Plants and The Freeze

Most of our homes and businesses suffered plant damage from 'The Freeze' when an Arctic blast dropped temperatures below freezing and hovered over us for several days. The city suffered wide spread damage too, and it is going to take a while to recover. It will take homeowners a while as well. That is why we are giving a grace period and relaxing enforcement of

our dead plants and trees ordinances. Code Enforcement will not be addressing this issue until at least the end of March or maybe mid-April. We will keep you posted and until then remember, if you can scratch its plant surface and see green tissue, the plant is still alive.

Countywide Radio Coordination

Assistant Chief Ashton briefed your City Council on a grant that will allow us to get new radios for our Police Department. This is a very important update which will allow Meadows Place to instantly communicate with other departments and the Fort Bend Office of Emergency Management. We are well along in the process and hope to have a portion of our radios installed and set up as soon as next month. To make sure they are functioning as they should, Meadows Place will participate in a predetermined 'Monthly Radio Check' coordinated by Frank Garza of the Fort Bend County Homeland Security and Emergency Management.

Did You Know... Fire Marshal

January was a busy month for the Fire Marshal in Meadows Place. In addition to normal permit inspections, there were investigations in both the commercial and residential arena. The Fire Marshal plays a very important role in Meadows Place. The Fire Marshal is responsible for fire investigations, fire inspections, and fire education. The Fire Marshal's Office is also responsible for fire prevention and enforcing local fire codes within the city. Angie, our Permits Clerk and Jennifer, our Code Enforcement Official, work with the Fire Marshal on a regular basis. However, last month, Jennifer had to summon the Fire Marshal after discovering a potentially hazardous situation in a garage in Meadows Place. Jennifer is constantly searching for things that are in violation but this was potentially dangerous. Please contact her, or City Hall, if you see a potentially unsafe situation. Thank You.

On the Move in Meadows Place

Catalytic Converter Theft

We need your help. Though faring far better than some of our neighbors, Meadows Place residents have been victimized by crooks and slimeballs stealing the catalytic convertors. Our PD has done a very good job in responding to this issue and to help them, Meadows Place passed an ordinance making it illegal to possess a catalytic converter without meeting some pretty strict criteria. Like Meadows Place, several Fort Bend County cities have now passed ordinances to give our police a little help in dealing with thieves they catch, but we feel this needs to be deterred Statewide. The Fort Bend Mayor and Council Association made a unanimous appeal to all Fort Bend State Representatives and told them to create a law making it illegal to deal in these products "By creating a statewide problem for those who are trying to sell these stolen converters, you can all but eliminate the problem, helping people not only in Fort Bend County, but all across the State of Texas." This is where you come in. Please send me an email requesting our representatives halt the sale of stolen converters and I will forward it to all the Fort Bend Representatives. IRS Scams

The Meadows Place Police Department would like to remind everyone it is Tax Season again and the Scammers are out there. Here are some tips from the IRS. If you suspect you may have been a victim, please contact the Meadows Place Police Department or IRS (phishing@irs.gov) to report suspicious activity.

The IRS continues to warn consumers to guard against scam phone calls from thieves intent on stealing their money or their identity. Criminals pose as the IRS to trick victims out of their money or personal information.

Here are several tips to help you avoid being a victim of these scams:

- Scammers make unsolicited calls. Thieves call taxpayers
 claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay
 a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually
 through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also
 leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls,"
 or via phishing email.
- Callers try to scare their victims. Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they do not get the money.
- Scams use caller ID spoofing. Scammers often alter caller ID to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear

legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.

Cons try new tricks all the time. Some schemes provide an
actual IRS address where they tell the victim to mail a receipt
for the payment they make. Others use emails that contain a
fake IRS document with a phone number or an email address
for a reply. These scams often use official IRS letterhead in
emails or regular mail that they send to their victims. They try
these ploys to make the ruse look official.

The IRS will not:

- Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying. If you don't owe taxes or have no reason to think that you do: Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately.

"Water is Life" and Do you have a latent leak.

Texas Water Utilities Association has used the above slogan for a few years. Water is also a commodity and a very valuable resource that we rely on and pay for each month. "Eye on Water" is

an excellent software program for monitoring your water consumption and it's **free** to the residents of Meadows Place.

Do you have a latent leak? The entire State has just gone through a major freeze sometimes damaged pipes can have a leak that will go unnoticed for a period.

How can you tell if you have a leak?

- 1. Monitor EyeOnWater for a change in consumption.
- 2. Use your meter as a leak detection tool.

How much water does the average person use daily/monthly? This number can vary based on several factors. Supply, quality of water, cost per gallon, and location. The national average is close to 100 gallons per day per person or 3000 gallons per month per person. But there are communities that have been known to cut that average in half.

Meadows Place water consumption

The City of Meadows Place utilizes three Gateways to gather the information about water consumption within the city. The Gateway is a radio receiver that communicates with each water meter within the city limits.

Current status of system

- 99.4 % of meters with an OK status, which amounts to 1583 separate meters that are functioning properly.
- Average daily consumption for the city is between 200,000 and 300,000 gallons per day
- Total amount of water consumed in a week average 1.659 gallons per week
- There are currently 109 meters that are leaking.

80% of the residents with a water leak do not have "Eye on Water". 20% of the residents with leaks have the "Eye on Water" software program.

There are only 320 User accounts. That is up from last year 261 number.

The average leak duration: 15 weeks.

To make things easy to sign up for "Eye on Water" use the QR CODE which will take you directly to where you can sign up for EyeOnWater.

If you feel that your water bill is higher than normal, please check your home for leaks by observing your water meter manually

leaks by observing your water meter manually as described below or by logging on the "Eye on Water".

How to determine if you have a leak in your home. Do you suspect a leak? If so, do the following.

USING YOUR METER AS A LEAK DETECTION TOOL

Undetected water leaks can account for 5-15% of total water us for single-family homes and even more for businesses. An undetected leak can waste nearly 500 gallons per month. Finding that leak can be a challenge but well worth stopping the drain on your wallet.

- 1. Turn off all faucets inside and outside your house.
- 2. Locate your water meter and check the leak indicator to see if it is moving. The leak indicator could be a small triangular [1] shaped dial that rotates when water is flowing through the meter. If the dial is moving, chances are, you have a leak.
- 3. You can also take a meter reading and wait one hour and take another meter reading (make sure NO water is used during this time). If the reading has changed, you have a leak. If you detect a leak, the next step is to determine if the leak is inside or outside your house.
- 4. Locate your home's main shut-off valve and shut off the water at the valve.
- 5. Again, check the leak indicator for movement OR use the meter reading method, making sure not to use any water during this period. If the leak indicator stops moving, then you have a leak inside the house. If the leak indicator continues to move or there is a change in the meter readings, then the leak is outside between the meter and the house.

If you are certain, it is a leak outside of your home, please call city hall, for assistance turning off the water supply to the house at the curb stop in the meter box.





Happy New Year Wishes For All!

Important and your help is needed: Clean up after your pets when they poop on another's property, no more than 4 cats/dogs is allowed at any premises, and keep your dog(s) on a leash when not in the confines of your home or fenced in back yard.

Ordinances:

90.03 Animal Defecation on Property of Another 90.06(A) Number of Cats and Dogs Limited 90.04(A) Running at Large Be aware that violating 90.03 and/or 90.04(A)will result in an automatic Citation being issued.

Animal Defecation On Property Of Another 90.03:

(A) It shall be unlawful for the owner or person in control of an animal to allow such animal to defecate on any public property, including any right-of-way, or private property, other than that of the owner of the animal. If the animal was at large at the time it defecated on any property, then that shall constitute prima facie evidence that the owner or person in control of the animal allowed the animal to so act. (B) It shall be a defense to prosecution under this section that the owner or person in control of the animal immediately removed and cleaned up such animal's feces from the public or private property. (Ord. 2016-28, passed 10-25-2016)

Number of Cats and Dogs Limited 90.06(A):

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, possess, maintain or allow to be kept, harbored, possessed or maintained more than four dogs or four cats or a combination of such animals with the total number not exceeding four, over four months old, upon or within any premises owned, occupied or under the control of the person within the city.

Running at Large 90.04(A):

It shall be unlawful for the owner to permit any dog to be at large upon the streets, alleys or public grounds of the city, or upon the premises of any person not the owner of the dog, unless the dog is under the control of the owner or keeper or his or her agent by means of a leash, chain, rope or cord not more than ten feet in length and of sufficient strength to control the conduct of the dog.

Make a difference and help to keep Meadows Place *Your* Place for *Life*.
