## **Mobility Bond Project**

In case you are not aware, Meadows Place and Stafford were awarded a portion of the Fort Bend County Mobility Bond. Among other things, this means the County picks up some 80% of the cost. Our EDC is picking up part of it as well. What is this project you might ask. Well, the major components include improving, extending and adding to our

trail system, adding a parking lot by our Emergency Operations System, putting in sidewalks over the bayou on Montecito, installing a bridge across the Meadows Place Bayou and putting up a crossing light on West Airport. This is going to have a wonderful impact on Meadows Place. We will keep you posted as we go.

#### **Dorrance Construction Project**

Meadows Place City Council approved funding of a small portion of the reconstruction of Dorrance Ln. and accompanying infrastructure like water, storm sewer and sidewalks. This is multiple year, Pay as You Go type project so we are beginning with a very small section between Kirkwood and Oxford Glen. The project is still months off but you need to be aware of this project before we get started. HDR Engineering will oversee the engineering and inspection. The construction will of course be bid out, which could happen in a month or two which means we do not know the start dates. The City is planning a series of informational programs in the near future for you to be watching for. This will include a Public Meeting with all the stakeholders, instructional videos on the website and Facebook, details in the Newsletter and information on the marquee by the pool. Call or e-mail me if you have any questions or better yet, click the Ask A Question button on the website and submit it there. We will get back to you quickly. In the meantime, keep your eyes open for new information on the Dorrance project.

# **IRS Scams**

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to remind everyone it is Tax Season again and the Scammers are out there. Here are some tips from the IRS. If you suspect you may have been a victim, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department or IRS (phishing@irs.gov) to report suspicious activity.

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard against scam phone calls from thieves intent on stealing their money or their identity. Criminals pose as the IRS to trick victims out of their money or personal information.

# Here are several tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

- Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls," or via phishing email.
- Callers try to scare their victims. Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they do not get the money.
- Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear

legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.

• Cons try new tricks all the time. Some schemes provide an actual IRS address where they tell the victim to mail a receipt for the payment they make. Others use emails that contain a fake IRS document with a phone number or an email address for a reply. These scams often use official IRS letterhead in emails or regular mail that they send to their victims. They try these ploys to make the ruse look official.

#### The IRS will not:

- Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying. If you don't owe taxes or have no reason to think that you do: Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately.

# Water is Life

Texas Water Utilities Association has used the above slogan for a few years. Water is also a commodity and a very valuable resource that we rely on and pay for each month. "Eye on Water" is an excellent software program for monitoring your water consumption and it's free to the residents of Meadows Place.

How much water does the average person use daily/ monthly? This number can vary based on several factors. Supply, quality of water, cost per gallon, and location.

The national average is close to 100 gallons per day per person or 3000 gallons per month per person. But there are communities that have been known to cut that average in half.

#### **Meadows Place water consumption**

The City of Meadows Place utilizes three Gateways to gather the information about water consumption within the city. The Gateway is a radio receiver that communicates with each water meter within the city limits.

Current status of system

99.3 % of meters with an OK status, which amounts to 1582 separate meters that are functioning properly.

- Average daily consumption for the city is between 200,000 and 300,000 gallons per day
- Total amount of water consumed so far this month 4,933,298 gallons.
- There are currently 123 meters that are leaking. 103 small leaks (less than 10 gallons per hour), 17 medium leaks (10-30 gallons per hour) and three large leaks (30-60 gallons per hour).

80% of the residents with a water leak do not have "Eye on Water". 20% of the residents with leaks have the "Eye on Water" software program.

There are only 261 User accounts. That is 261 out of a possible 1582 meters.

The average leak duration: 15 weeks.

There have been 21 new signups for "Eye on Water" within the last six months.

If you feel that your water bill is higher than normal, please check your home for leaks by observing your water meter manually as described below or by logging on the "Eye on Water".

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

- 1. Turn of all the water inside and outside of your home.
- 2. Go outside to your meter box and open the cover.
- 3. Locate the black or red triangular -shaped leak detector on the left side beside the numbers.
- 4. If the leak detector is not moving, you do not have a leak and no water is passing thru the meter.
- 5. If the leak detector is moving, you do have a leak. Water leaks on the homeowner's side of the meter are the responsibility to repair.
- 6. If there is water in the meter box, be sure it is not run-off water from sprinklers or rainfall before calling.
- 7. If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall.

# February 14th & 21st 2022





Happy Valentines Day and President's Day! Thank you ALL for keeping The Meadows Place, *Your* Place for *Life*.

I am requesting that everyone make sure your Premises Identification, Address Number, is plainly legible on your home, both sides of your mailbox, or on the curb in front of your home. This coming month of March is the perfect time to install missing or update fading address numbers. Keep in mind in an emergency, when seconds count, plainly legible and visible address numbers help the Fire, EMS, & Police Departments find your home more quickly. See the Ordinance below that states the specifications for your address numbers.

# Unreadable/Unapproved/No Premises Identification IPMC[F]304.3:

Buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches (102 mm) in height with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch (12.7 mm).

#### Resolution - Comply by 10 days:

Install / Display address numbers to the front/street side of the home, both sides of mailbox, both sides of the mailbox post, or by painting on the curb.

#### March is Mailbox Month!

Submit between March 1 & March 31, 2022, your before and after photos of your remodeled mailbox to code-enforcement@cityofmeadowsplace.org to qualify and receive your \$10 discount on your March water bill.







Hello Neighbors,

My name is David Mertins. I serve as Alderman I with the city of Meadows Place. Last month Mayor Jessup added a paragraph to the newsletter, "Did You Know ... FLOCK Cameras" As someone who had not heard about nor was aware of FLOCK before joining the City Council, I wanted to learn more about this new technology and share why the Council made the decision to expand our FLOCK Camera coverage to additional locations around Meadows Place.

The city currently has 8 Flock Cameras (LPR's- License Plate Readers) paid for by grants our city received. In December, the City Council authorized MPPD to add 3 more cameras to strategic locations around the city. Our decision was based on a recommendation from the Chief and the results and benefits that have been shown since installing these cameras last year.

To get information on this topic and to answer some questions about FLOCK, I did some research about the Flock Safety company and then talked to Police Chief Stewart. Here is what I discovered and what I wanted to share with MP residents.

# Some basic facts

FLOCK Cameras, better known as License Plate Readers (LPRs), are not traditional cameras. They just take pictures of license plates and vehicles. This is not Big Brother Surveillance - no one is watching/monitoring you or spying on you!

#### What FLOCK Cameras DO

FLOCK LPR cameras and FLOCK's machine learning technology are engineered to capture vehicle characteristics, types, and license plates, which are then checked against state and federal records to ensure accuracy and minimize errors.

The LPR camera's infrared capability captures highly accurate, clear images day or night. They are motion activated by a vehicle and take still-images of cars passing through the lens (not video).

### What FLOCK Cameras DON'T Do

FLOCK LPRs do not capture images of pedestrians or a passerby. (Although the LPRs are motion sensing they are not triggered by an individual passerby or pedestrians.)

They do not follow or track vehicles once they leave the camera's view.

Because license plate readers do not collect information on who is driving or riding in the vehicle, it is not considered Personally Identifiable Information (PII).

**Data Safety:** Only accessible by Law Enforcement, Flock Safety data will never be shared without permission, sold to third parties, or used for unpaid fines, unauthorized viewing outside of a legitimate crime-related event or kept in a library. The footage is fully encrypted and stored in the cloud.



  - Extends/Multiplies Functions of MPPD (Allows Officers the ability to be more productive by providing better tools and

#### FLOCK HIT ARRESTS - The results have been outstanding!!!

Meadows Police Department has had 100's of Hits/Alerts, allowing them to make numerous arrests. At a recent City Council meeting Assistant Chief Ashton shared, "Since adding FLOCK, some months we now have more stolen vehicle arrests in that month than we had in the entire previous year." Stopping stolen vehicles from FLOCK hits often leads to other arrests, including outstanding arrest warrants, parole violations, stolen firearms, and illegal drug possession.

Having this technology has allowed our outstanding Police Department to get even better and is making Meadows Place safer by arresting criminals traveling into or through Meadows Place.


