Did You Know... Meadows Place used some of our allotted Covid prevention funds to redo the Council chambers. Taking Steps to eliminate problem properties

Meadows Place is one of the most proactive cities I know when it comes to brining life back into houses that are not being lived in, are substandard or abandoned. We have 'encouraged' owners to clean up, fix up or even sell the few problem properties. This has been an ongoing and very successful program and is getting better. We use Code Enforcement, Law Enforcement and the Courts to help these owners bring these problem properties to a more neighborly position. I wouldn't live next door to a person whose backyard looks like a junkyard, has an old scummy pool, pond or hot tub and weeds high enough to hide a horse, and neither should you. It takes time, but when we are made aware of a problem property, we move on it. We may need your help so please express your concerns to Jennifer, our Code Enforcement Official. She

talks about this in the Newsletter this month and gives you several options on how to contact her. With the exception of a handful of homeowners, we all want the best for Meadows Place. Jennifer can help. Call her and help make sure Meadows Place stays... *Your Place for Life*.

IRS Scams

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to remind everyone it is Tax Season again and the Scammers are out there. Here are some tips from the IRS. If you suspect you may have been a victim, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department or IRS (800-366-4484) to report suspicious activity.

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard against scam phone calls from thieves intent on stealing their money or their identity. Criminals pose as the IRS to trick victims out of their money or personal information.

Here are several tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

- Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls," or via phishing email.
- Callers try to scare their victims. Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they do not get the money.

- Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.
- Cons try new tricks all the time. Some schemes provide an actual IRS address where they tell the victim to mail a receipt for the payment they make. Others use emails that contain a fake IRS document with a phone number or an email address for a reply. These scams often use official IRS letterhead in emails or regular mail that they send to their victims. They try these ploys to make the ruse look official.

The IRS will not:

- Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying. If you don't owe taxes or have no reason to think that you do: Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately.

Once you have completed the form click Send.

We can all be good neighbors and help keep our City attractive by:

- Ensuring all Exterior Walls/Trims are clean.
- Refraining from placing Trash next to curb area on days that are not trash days. (only Tuesdays & Fridays are TRASH days)
- Storing Trashcans / Rubbish / Recycling Bins behind a fence, or enclosure out of public view.

A message from the Meadows Place Home Rule Charter Commission:

Thank you, Mayor Jessup and City Council, for the opportunity to serve the citizens of Meadows Place as the Home Rule Charter Commission. We plan to use this spot in the newsletter to give the citizens a glimpse into the workings of the commission, provide answers to frequently asked questions, and to prepare the city for the review and vote that may allow our city to take its place amongst our neighboring cities in adopting Home Rule status.

You may wonder, "what is Home Rule, and what is the commission doing?" Simply put, Home Rule transfers authority over municipal matters from State laws to a local charter, which is drafted by a 15-person charter committee, and then adopted by Meadows Place voters. This is a complex process, as the charter must be well thought out and designed with our unique city in mind. We are working this methodically and diligently, holding public meetings almost weekly to create a detailed and flexible charter that will serve as the basis for our system of government in Meadows Place for years to come.

"Water is Life"

Texas Water Utilities Association has used the above slogan for a few years. Water is also a commodity and a very valuable resource that we rely on and pay for each month.

"Eye on Water" is an excellent software program for monitoring your water consumption and it's free to the residents of Meadows Place.

How much water does the average person use daily/ monthly? This number can vary based on several factors. Supply, quality of water, cost per gallon, and location.

The national average is close to 100 gallons per day per person or 3000 gallons per month per person. But there are communities that have been known to cut that average in half.

Water usage and water conservation facts

- 1. According to the EPA, the average household leaks waste 10,000 gallons of water each year.
- 2. Turning off the water when brushing your teeth saves 80% of the amount of water you would normally use.
- 3. Replacing old toilets can save 16,000 gallons of water per year (for a family of 4).
- 4. Washers built before 2011 use approximately 40 gallons per load. New machines could use as little as 15 gallons per load.
- 5. Prefer to utilize the dishwasher rather than hand wash the dishes which uses more water while the tap is left running.

Water is precious, use it but don't waste it. A small leak 1/32" in diameter wastes up to 175 Gallons in 24 hours. A leak four times that size at 1/8" diameter can waste up to 3600 gallons in 24 hours.

P.O. Box 1985 Stafford, TX 77477 If you feel that your water bill is higher than normal, please check your home for leaks by observing your water meter manually as described below or by logging on the "Eye on Water".

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

- 1. Turn of all the water inside and outside of your home.
- 2. Go outside to your meter box and open the cover.
- 3. Locate the black or red triangular -shaped leak detector on the left side beside the numbers.
- 4. If the leak detector is not moving, you do not have a leak and no water is passing thru the meter.
- 5. If the leak detector is moving, you do have a leak. Water leaks on the homeowner's side of the meter are the responsibility to repair.
- 6. If there is water in the meter box, be sure it is not run-off water from sprinklers or rainfall before calling.
- 7. If you are certain it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall.


