Meadows Elementary Update

On December 18th your Rebuilding Meadows Elementary Team met with the FBISD Design Team, architects, teachers, and past and present principals to look at the final design options for our 'New' Meadows Elementary. It quite an exciting evening for all concerned, especially members of Visioning Team - Alderman Rick Staigle, Ben Weber, Cameron Miller, Parks Director Colene Cabezas, Amaya Labrador and myself. Looking at the final design option assured us we did SaveME. We saw the new Meadows Elementary will be the 21st Century Learning Center they promised during the first vision meeting. The basics are: it's two story, lots of natural lighting, smaller footprint, more parking and a fabulous main entrance which faces Pender. The principals, the teachers and your Vision Team were all impressed. Here are a few comments.

Cameron Miller - The proposed design has a 21st century look while maintaining an inviting feel. The architects listened to the needs of the teachers and the importance of the school to the community and it showed in the design. Echoed by everyone in the meeting was an excitement around the opportunities with this project and of getting it started . (They are due to tear down the "Old" school the first week of June)

Cold Weather Safety Tips

A s temperatures start to drop in January, February, and March. We must all be prepared to deal with the possibility of temperatures dropping

below the freezing level. In the greater Houston area, the weather changes constantly and we can easily find ourselves unprepared to deal with a sudden freeze. Here are a few precautions we should be ready to deal with and prepared for;

- 1. Bring in pets pets should never be left out in the cold for extended periods of time. Pets can get frostbite on their ear tips, noses, tails and paws. Make sure your pets have a warm place to sleep.
- 2. Wrap your outside pipes and faucets pipes should be wrapped to protect against possible water pipes freezing and cracking. Water pipe failures can lead to high water bills, and expensive plumbing repairs. Be sure to take precautions and warp your pipes!
- 3. Wrap your plants be sure to place a cloth or plastic over your plants to protect them from wind chills and icy weather. Most plants will survive if precautions are taken.
- 4. People if you have to go out in cold and freezing weather be sure to avoid hazardous conditions. Stay off of icy roads and bridges if you have to be on the road. Watch for ice on sidewalks (walk carefully), driveways, and streets. Dress appropriately!

Remember to check on the elderly and those who may have functional needs, or access needs, to make sure that they have sufficient warmth to get them through the cold weather. Also, if you, or someone you know, uses space heaters or a fireplace, make sure there is at least 3 feet of empty space around them while they are being operated.

Meadows Place Police Department suggest 10 Cyber Crime Prevention Tips for 2019

1. Use Strong Passwords

Use different user ID / password combinations for different accounts and avoid writing them down. Make the passwords more complicated by combining letters, numbers, special characters (minimum 10 characters in total) and change them on a regular basis.

2. Secure your computer

- · Activate your firewall
- Use anti-virus/malware software
- Block spyware attacks

3. Be Social-Media Savvy

Make sure your social networking profiles (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, MSN, etc.) are set to private. Check your security settings. Be careful what information you post online. Once it is on the Internet, it is there forever!

4. Secure your Mobile Devices

Be aware that your mobile device is vulnerable to viruses and hackers. Download applications from trusted sources.

5. Install the latest operating system updates

Keep your applications and operating system (e.g. Windows, Mac, Linux) current

6. Protect your Data

Use encryption for your most sensitive files such as tax returns or financial records, make regular back-ups of all your important data, and store it in another location.

7. Secure your wireless network

Wi-Fi (wireless) networks at home are vulnerable to intrusion if they are not properly secured. Review and modify default settings. Public Wi-Fi, a.k.a. "Hot Spots", are also vulnerable. Avoid conducting financial or corporate transactions on these networks.

8. Protect your e-identity

Be cautious when giving out personal information such as your name, address, phone number or financial information on the Internet. Make sure that websites are secure (e.g. when making online purchases) or that you've enabled privacy settings (e.g. when accessing/using social networking sites).

9. Avoid being scammed

Always think before you click on a link or file of unknown origin. Don't feel pressured by any emails. Check the source of the message. When in doubt, verify the source. Never reply to emails that ask you to verify your information or confirm your user ID or password.

10. Call the right person for help

Don't panic! If you are a victim, if you encounter illegal Internet content (e.g. child exploitation) or if you suspect a computer crime, identity theft or a commercial scam, report this to your local police. If you need help with maintenance or software installation on your computer, consult with your service provider or a certified computer technician.

Changes in Code Enforcement Fines

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-32 Passed by Council on Nov. 27th 2018

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Meadows Place, Texas, is continuously reviewing the Code of Meadows Place; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that an effective and efficient code promotes the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEADOWS PLACE, TEXAS:


- (3) In all other cases, a fine under any such provision or ordinance shall not exceed
 - i. \$100 for a first violation;
 - ii. \$200 for a second violation; and
 - iii. \$500 for a third or subsequent violation.

LIFEGUARDS, CAMP COUNSELORS, & SWIM INSTRUCTORS WANTED

The City of Meadows Place is accepting applications starting <u>January 1 through March 17</u>, <u>2019</u> for Summer 2019. Applications can be picked up and turned in at City of Meadows Place City Hall. You must be 15 years of age to apply. If applying for the lifeguard position, you must pass the prerequisite requirements, and available for *ALL* training dates TBD in April.

Prerequisites: Minimum age: 15 years; Swim 300 yards continuously; Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs; Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds by starting in the water, swimming 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, exit the water without using steps or a ladder.



Come swim at least one length of the pool (25yds) on the first day of the New Year. This is a great event to create memories. Even if you don't swim, please stop by and have some hot coco with your friends and neighbors. This is purely for fun. Donations accepted, but fundraising is not the focus of this event.

(All participants are required to sign a release of liability, before entering the water. Minors must have an adult present to be able to swim.)
