Meadows Place, like the rest of the world, is leaving 2021 battered and bruised but still very hopeful and optimistic. We already have plans (and funding!) to make 2022 one of the best

years ever for the City of Meadows Place and I for one can't wait to usher the New Year in. It has been an honor to stand beside this staff and Council to serve you. We have a dedicated Council, a dedicated and hardworking staff and a Police Department that puts our interests above their own. It is such a blessing to live in Meadows Place and I look forward to seeing what we can do in 2022. Thank You all and Happy New Year.

ARPA Funds for Meadows Place

Thankfully Meadows Place has a wonderful relationship with the County Commissioners and the County Judge otherwise we could have missed a golden opportunity to obtain over \$500,000.00 in Federal ARPA funds (American Rescue Plan Act) which were being held and distributed through Fort Bend County. I was talking individually with two Commissioners about how the change of redistricting was going to affect Meadows Place, other than the obvious change of Commissioners. Both assured me that Meadows Place would not get hurt in any way and that our ongoing Parks Bond Project would be completed with no loss of funds. Additionally, Grady Prestage, our outgoing Commissioner and our new Commissioner, Andy Meyers, got together after Meadows Place pulled out its Capital Improvement Plan and requested funding for some projects we needed but could not fund at the moment. These items included major repairs and modernization at our Waste Water Treatment Plant that met the very narrow ARPA criteria.

Did You Know... FLOCK Cameras

Meadows Place has now installed eight (8) FLOCK cameras to create an alert system around the city. FLOCK cameras are narrow range license plate reading cameras that are connected to the cloud. They access state and federal hot lists and within seconds send real-time alerts to nearby law enforcement officers when a wanted or stolen vehicle is detected. This high-tech camera system was acquired by a grant but after further discussion with Chief Stewart, City Council approved 3 additional camera locations to help us quickly spot the bad guys and hopefully keep them away. Thanks Chief and Council.



Meadows Place was prepared! Long story short, the County has awarded Meadows Place some \$556,000.00 toward major investments in: Lift Station Pump(s) Replacement (\$175K), replacement of the original Bar Screen (\$100K), a Generator, line and Controls at the Emergency Operations Center (\$50K) and a Water Plant # 3 Generator System (\$320K). This all happened in a matter of days right at the end of 2021 and would not have been possible had our Public Works Director, Rod Hainey not invested so much time and effort in updating and improving our Capital Improvement Plan so kudos to him, and City Administrator Nick Haby and Finance Director Anna-Maria Weston for working with him on it. Rick Staigle and Tia Baker were also a factor. There you go Meadows Place, this was your leadership team in action. Thank You everyone. You produced some big results which will relieve a lot of worries about equipment failure and expensive repairs in

the immediate future. We will keep you posted as we move forward on these critically important improvements.

Police Dispatch Improvements

The City of Meadows Place has been upgrading our Police Dispatch process for several years and our efforts have resulted in some success. We do not have a PSAP (Public Service Answering Point) or 911 capable system but we do have a limited internal dispatch system. Location, lack of land lines, changing technology and getting trained, licensed dispatchers are issues Chief Stewart deals with daily. The Chief recently made a presentation to Council and appealed for an additional coverage. Council was impressed by the solutions offered and approved. A new dispatcher will soon join our staff making sure Meadows Place continues to be *Your Place for Life!*

Blessing Looms Gifting Circles

The COVID-19 pandemic caused economic woes for many people. The temptation to make several thousand dollars with only a small investment can be overwhelming. *The Meadows Place Police Department warns:* No matter how much extra cash could be had, it's a wise idea to ignore social media invitations to join

a "Blessing Loom." This pyramid scheme is causing many people to lose their hard-earned money. BBB has received Numerous scam reports on "Blessing Loom" scams in the past year, and consumers report losing from \$100 to \$700.

How the Scam Works

A direct message arrives though social media — most often Instagram or Facebook, but it has been seen on messaging apps as well — by a friend, family member, or possibly a stranger. They invite you to join a "Blessing Loom" or one of the other names listed above, like "Sou-Sou." The message explains that it's an excellent opportunity to earn money while also "blessing others."

With a small investment of about \$100 paid through PayPal, Venmo, or another digital payment service, you can spread the wealth and see a huge return on the money you put in. All you need to do is recruit a few other people to invest. They will recruit even more people, and, as the circle widens, everyone makes loads of cash.

Sounds great, right? The trouble is that this is a pyramid scheme. It relies on recruiting new individuals to keep the scam afloat. Once people stop participating, the money supply stops

as well. That leaves lots of disappointed people who lose the cash they initially invested. Your personal information may also be compromised.

How to Avoid Social Media Scams

- Stay alert to pyramid schemes. Pyramid schemes promise quick profits for recruiting others. Scammers prey on the desire to make a lot of money with very little effort. But remember, pyramid schemes are illegal in the United States and Canada.
- Be skeptical. Before you accept any offer on social media, do your research. Just because something appears to be fun and was shared by a friend, doesn't mean there isn't an inherent risk. Many of these offers include extravagant promises that aren't kept.
- Monitor Friend Requests. Don't accept friend requests from people you don't know. Also be wary of a second friend request from someone you are already connected with; the second profile may be an imposter trying to access your data and your friends list.
- Ask questions and research the offer before joining any business venture. What appears to be a legitimate investment could still be a pyramid scheme. Check business ratings and reviews on BBB.org and other search engines before agreeing to work with or invest in any company or individual.

WINTER IN TEXAS - When it's 80 degrees outside

Being prepared for our Winter season has been a topic of prior Newsletters. But when the weather outside has a high of 80 degrees forecast it can be difficult to take the information seriously. None the less the weather will change, and temperatures will drop. In Texas if you don't like the weather wait for a short while and it will move into another season, probably not the one you

expected.

By now we should be ready to wrap outside water pipe with insulation, if this has not been done and wrap shut off valves that will freeze. Plants should be protected from the freeze also. Sprinkler systems should be adjusted down to account for the wet rainy season and save water.

FROZEN PIPES INSIDE YOUR HOME WILL CAUSE THE MOST DAMAGE

When we have a Hard Freeze, pipes will freeze. If you think that there are frozen pipes in your home, shut the water off immediately. There are two locations to shut off the water, one at the meter and the second is close to the house where the line enters the building. Please familiarize yourself with both locations. If you need emergency assistance to shut your water service, call the USW 24-hour call line at 832-756-2143. Some leaks are small but consistent and will run up your water bill monthly.

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

- 1. Turn of all the water inside and outside of your home.
- 2. Go outside to your meter box and open the cover.
- 3. Locate the black or red triangular -shaped leak detector on the left side beside the numbers.
- 4. If the leak detector is not moving, you do not have a leak and no water is passing thru the meter.
- 5. If the leak detector is moving, you do have a leak. Water leaks on the homeowner's side of the meter are the responsibility to repair.
- 6. If there is water in the meter box, be sure it is not run-off water from sprinklers or rainfall before calling.
- 7. If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall.

Wishing all a Healthy Happy 2022 New Year. Thank you for ALL for keeping The Meadows Place, *Your* Place for *Life*.

I continue to request consistent help from you all with unkempt pools, tree clearances, picking up after your pets, and ensuring all trash/accumulations anywhere on your property are removed.

One common violation, that most people do not realize is a violation is placing bandit signs that are taped to city signs. The tape damages the expensive reflective surface of the signs. Illegal Bandit signs include lost pet signs, contractor signs, realtor signs and any affixed as the ordinance below states.

Bandit Sign – Prohibited Sign 153.196(D):

Signs or posters of miscellaneous character, not otherwise regulated, which are tacked, painted, pasted, or otherwise affixed and visible from any public right-of-way or pedestrian passageway or plaza, located on the walls of buildings or sheds, on trees, poles, posts, fences, or other structures;

Resolution:

IMMEDIATLEY Code Enforcement removes sign(s) from public right-of-way compliance with Code. Refrain from placing any signs in "city" public right-of-way.

During this period there were a total of 88 violations, 136 Notices issued, and 182 Inspections completed.
