Meadows Place Mayor Selected as Chairman of Mayor Council Association

some new responsibilities, which I will work hard to live up to. The FBMCA is quite unique in that it gives cities across the county an opportunity to meet once a month to discuss common issues and concerns. Construction Comments

Road Construction projects, especially big ones like this are a mess. This one is no exception. So far all seems to be going smoothly but we did have some residents call about noise, the hours the contractor can work, etc. Meadows Place construction noises are specifically addressed in Section 153.070 of our Code of Ordinances and they are being followed. Fortunately the heavy hammering that is going on will be short lived as the machine breaking up the road will be on the move and gone relatively soon. Remember, there are penalties if the contractor is not done in a year so they have incentives to keep on track. In the end it will be beautiful and the constant start and stop noises that take place along Kirkwood now will be gone forever. It will be much more peaceful for those living in the area. Kirkwood Construction

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone of the New Construction along S. Kirkwood Road.

- Please Be cautious of the School Crossing Kirkwood and Dorrance
- With the removal of all Stop Signs North and South Bound on "Kirkwood", traffic travelling north and south does not stop.
- Expect the unexpected in road construction zones. Speed Limits may be reduced in the construction zone and traffic lanes may be changed. Be courteous of those working on or near the road.
- Slow down, be alert and pay attention to the signs. Diamond-shaped orange warning signs are posted in advance of road construction projects.
- **Be patient in road construction zones.** Construction zones aren't there to personally inconvenience you. They're necessary to improve the roads for everyone.
- Lane Changes and Closures. Flashing arrow panels or "lane closed ahead" signs mean you need to merge as soon as safely possible. Don't zoom right up to the lane closure and then try to barge in. If everyone cooperates, traffic moves more efficiently.
- Slow down don't drive too fast for conditions. Keep a safe distance between your vehicle and traffic barriers, construction equipment and construction workers. Just like you, highway workers want to return home safely after each day's work.
- Drive defensively don't follow too close. The most common crash in a highway work zone is the rear-end collision. Remember to leave seven seconds of braking distance between you and the vehicle in front of you. Most rear-end accidents occur because of following too close and traveling too fast for conditions.
- Obey the posted signs until you see the ones that say you've left the work zone. Just because you don't see the workers immediately after you see the warning sign doesn't mean they're not out there.
- Expect delays; plan for them and leave early to reach your destination on time



Code Enforcement - February 2019

As we go on with our winter weather, we'll have some days that are cool, but with clear and sunny skies. This is a perfect opportunity for us to start cleaning the exterior of our homes from mildew and/or dirt accumulations, trim trees and shrubs to meet code, replace/repair fence boards or roofing and other improvements we can do to our properties to help elevate the overall look of our City for visitors, potential residents and your neighbors!

Keep in mind:

- You need to submit a permit application with the City BEFORE you start replacing your roof.
- You may also need a permit **BEFORE** replacing/ repairing your fence, depending on the scope of work.
- Failure to submit proper permits before working may result in citation and/or charges filed against you in Municipal Court. When in doubt or unsure if you need a permit or not, please call Permits Department at (281) 983-2932 for assistance.
- Accepted Heavy Trash & Bulk Waste fencing (nails removed, tired and bundled under 4' in length).
- Accepted Yard Waste should be bagged or placed in cans not exceeding 50 pounds. Branches may be placed curbside in clear, individual piles measuring no more than 3'x3'x3', or tied and bundled no longer than 4' in length.
- Please remember that there are some easy and simple things we all can do to help keep our City attractive not just for our visitors, but most especially for ourselves:


- 1. Please remember to keep trees cut and trimmed. §130.07(B) It is unlawful for anyone to maintain trees, shrubs or other vegetative material upon a public street and/or public right-of-way less than the minimum clearance measured from the pavement to the lowest limb, branch or part thereof extending over the sidewalk and over the public street/pavement (Sidewalk: not less than 10 feet and Public Street: not less than 16 feet).
- 1. At all times, please keep our trash cans and recycle bins stored out of public view from the public street and/or public right-of-way (sidewalk) except during scheduled trash/recycle pickup. §130.09(D) Except when placed at curbside for pickup, garbage cans or receptacles shall at all times be stored behind a fence, enclosure or shall otherwise be screened from view.
- 1. Put our trash out only on trash days or **not more than 18 hours before** a scheduled trash pickup. This includes lawn clippings, so be sure to tell your Lawn Contractor! §130.09(A).




Winter Vegetables
