Happy New Year

2023 promises to be a year of great challenges and, hopefully, great successes. However, 2022 kept us jumping as we had to deal with the mundane as well as emergency projects with police, parks and public works projects already on the table. 2022 was one of the busiest years for big projects the city has ever experienced but we still completed lots of everyday

type items. A few of these include executing an agreement for Professional Engineering Services and completing the, Meadows Place Investment Policy and Strategy Guidelines. Council worked on items regarding Estate Sale duration, the city's sign ordinance and much, much more. We made great progress on the Bike/Pedestrian Trail Design which will give us a new EOC parking lot and a bridge across Meadows Place Bayou.

We are also working on Infrastructure Projects funded by the American Rescue Plan Act in the amount of \$645,500. We began the Dorrance Lane reconstruction project, which we hope to see completed by the end of February and are in the middle of an emergency water well repair with plans to inspect and examine the one remaining well which has not been examined. Your Council works with Staff and City Administrator, Nick Haby to keep the city moving forward and adjusting ordinances that have become obsolete or outdated. It can be difficult but they do a good job. All of this means 2023 will have Meadows Place stay...*Your* Place for *Life!*

TLC Program

A big Thank You to Chief Stewart and Cameron Miller for producing a video on the Meadows Place TLC Program. This is a Meadows Place program designed to help the PD help us protect our property and our cars. If you are unfamiliar with TLC (Take, Lock, Close), check out the TLC video on the Meadows Place Police Facebook Page or the City Instagram page. WINTER IN TEXAS When it's 80 degrees outside

Being prepared for our Winter season has been a topic of prior Newsletters. But when the weather outside has a high of 80 degrees forecast it can be difficult to

take the information seriously. None the less the weather will change, and temperatures will drop. In Texas if you don't like the weather wait for a short while and it will move into another season, probably not the one you expected.

By now we should be ready to wrap outside water pipe with insulation, if this has not been done **and wrap shut off valves** that will freeze. Plants should be protected from the freeze also. Sprinkler systems should be adjusted down to account for the wet rainy season and save water.

FROZEN PIPES INSIDE YOUR HOME WILL CAUSE THE MOST DAMAGE

When we have a Hard Freeze, pipes will freeze. If you think that there are frozen pipes in your home, shut the water off immediately. There are two locations to shut off the water, one at the meter and the second is close to the house where the line enters the building. Please familiarize yourself with both locations. If you need emergency assistance to shut your water service, call the USW 24-hour call line at 832-7562143. Some leaks are small but consistent and will run up your water bill monthly.

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

- 1. Turn of all the water inside and outside of your home.
- 2. Go outside to your meter box and open the cover.
- 3. Locate the black or red triangular -shaped leak detector on the left side beside the numbers.
- 4. If the leak detector is not moving, you do not have a leak and no water is passing thru the meter.
- 5. If the leak detector is moving, you do have a leak. Water leaks on the homeowner's side of the meter are the responsibility to repair.
- 6. If there is water in the meter box, be sure it is not run-off water from sprinklers or rainfall before calling.
- 7. If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall.

Workplace Crime Prevention

Twhen you go to work, don't leave your crime prevention sense at home. Almost any crime that can happen at home or in your neighborhood can happen in the workplace. You can minimize your chances of becoming a victim of crime if you know what situations to avoid and what preventive actions to take.

- Never leave valuables unattended and unsecured.
- Keep your purse, wallet, keys, and other valuable items with you at all times, or lock them in a drawer or closet.
- Always lock your office and any unoccupied room, even when leaving for only a moment.
- Check the identity of any strangers who are in your office. Offer your assistance and ask them who they are visiting and if you can help them find that person. If they make you uncomfortable, inform your supervisor or Security Office (this may include the local police) of your suspicions.
- · Always let someone know where you'll be, whether you're

coming in late, working late, going to the mailroom, going out to lunch, or going to a meeting.

- If you bring personal items to work such as a coffee cup, a radio, or a calculator, mark them with your name or initials.
- If you find weapons, drugs, or other illegal items, do not handle them. Contact your supervisor and the Police; let them know what and where you found suspicious item.
- Be discreet. Don't advertise your social life and vacation plans or those of your coworkers to people visiting or calling.
- Be cautious in restrooms. Attackers can hide in stalls and corners.
- If you're working late, create a buddy system for walking to the parking lot.

Important: A STOP-WORK ORDER is issued when work is being done without a required permit.

Ordinances:

150.01-R104.2 - Applications and Permits Needed

When you are deciding to have work done on your home, find out if a permit is required. Advise your contractor to apply, obtain and post the permit on the front door or front window *PRIOR* to any work beginning. When a contractor cannot produce a permit to post, chances are they have not obtained one.

If work begins without a required permit, then a STOP-WORK ORDER will be issued, a double fee will be assessed to the permit, and work will not be allowed to continue until the required permit is obtained and posted. Continuing to work without a required permit, at any phase, will result in a citation being issued. As the homeowner it is your responsibility to ensure that your contractor pulls any required permit. Scan the QR Code at the bottom of your yellow notice or at the bottom of this article and click on **Permits** to see permit applications and other valuable information.

Your help is needed:

Please make sure that your contractor applies, obtains and posts required permit(s) on your front door or window before work begins. Call 281-983-2932 to find out with our Permit Clerk when an inspection will need to be done and when it should be called in. The inspection is done for your benefit, safety, and peace of mind to ensure that the work done by the contractor is up to code standards.

Make a difference and help to keep Meadows Place *Your* **Place for** *Life*.

NOTICE TO CUSTOMER REGARDING EXTREME WEATHER EMERGENCY

The Public Utility Commission's rule in Title 16, Chapter 24 Texas Admin. Code § 24.173(d) prohibits the City of Meadows Place (the "City") from imposing a late fee or from disconnecting your retail water or sewer service for nonpayment of bills that are due during an extreme weather emergency until after the emergency is over.

An extreme weather emergency is defined as a period beginning when the previous day's highest temperature in your area did not exceed 28 degrees Fahrenheit, and the temperature is predicted to remain at or below that level for the next 24 hours according to the nearest National Weather Service reports for your area. For the purposes of these requirements, an extreme weather emergency is over on the second business day the temperature exceed 28 degrees Fahrenheit.

The City is required to offer a payment schedule to an affected customer that timely requests a payment schedule. If you are affected by an extreme weather emergency, you may request a payment schedule for unpaid bills that are due during the extreme weather emergency.

For affected customers that timely request a payment schedule, the City is prohibited from disconnecting service for nonpayment of bills that are due during an extreme weather emergency. However, once a payment schedule is offered, **disconnections may resume if you** (1) decline to timely accept the payment schedule, **or** (2) violate the terms of the payment schedule.

If you have a bill from the City due during an extreme weather emergency, then you qualify to request a payment schedule. Please contact the City's office at: utilities@cityofmeadowsplace.org or by phone at 281-983-2950.

AVISO AL CLIENTE SOBRE EMERGENCIA POR CONDICIONES DEL TIEMPO EXTREMAS

La regla de la Comisión de Servicios Públicos en el Título 16, Capítulo 24, del Código Administrativo de Texas § 24.173(d) prohíbe a ciudad de Meadows Place (el "ciudad") imponer un cargo por mora o desconectar su servicio minorista de agua o alcantarillado por falta de pago de las facturas adeudadas durante una emergencia por condiciones del tiempo extremas hasta después de que la emergencia haya terminado.

Una emergencia por condiciones del tiempo extremas se define como un periodo que comienza cuando la temperatura más alta del día previo en su área no superó los 28 grados Fahrenheit y se prevé que la temperatura permanecerá en ese nivel o debajo de él durante las siguientes 24 horas según los informes más cercanos del Servicio Meteorológico Nacional para su área. A efectos de estos requisitos, una emergencia por condiciones del tiempo extremas finaliza el segundo día laborable en que la temperatura supera los 28 grados Fahrenheit.

El ciudad debe ofrecer un programa de pago a un cliente afectado que lo solicite oportunamente. Si se ve afectado por una emergencia por condiciones del tiempo extremas, puede solicitar un programa de pago para las facturas impagas adeudadas durante la emergencia por condiciones del tiempo extremas.

Para los clientes afectados que soliciten oportunamente un programa de pago, el ciudad tiene prohibido desconectar el servicio por falta de pago de las facturas adeudadas durante una emergencia por condiciones del tiempo extremas. Sin embargo, una vez que se ofrece un programa de pago, **las desconexiones pueden reanudarse si usted** (1) se niega a aceptar oportunamente el programa de pago, **o** (2) viola los términos del programa de pago.

Si tiene una factura de ciudad adeudada durante una emergencia por condiciones del tiempo extremas, entonces tiene derecho a solicitar un programa de pago. Póngase en contacto con nuestra oficina en utilities@cityofmeadowsplace.org o teléfono a 281-983-2950.
