters or a fireplace, make sure there is at least 3 feet of empty space around them while they are being operated.

Meadows Place Police Department New Year's Safety Tips

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to start off the New Year with a few safety reminders to help everyone stay safe and keep our community safety and "Your Place for Life"

Residential Safety: Keeping your home and belongings safe starts with you! Always look your doors and windows, Use timers for lights and radio when away. Take advantage of the "House Watch" program offered by the Meadows Place Police Department.

Vehicle safety: Make sure to ALWAYS lock your car. Never leave valuables in your car, especially in plain view. Contact the Police Dept for a T-L-C report card; this is designed to help protect your vehicle whether at home, work, or play.

ATM Safety: When using an ATM Drive-up ATM are preferred. Your vehicle offers protection as opposed to the walk-up machines. Make sure your doors are locked and only the driver's window is down. Maintain awareness of your surroundings. Remember to always trust your instincts, if you sense something is wrong cancel the transaction and leave immediately.


Walking and Jogging Safety: Use sidewalks when and where one is provided and is safe to do so. Always be aware of your surroundings, watching for other pedestrians and vehicles. Walk facing traffic, so that you can see what is coming and are able to act if needed. Do not wear ear buds or headphones over both ears, you are unable to hear what may be approaching. Vary your

route. If you feel as though you are being followed call the Police immediately. Your safety is priority one.

Identity Theft Prevention: Criminals use items such as bank statements, credit card receipts, preapproved credit cards offers, a lost or stolen wallet to gain access to your identity and credit. Many times they will open credit cards, take out loans, create identification cards using the information obtained. Never give out information in an email or over the phone, this is a method used to gain personal information to be used over the internet. With the ease of electronic access, it is important to monitor your credit report, bank account, and credit cards on a regular basis. If you detect suspicious activity, contact the credit bureaus and police department. The Bureaus can offer protective measures in the event your information has been compromised.

Remember: If you see something – say something, always report suspicious activity or persons immediately. You have an active part in the community's safety!

The Meadows Place Police Department is here to help. We offer a monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting with many educational topics. The Department also has many resources available Child Safety Seat Program, T-L-C Program, and Home Safety Inspection are a few that are designed to help maintain the well-being of the community. We are your partner in community safety.

LIFEGUARDS WANTED

The City of Meadows Place is accepting lifeguard applications now through February 28, 2018 for Summer 2018. Applications can be picked up and turned in at City of Meadows Place City Hall. You must be 15 years of age to apply, pass the prerequisite requirements, and available for ALL training dates TBD in April. Prerequisites: Minimum age: 15 years; Swim 300 yards continuously; Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs; Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds by starting in the water, swimming 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, exit the water without using steps or a ladder. Participants who successfully complete the Lifeguarding course receive an American Red Cross certificate for Lifeguarding / First Aid / CPR / AED, valid for 2 years.
